## 4. Revenue Update - Michelle Ellis, Director of Cash Management and Forecasting

| DISCUSSION SUMMARY | Mrs. Ellis then presented on Revenues. NCDOT has achieved $\$ 4,648 \mathrm{~m}$ in revenue YTD, $1.4 \%$ or $\$ 64$ million above forecast. <br> Motor Fuels Tax was $\$ 26 \mathrm{~m}$ (-1.5\%) below forecast. Highway Use Tax was $\$ 32 \mathrm{~m}(3.8 \%)$ above forecast. DMV fees were $\$ 29 \mathrm{~m}$ (3.9\%) over forecast. Sales tax revenue as of March was \$39M ($26.7 \%$ ) under forecast, due to a timing issue. Federal revenue was $\$ 68 \mathrm{~m}$ (6.3\%) over forecast. <br> Total Highway Fund revenue is $\$ 2,138 \mathrm{M}$ YTD. Highway Fund Revenue represents $46 \%$ of total NCDOT revenue and is currently $0.53 \%$ below forecast. <br> Total Trust Fund revenue is $\$ 1,361 \mathrm{M}$ YTD, which represents $29 \%$ of total NCDOT revenue and is currently $0.6 \%$ above forecast. Mrs. Ellis presented new slides based on prior requests from board members to view more detailed information about revenue sources. Current fiscal year, 5-year trend, and related commentary were provided for major revenue sources such as motor fuel taxes and highway use taxes. Board members provided positive initial feedback to this information. |

## 5. Disaster Funding - Emily McGraw, PE State Maintenance Engineer

| DISCUSSION SUMMARY | Mrs. McGraw spoke on Disaster Funding and started by providing a brief overview of both FHWA and FEMA funding. Disaster season starts June 1st, but NCDOT is starting to prepare now. <br> FHWA provides reimbursement for damages to Federal Aid routes (US, NC, and Interstate routes). FHWA funds are potentially available when an event causes at least $\$ 700,000$ (Federal share) in eligible damages. For emergency protective measures NC DOT receives $100 \%$ federal funding to restore essential traffic, minimize extent of damages, and protect the remaining facilities. On permanent repairs, we get $90 \%$ for interstate highways and $80 \%$ on all other Federal Aid routes. <br> FEMA gives potential reimbursement for damages to non-Federal Aid State maintained routes. FEMA recommendation requires NC to exceed the around $\$ 18.5 \mathrm{M}$ Preliminary Damage Assessment threshold. This Public Assistance (PA) allows for a Federal reimbursement of eligible costs at $75 \%$ (at least) and a Local match of $25 \%$. |

## Revenue Commentary

- FYTD revenues have a negative variance to spend plan of $-4.4 \%$.
- Negative FYTD variance is due to Other Revenue -the Economic Development transfer from the Department of Commerce (DOC) and to a lesser extent, FHWA Federal Aid.
- Positive June variance is due to Other Revenue - receiving Turnpike Federal Aid (\$38.8M).
- Receipts from FHWA have increased by 14.2\% YOY.

## Expense Commentary

- Overall negative FYTD variance to spend plan is $-6.5 \%$ or $-\$ 513.2 \mathrm{M}$; attributable to Construction and Maintenance.
- Construction and Maintenance expenditures have fallen short of forecast due to labor and material shortages, but the variance to plan has decreased throughout the fiscal year as some of these pressures have begun to ease.
- Monthly variance to spend plan is $8.1 \%$; with positive variances in Maintenance, largely due to GMR.
- Overall expenditures are up 16.2\% YOY.

Lonnetta Raynor provided the Committee the following updates:

## Staffing:

Lonnetta informed that one additional auditor had been hired in the Consultant, Utility, Railroad \& Turnpike (CURT) unit. We currently have one Single Audit auditor position available that is being utilized by an outside consultant.

Engagements/Audits:
Internal audit completed two engagements: (1) Business Administration Procurement and (2) Physical Security - Badge Access. Management has responded and both engagements have been uploaded to the OSBM website.

The EAGLE audit is underway for NCDOT.
Wayne Davenport, Internal Audit Manager, presented the Audit Plan and informed that nearly every area of the Plan has been touched on with some type of engagement. Discussion followed with questions and answers. Wayne also gave an update to previous questions regarding P-card transactions: approximately 1,700 cards, 108,000 transactions, totaling $\$ 33,000,000, \$ 10,000$ limit per card or $\$ 20,000 /$ month and amounts can be adjusted as determined by management. One of the resident engineers gave an example of how the P -cards work in his division.
