Declaration of Quorum

Following the roll call, Chairman Fox stated the members participating constituted a quorum of the Board and he declared the meeting open.

Call to Order

Chairman Fox called the full board meeting to order on Thursday, February 1, 2024.

Ethics Statement

Chairman Fox read the Ethics Statement advising all members of the Board that may have any conflict of interest, or appearance of conflict, to refrain from participation in that item and to file the proper paperwork with the Secretary to the Board of Transportation.

Chairman Fox read, "In accordance with the State Government Ethics Act, Executive Order No. 2 issued on January 12, 2009, and N. C. G. "To comply with this statement and the State Ethics Law, I ask whether any Board member has a known conflict of interest or appearance of conflict with respect to any matters coming before the Board today."

"If so, please identify the conflict or appearance of conflict when the item appears on the agenda for consideration, refrain from any undue participation in the particular matter involved and sign before our notary the Declaration that has been provided to you for such purpose."

Pledge of Allegiance

Chairman Fox invited Secretary Hopkins to lead the members of the Board and all other meeting attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval – January 4, 2024, Meeting Minutes

Chairman Fox stated the meeting minutes from January 4, 2024, were distributed for review prior to the meeting. Chairman Fox stated if there are no additions or corrections, he would accept a motion to approve the January 4, 2024, meeting minutes of the Board of Transportation. A motion was made by Vice Chair Perkins and a second by Board Member Phillips. The minutes were approved unanimously by members of the Board.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

State Treasurer Presentation

Chairman Fox invited State Treasurer Dale Folwell to give his remarks via Teams.

State Auditor Presentation

Chairman Fox invited State Auditor Jessica Holmes and Deputy State Auditor, Katina Bell to give their remarks.

Road, Bridge, and Ferry Naming Honorary Designations

Board Member Melvin Mitchell read the resolution for Congressman G.K. Butterfield Highway naming located in Division 4. The reading was accepted as a motion by Board Member Mitchell and a second by Board Member Hunt. The motion passed unanimously by the members of the Board.

Board Member Melvin Mitchell read the resolution for the Jimmy Capps Highway naming located in Division 4. The reading was accepted as a motion by Board Member Mitchell and a second by Board Member Daughtry. The motion passed unanimously by the members of the Board.

Chairman Fox read the resolution for the Deputy Ruan P. Hendrix Bridge naming located in Division 14. The reading was accepted as a motion by Board Member McGrady and a second by Board Member Harrington. The motion passed unanimously by the members of the Board.

Secretary's Remarks

Secretary Hopkins started off by welcoming everyone to the Board meeting. He also gave a special thanks to Auditor Holmes and Treasurer Falwell for presenting at the meeting. It was a real treat to have them here and he's looking forward to having other Council of State and Cabinet Members moving forward. He thanked them for their partnerships with our department.

Secretary Hopkins shared some good news on our financial front. The performance audit report Auditor Holmes' office released on January 12, 2024, on our cash spending plan for the 2023 state fiscal year was positive. In addition to that, we had an audit released on our annual comprehensive financial report that was released on January 30, 2024. Both audit reports were positive, and he thanked Auditor Holmes and her staff for working with our staff on both audits. Findings on the annual comprehensive financial report audit showed that there were no significant issues. There were a couple of material misstatements that have since been corrected. Both misstatements were tied to value and assets, and they do not affect our day-today financial operations. The findings of the Spend Plan Audit showed that the department did not exceed our spend plan, we spent \$7.37B against the planned \$7.88B. The department developed the spending plan based on specific projects and operations. The department formally monitored and enforced each highway division's compliance with the developed spending plan. This is good news and an important part of being transparent and trustworthy to the people we serve. Thank you to all our staff who had a hand in making sure we stayed on target with our spending goals.

Secretary Hopkins announced that we began accepting entries for the fourth NCDOT Mobi Awards. These awards spotlight multimodal projects and the great impact they have on our communities across the state. Towns, cities, counties, universities/colleges, planning organizations, public transportation systems, airport authorities, and councils of government can submit projects up until March 1, 2024. Entries should be projects that serve two or more modes of travel, including highways. They should also be projects completed and put into operation or service after January 1, 2019. Projects that were previously submitted in the 2020 and 2022 Mobi Awards contest that were not selected can be submitted again. You can learn more about the awards on our connect page.

Secretary Hopkins announced that there is still time to apply to receive free helmets from the

department through our annual Bicycle Helmet Initiative. Bicycle helmets save lives and prevent serious injuries and that's why our Integrated Mobility Division gives them away each year. Organizations statewide can participate in this initiative to distribute helmets to children in need. Applications must be received online by February 9, 2024. If you're interested, visit ncdot.gov and search "helmet."

Secretary Hopkins shared an update about our rest area memorial. It's tragic anytime we lose an employee. A few years ago, we honored Anna Bradshaw after she was struck and killed in Wilson County while attempting to clear storm debris from a highway. For those killed in the line of duty, we add their name to our memorial displayed at every rest area in our state. But, until recently, three names were missing from a tragedy that happened way back in 1975 in Nash County. Three Division 4 maintenance employees were killed in a crash with a truck hauling bricks. Their names were accidentally left off our memorial. That is, until one of the relatives reached out to us last summer. Secretary Hopkins then played a video sharing this story. Our Rest Area Memorial has 116 names. It is a solemn reminder of how our employees are truly public servants.

Lastly, Secretary Hopkins shared a personnel update that he was excited to share. Aurea Rodriguez, who you all know well as she has worked in the Governance Office for many years, has excepted a promotion to serve as the Governance Office director. Many of you may have thought she was already doing this role, since Aurea has been acting director of Governance since Ann Dishong left last year. Aurea is a U.S. Air Force veteran who has been with the Department for 18 years. She held a variety of roles during this time and moved to the Governance Office in 2008, where she helped oversee a Governance framework for IT projects and systems and managed the design and implementation of the Department's first Legacy Leadership Program. She was promoted to Deputy Director of Governance in 2018, overseeing legal and ethical compliance of Board operations and strategy for the Department's four boards. Please join me in congratulating Aurea and supporting her in this new leadership role.

Chairman Fox invited a motion to approve the project items as presented. A motion was made by Board Member Lail and a second by Vice Chair Perkins to approve all projects for G, I, K, M, N, O, P, R, and S. Chairman Fox conducted a roll call vote of participating members, and the project items were approved unanimously by members of the Board.

Chairman Fox stated the motion passed.

The Developer shall reimburse the Department 100% of the actual cost of the work. The estimated reimbursement from the Developer is \$295,897.08.

This Project consists of review and inspection of a traffic signal installation at the intersection at NC 75 (W. South Main Street) and SR-1107 (Rehobeth Road) in Waxhaw. - asked for an approval of the December 7, 2023 meeting minutes. December 7th meeting minutes were approved by Anthony Lathrop and Board member Meagan Phillips provided the second.
- Commissioner Wayne Goodwin made Opening Remarks then introduced the License and Theft Bureau team members to conduct their presentation.
- COL Michael Oates provided initial remarks then introduced primary speaker, LTC James Crissman to present on "Driver License and Dealer Plate Fraud".
 - Comments were made reference legal ramifications if person is caught in possession of fraudulent IDs, including court costs, time in jail if any.
 - New changes in IDs are quickly adapted to by criminals wanting to make and sell fraudulent IDs.
 - Question was raised if Dealer Plate Fraud was an issue in other countries.
 - How is DMV adapting to this issue? One way is through ongoing training to help inspectors in the field identify fraudulent IDs and dealer plates.
- Closing Discussions. Vice-Chair Mitchell thanked the License and Theft team for the indepth presentation.

EDIR Committee

The EDIR committee heard 1 presentation.

1. BOOM Supersonic Economic Development Project; CMGC – Alt Project Delivery Method: Wright Archer, Div 7 Division Engineer and Brian Ketner, Embedded Div 7 PM

Highlights of the presentation and discussion included:

- North Carolina was the chosen location due to several key points such as proximity to the Atlantic Ocean, access to Rail and Ports, ability to successfully deliver oversized loads on the existing highway network, access to local technical schools and universities, a large presence of U.S. military veterans, and proximity of many tier-one aerospace suppliers.
- Discussed the benefits to North Carolina including 1,750 jobs by 2030 and more than 2,400 by 2032, \$32.3 billion of state economic growth over 20 years, and 200 internships through 2032.
- Discussed benefits of the CMGC alternate delivery method for Project BOOM which included continuous communication between all parties, mitigating risk and allowing for non-linear delivery. This method promotes out-of-the-box thinking while also allowing NCDOT to maintain control of design, schedule, and budget.
- Project BOOM is anticipated to be under budget at completion. Phase I was completed in Dec 2023 with Phase II scheduled for completion in June 2024.

Highways Committee

- 1. NCDOT Worker Safety: Robin Barfield, Director of Safety and Risk Management Highlights of the presentation and discussion included:
 - NCDOT's Construction Manual, Safe Operating Procedures (SOP) Workplace Safety Manual, and Safety and Risk Management's SPPs are all located on the NCDOT Connect Site.
 - NCDOT establishes safety as a pillar of doing business with the department.
 - NCDOT is comprised of a multitude of safety and health disciplines that many smaller entities do not have.
 - Tail Gate Safety Meetings are held daily before crews head to job sites.
 - NCDOT is involved in research to share with Contractors on the following topics:
 - Fall Protection on Bridges
 - Color of Safety Vests Does Color really Matter?
 - \circ Chevron Patterns on Trucks to Raise Attention to Workers Needed

Highlights of the presentation and discussion included:

- Jahmal presented on the Interagency Derailment Exercise organized by the Rail Division to ensure the State is well prepared to respond to a hazmat derailment.
- 2. S Line Transit Oriented Development Study: Brennon Fuqua, Interim Director for Integrated Mobility Division

Highlights of the presentation and discussion included:

- Brennon presented the S line transit-oriented development study.
- The study assisted the towns along the S line envision where they could site the mobility hub and how to grow in a more dense and walkable way while connecting last mile solutions to the rail station/mobility hub.

Chairman Fox reminded everyone that the Board will meet back in Raleigh in the Highway Building in March. In April, the Board will be traveling to the western part of the state in Divisions 13 and 14. 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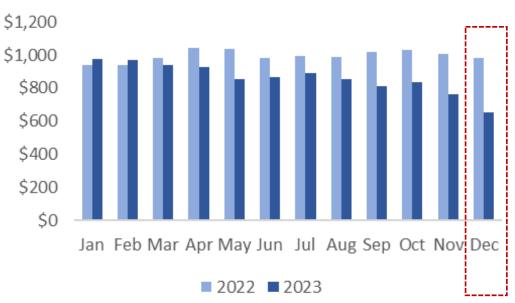
## HF & HTF Cash Balances - 12 Months Ended December 31, 2023

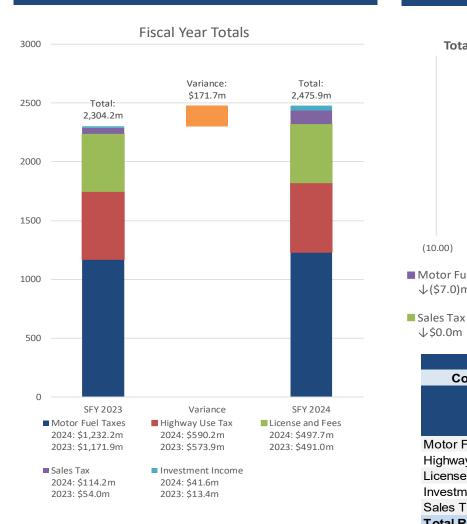

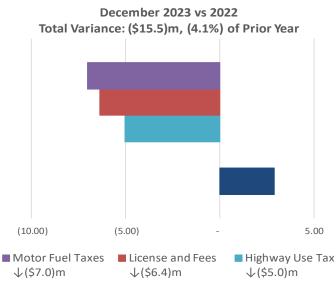
## Revenues by Source – Highway Fund & Trust Fund – Dec 2023(\$M)

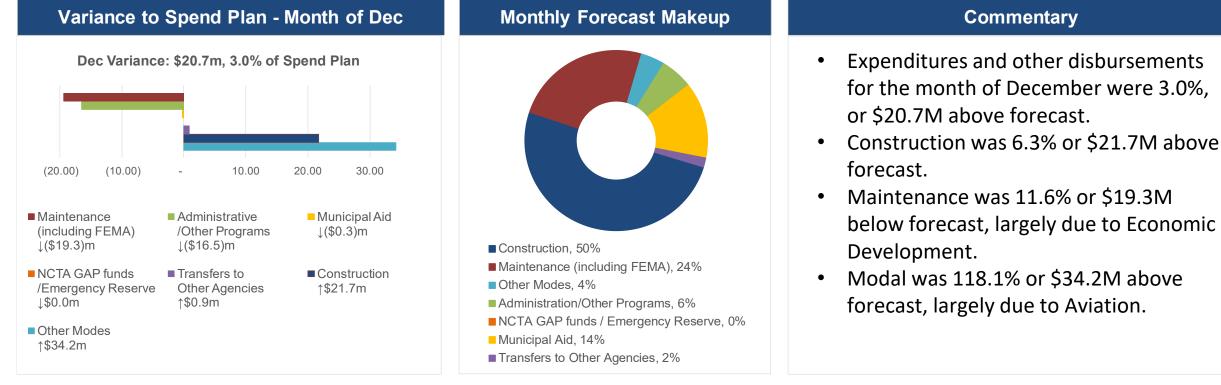

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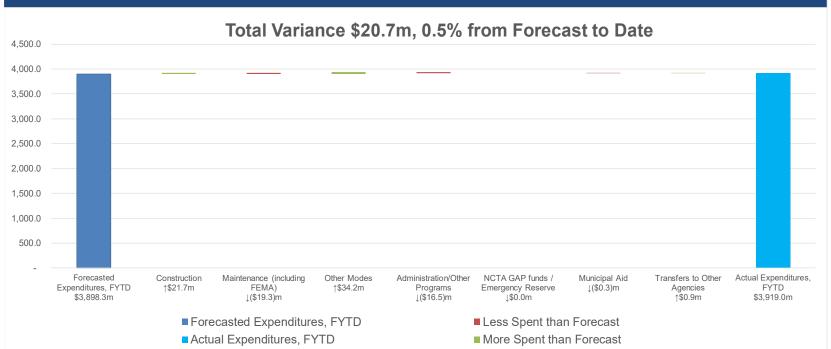
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## **Overall Expenditures and Other Disbursements** Actuals vs Forecast – FYTD (\$M)

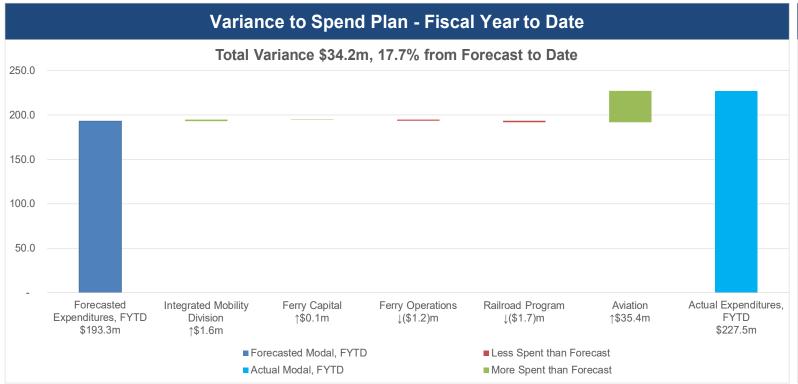

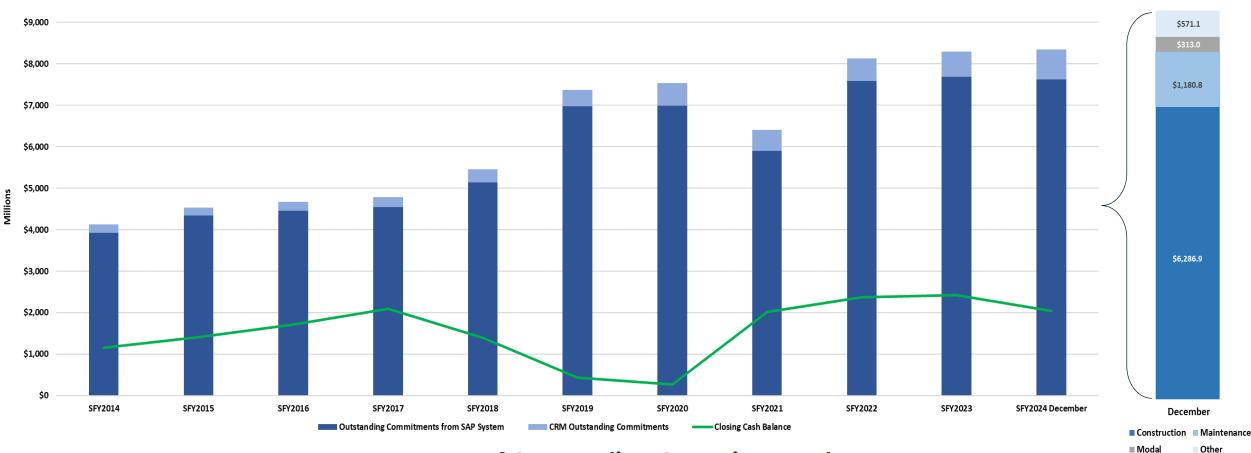

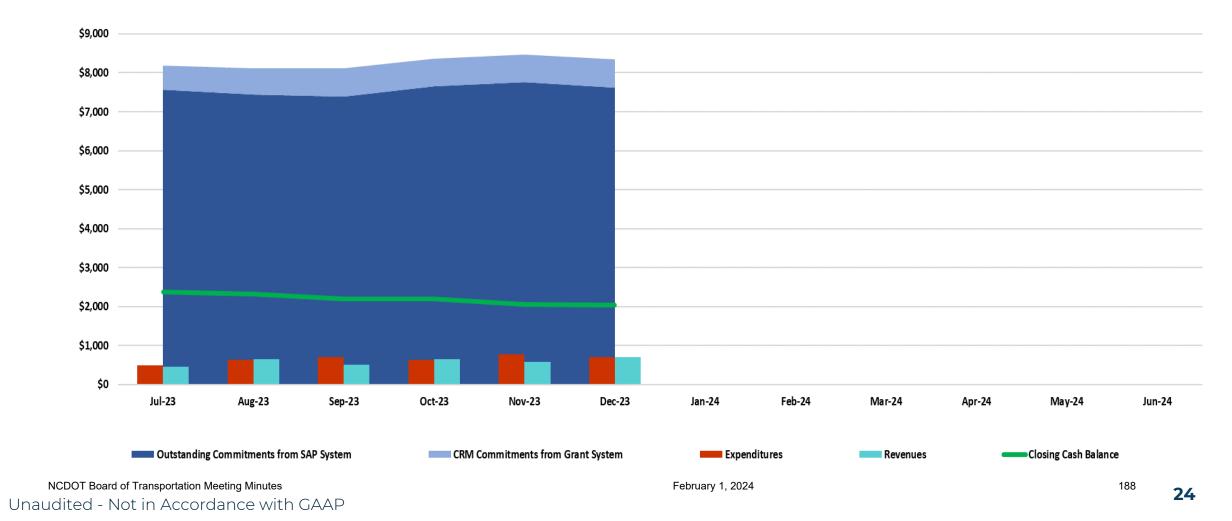

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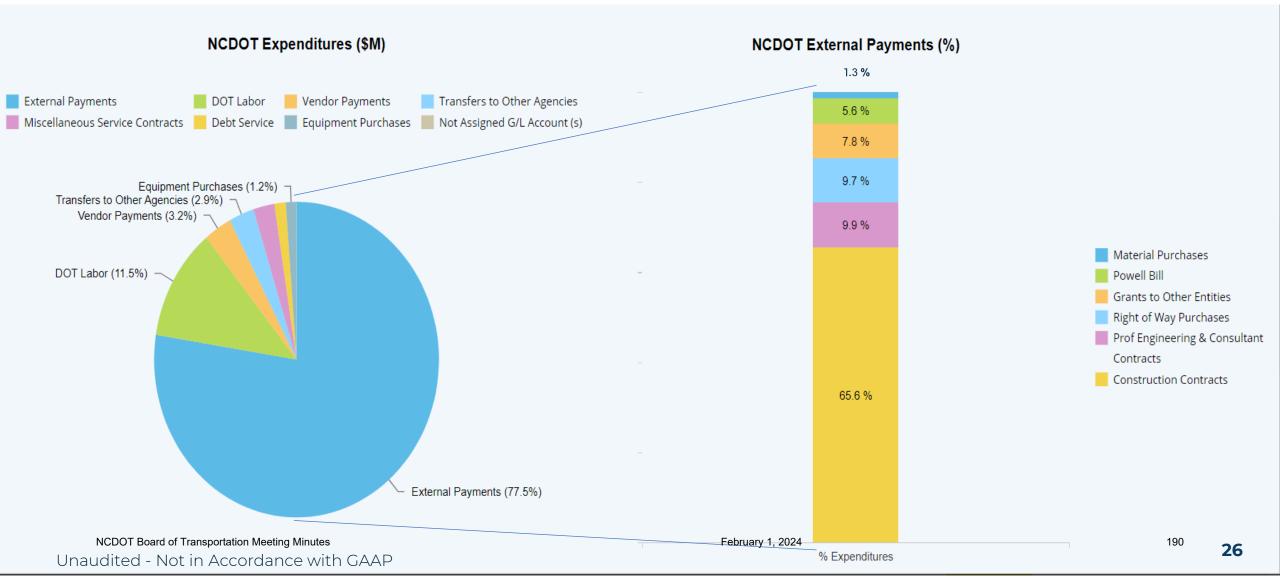
## **NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Cash Balances by Month**

## NCDOT Expenditures SFY2024 as of December 31, 2023



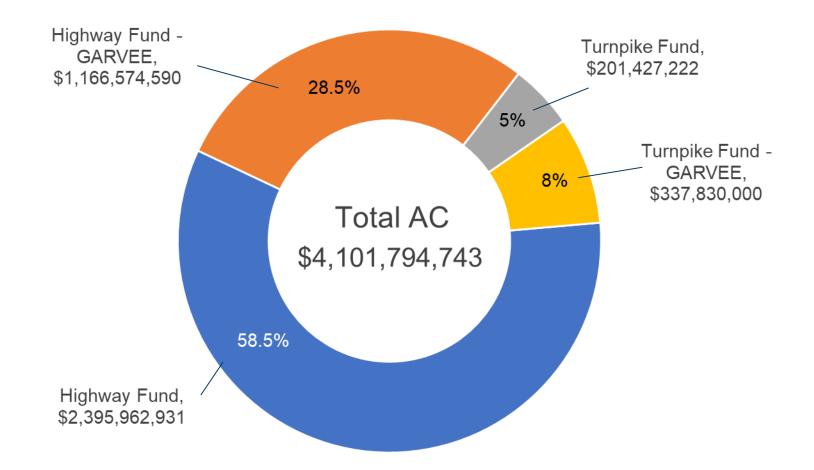

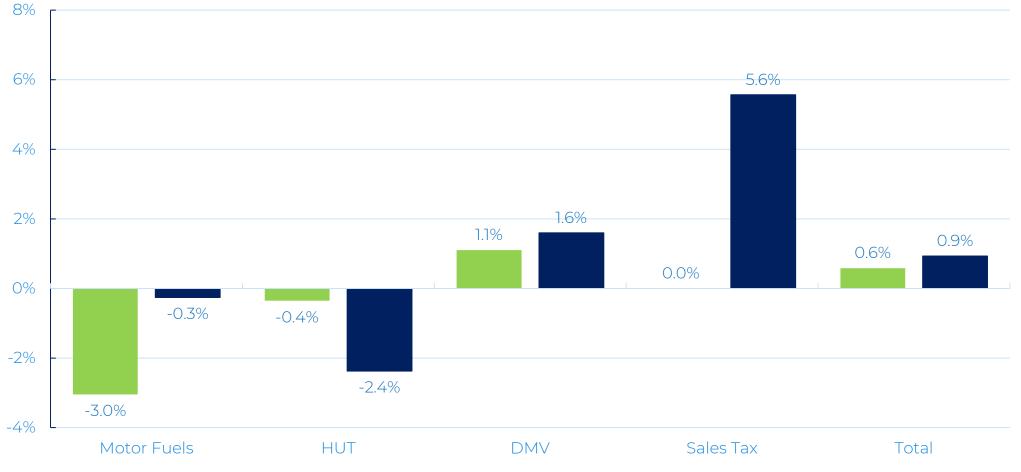

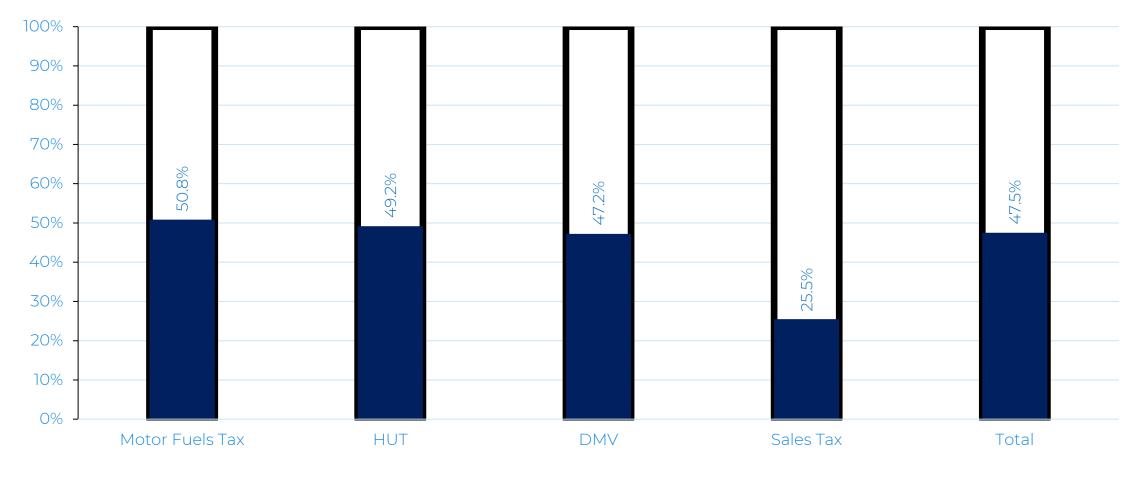
#### Actual Revenues to Quarterly Targets

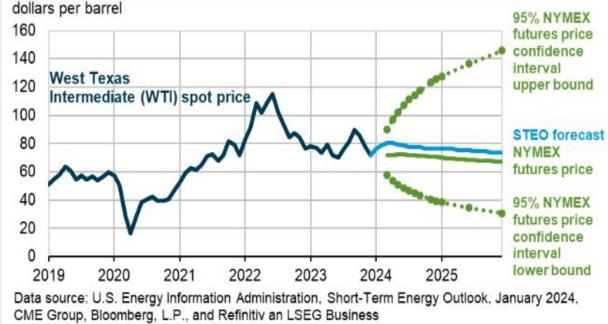

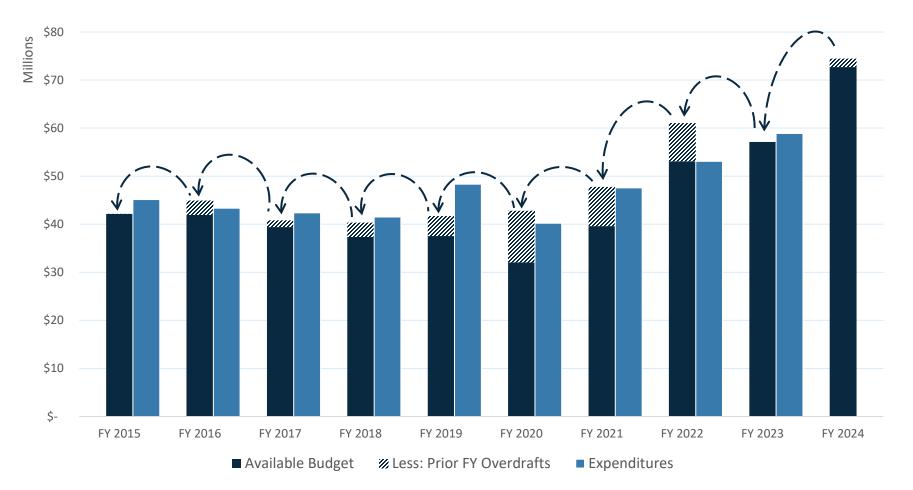

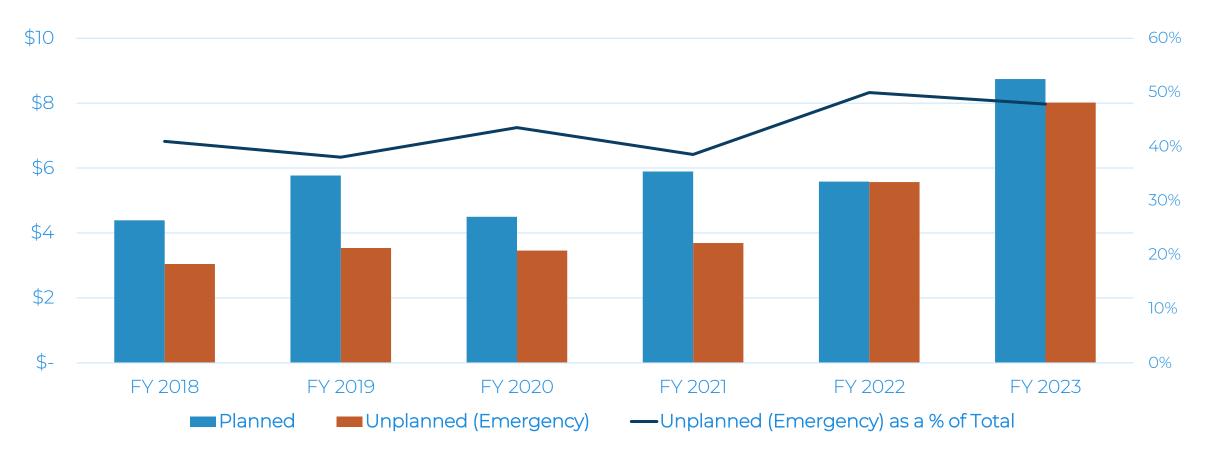

## **Historic Diesel Fuel Prices FY 2018-24**



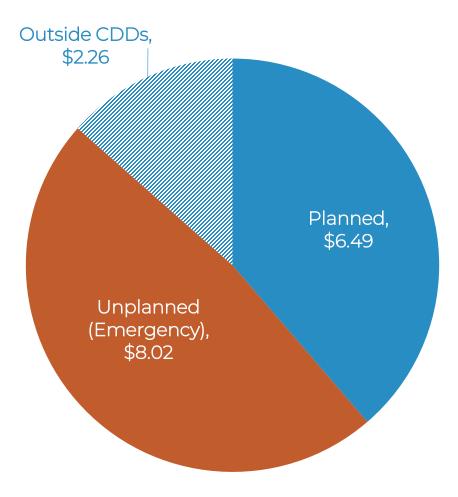

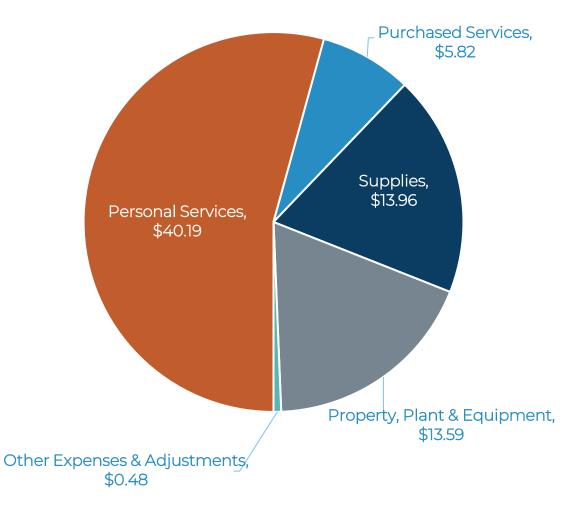

A fake ID is a driver's license or other government-issued identification that has been altered, duplicated, falsified, forged, reproduced, or counterfeited.

# **Driver License Fraud**

How are fraudulent drivers license and identification cards used?

- Access to bars and purchase alcohol.
- Testing purposes (drivers tests, school tests).
- Open accounts or utility services (may require SSN).
- Apply for government benefits (may require SSN).
- Operate a motor vehicle (commercial).
- Hide true identify to escape justice.

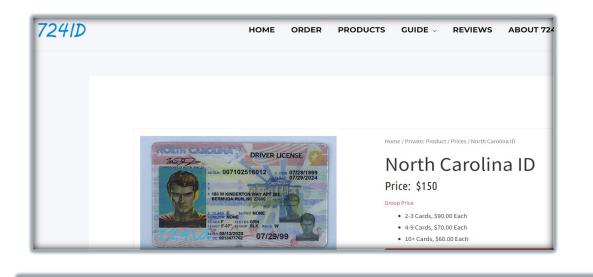

  - ✓ 69% of college students said they owned or used a fake ID;
    ✓ 40% of female college sophomores own a fake ID;
    ✓ 36% of male college sophomores own a fake ID;
    ✓ 7% of high schoolers reported owning a fake ID;

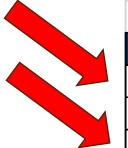

What are the dealer plate fraud trends?

- Counterfeit temporary markers counterfeit plates unlawfully reproduced.
- Modification of temporary markers changing expirations/vehicle.
- Selling of temporary markers dealers in-state and out of state.

## **Dealer Plate Fraud**

Use of fraudulent temporary markers allows people to:

- Avoid paying tolls, registration fees, taxes.
- Operate a vehicle unlawfully revoked license plate.
- Conceal the true identity of a vehicle stolen/cloned.
- Commit criminal activities.

- One ghost-tag seller stated she sold 3,000 temporary plates through her dealership for \$100 each.

## **Dealer Plate Fraud**

Need for statutory regulations: (pending legislation).

- Print-on-demand HB 199 & SB542 (met crossover).
- Legislation which requires dealers to use a print-ondemand registration system when issuing temporary markers.
- Vehicle identifying information will be transmitted to the Division, along with issuance and expiration dates.

*A step in the right direction but some fraud may continue due to materials and ability to reproduce.

## **Dealer Plate Fraud**

Need for statutory regulations: (recommended).

- General Statute does not provide a specific criminal violation for the selling of or reproduction of a temporary marker.
- The Division has requested additional language added to G.S. 20-111 so that persons involved with such offences can be held accountable.

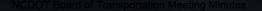

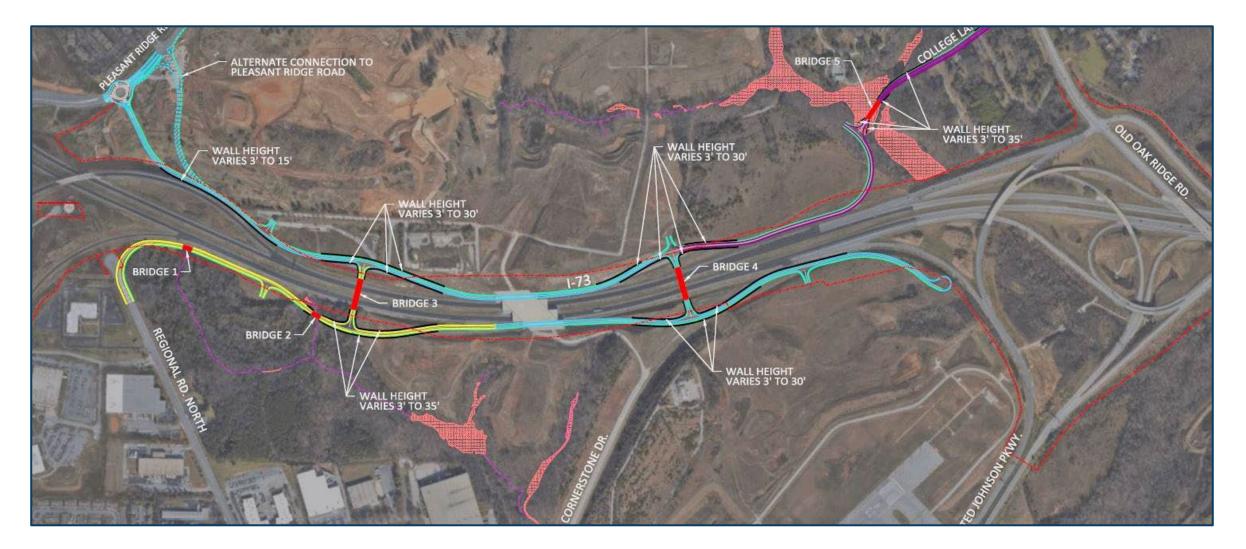

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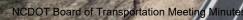

## **NCDOT Construction Manual**

- This includes a suspension of work if required.
  - 2. The Department has established emphasis areas to protect Department project personnel from imminent danger situations where serious injury may occur. During the life of the project, the Resident Engineer and each Inspector should especially observe the operations involving emphasis areas with a safety-oriented view. The emphasis areas include fall protection, crane safety, equipment, excavation protective systems, and respirable crystalline silica. The pertinent regulations on these emphasis areas are included in this section of the Manual. If the Resident Engineer or Inspectors observe a possible violation of the regulations pertaining to the emphasis areas, the Contractor should be advised to take immediate corrective action. Should the Contractor not take immediate corrective action and Department personnel appear to be in danger, the work should be suspended under the provisions of Article 108-7 of the Standard Specifications. When there is a question of interpretation of the regulations, the situation should be discussed with the Division Engineer before work is suspended. All verbal communications to the Contractor's personnel should be documented in writing with a copy to the Division Engineer, Area Construction Engineer, the Director of Safety and Risk Management, and the State Construction Engineer. If the Contractor disregards the requests to correct possible violations, the Division Engineer and State Construction Engineer should be advised with the full details. #### Tail Gate Safety Meetings

#### SOP 10-23

- 1. Tail gate safety meetings shall be held at the beginning of each work period (normally in the morning before leaving the yard or work staging area) and as conditions change from job site to job site.
- 2. The crew leader or the senior person for the crew shall conduct these meetings.
- Utilize ORM (Operational Risk Management) program components and record meeting using the ORM Daily Tailgate Safety Meeting binders for your Unit.
  - i. Identify the task or work to be performed
  - ii. Assess the potential hazards for each employee's job task
  - iii. Implement controls to control the potential hazards identified
  - iv. Perform the work with controls
  - v. Re-assess when conditions change at job site

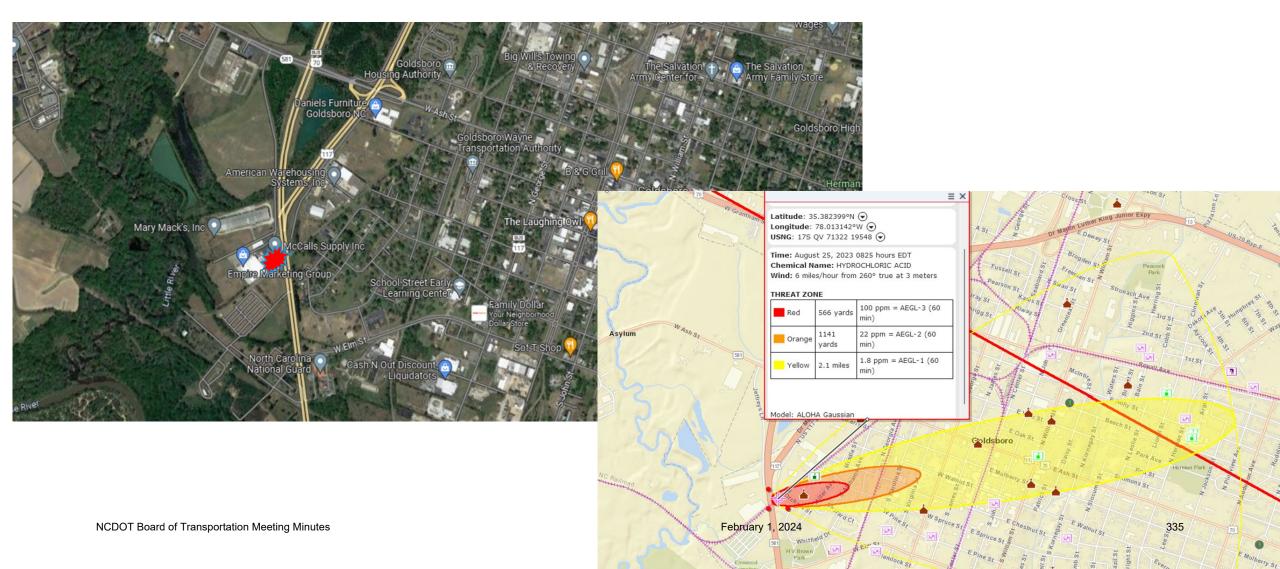

## **Agencies and Roles**

- Call comes into NC Emergency Operations Center (EOC)
- NCEOC alerts appropriate parties local fire chief is in charge and determines levels of response are needed at county and state level
- Railroad has on-call contractors that are immediately called in to respond to the incident, are the primary lead for sampling and cleanup
- Regional Response Team (RRT) collection of hazmat trained regional specialists respond to incident (seven teams across the state)
- DHHS, NC DEQ, NC Emergency Management (EM) and US EPA engaged during plan development and decision making and provide guidance on what is required and needed from contractor for cleanup operations
- DEQ and DHHS play pivotal role with sampling and health effects considerations
- NCDOT supports through intergovernmental relationships

## RESOLUTION FOR CONGRESSMAN G K BUTTERFIELD HIGHWAY

WHEREAS, G. K. Butterfield is a lifelong resident of Wilson County, N.C.; and,

**WHEREAS,** after graduating from Charles H. Darden High School in Wilson, Butterfield earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in political science and sociology from North Carolina Central University (NCCU) and a Juris Doctor degree from NCCU's law school; and,

**WHEREAS,** during his time at NCCU, Butterfield was active in many voter registration drives and brought awareness to the importance of voter registration; and,

**WHEREAS,** during his junior year at NCCU, Butterfield was drafted into the United States Army, where he served from 1968 to 1970 before he was honorably discharged, and then he returned to NCCU to complete his undergraduate degree; and,

WHEREAS, Butterfield established Fitch and Butterfield, a pioneering black law firm, where he effectively served his clients; and,

**WHEREAS,** Butterfield was elected Resident Superior Court judge in 1988, was appointed to the N.C. Supreme Court in 2001 serving until 2003 before he returned to the Superior Court bench; and,

**WHEREAS,** Butterfield was elected to the United States House of Representatives to represent the first congressional district in 2004 and was a staunch advocate for his constituents, placing particular emphasis on securing federal appropriations for Halifax and Northampton counties; and,

**WHEREAS,** the residents of Halifax and Northampton counties elected Congressman Butterfield to be their federal representative in nine consecutive elections; and,

**WHEREAS,** the Halifax County Board of Commissioners supports the designation of a highway in honor of Congressman G.K. Butterfield.

#### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

That the North Carolina Board of Transportation honorarily designates Interstate 95 from the Virginia state line to Exit 173 at U.S. 158 in Halifax County the *Congressman G K Butterfield Highway.*
