#### **Professional Services Management**

#### **Chief Operating Officer**

#### Chief Engineer - Divisions 8-14

The following are supplemental contracts to previous contracts approved by the Board with the same engineering firms. These supplemental contracts were necessary due to approved additional work that was unknown at the inception and is required of the firms to complete the project. **WHEREAS**, James William Batten was born in Goldsboro, N.C., on Aug. 5, 1919, and graduated from the Micro School in 1936; and,

**WHEREAS**, Batten completed his bachelor's degree at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill in 1940 and then taught chemistry, biology and math at Glendale High School in Kenly, N.C.; and,

**WHEREAS**, Batten joined the United States Navy in 1941, was honorably discharged in 1946 with the rank of lieutenant commander and remained a member of the U.S. Naval Reserve until 1966; and,

**WHEREAS**, Batten resumed teaching at Wilmington College (now UNC-Wilmington) in 1946, and then taught at Princeton High School from 1947-1950; and,

**WHEREAS**, Batten served as principal of Micro High School from 1950-1958 and completed his master's degree in 1957; and,

**WHEREAS**, Batten was awarded a teaching fellowship at UNC-Chapel Hill in 1958 and served as the presenter at the Morehead Planetarium in 1959; and,

WHEREAS, Batten earned his doctorate in Education in 1960 and joined East Carolina University as an assistant professor. He rose to full professor, chaired ECU's Department of Secondary Education, and later served as ECU's assistant dean of the College of Education. Upon retiring in 1986, he was named faculty emeritus and, in 1990, was recognized as an honorary alumnus of ECU; and,

**WHEREAS**, while serving at the Morehead Planetarium, Dr. Batten trained NASA astronauts in the science of celestial navigation, which proved valuable to U.S. astronauts in the Mercury, Gemini, Apollo and Skylab programs; and,

**WHEREAS**, Dr. Batten served as a valuable adviser to many students while at ECU and challenged students to achieve their dreams; and,

**WHEREAS**, throughout his life, Dr. Batten expressed his pride in his Johnston County roots and was an inspiration to his community before his death on Dec. 10, 2004; and,

**WHEREAS**, officials with town of Micro and Johnston County request that the North Carolina Board of Transportation name a bridge in Batten's honor.

WHEREAS, during his 22-year career with the Greensboro Police Department, Nix served in numerous roles including financial crimes detective, patrol sergeant, police training officer, detective sergeant over the Family Victims Unit, peer support team leader, assistant team leader for the department's Honor Guard, and member of the U.S. Secret Service and U.S. Attorney's Financial Crimes Task Forces; and,

WHEREAS, Sgt. Nix contributed to the Elder Justice Committee, Domestic Violence High Risk Team, Family Justice Center, Friends Against Fraud, and Vital Signs programs, and served as faculty for the Alliance for HOPE International Training Institute on Strangulation Prevention; and,

WHEREAS, Sgt. Nix was recognized nationally for his leadership and expertise in non-fatal strangulation investigations and was a respected member of the Greensboro Police Officers Association; and,







Presenter Laura Kennedy from North Carolina State Parks presented updates to the North Carolina State Parks and how it impacts the public as well as how NCDOT and NC Parks work together.

The North Carolina Division of Parks and Recreation exists to inspire all its citizens and visitors through conservation, recreation, and education.

The North Carolina State Parks System has:

35 State Parks

25 State Natural Areas

4 State Recreation Areas

15 State Trails

4 State Rivers

7 State Lakes

Over 20 million visitors per year

The State Parks Act of 1987 defined the system as having six components: state parks, state natural areas, state recreation areas, state trails, state rivers, and state lakes.

The system provides an enormous number of facilities for public use. All state parks offer trails for hiking or walking.

Eight state parks offer bridle trails for equestrians, and about 14 state parks offer trails open to bicyclists

Visitors can paddle at 30 state parks. Many of them offer equipment rentals through the park, an onsite private concessionaire, or a nearby private concessionaire.

The NC State Parks also offer boat ramps at 15 parks and Carolina Beach State Park operates the only state-owned marina in the system

32 state parks and state recreation areas currently offer overnight facilities, and 20 of them have campsites that adhere to ADA standards

There are over 500 permanent staff and over 700 seasonal staff across the state parks system. One of the major impacts state parks has is providing seasonal and permanent employment for individuals in a variety of fields and skill levels in large and small communities across the state.

NC Parks is currently undertaking an economic impact study of state and local parks and trails to help better understand the economic impacts that parks have. The study focuses on these four impacts:

- Value for main street businesses through tourist spending
- Creating jobs and economic activity through NC Parks spending and grant programs

Mr. Newsome clarified that \$1.15B allocated to NC in a FHWA press release on September 30, 2025 does not represent cash transmitted to NCDOT. The release is intended to denote the allocation of the available federal budget to NC for recovery. NCDOT will continue to receive cash from the federal government on a reimbursement basis as in the past.









# Revenues and Other Receipts Commentary

- September revenues and other receipts were 10% or \$77.4M above forecast, mostly attributed to FHWA Federal Aid revenues. This increase is due to August Redistribution (Redistribution of FY2025 Obligation Limitation) received in the amount of \$187.8 million. In addition, \$29.4 million in Emergency Relief was billed and received from FHWA for Hurricane Helene
- MFT continues to show year-overyear growth, while Sales Tax, HUT, and License & Fees reflect steady gains. Investment income has experienced a modest decline










Maintenance Expenditures and Other Disbursements Actuals vs Forecast – Monthly (\$M)









## NCDOT Expenditures SFY2026 as of September 30, 2025







## Advance Construction (AC)

#### **Definition:**

• An authorization technique that allows FHWA to authorize a federally funded project without obligating federal funds at the time of authorization. FHWA approves a project as eligible for federal funding but does not commit to funding the project.

#### Advantage:

• Maintains eligibility for future reimbursement without a commitment of current state Budget Authority (BA) and federal Obligation Authority (OA)

#### Effective use of AC requires:

- Availability of state funds to pay project bills until reimbursement
- A stable federal program

## Traditional Funding vs. Advance Construction

#### **Traditional Funding**

Uses full Obligation Authority (OA) and Budget Authority (BA) when authorizing funds

For example, \$10M Federal Construction Authorization/Obligation

- \$8M (80%) in Federal Funds obligated immediately in year 1
- \$2M (20%) remaining covered with State Match

#### **Advance Construction**

Obligates funding over several years rather than at the beginning of a project

#### For example, \$10M Federal Construction Authorization/Obligation

- \$8M (80%) in Federal Funds authorized but not fully obligated until expenditures occur
  - Convert and Obligate \$2M in year 2
  - Convert and Obligate \$4M in year 3
  - Convert and Obligate \$2M in year 4
- \$2M (20%) remaining covered with State Match

## **Advance Construction Workgroup**

Session Law 2020 -91 required DOT to submit a report to the General Assembly about the use of AC at NCDOT

Workgroup was formed September 2020 to investigate AC usage and make any needed recommendations

- Implemented AC Policy including oversight March 2021
- At end of each Federal Fiscal Year (FFY), analysis is completed on:
  - Current AC funding levels
  - Expected AC conversion for next 2 FFY's
  - Expected new AC funding for next 2 FFY's

## AC Control and Monitoring

Two types of AC are considered separately:

- GARVEE: NC General Assembly has statutory limits in place and therefore the policy did not require any additional tests.
- Non-GARVEE AC: AC policy requires 2 tests to ensure AC usage is monitored and used prudently. (Federal funding used for GARVEE payments is subtracted prior to performing tests)

#### Constraints for GARVEE AC

First Constraint: The greater of the two following tests

- Outstanding principal cannot exceed authorized federal funds in the prior FFY
- Maximum annual principal and interest does not exceed 20% of expected average annual federal revenue shown for the seven-year period in the most recently adopted STIP

Second Constraint: The amount of federal revenues for the FFY of issuance and previous FFY shall be at least 300 percent of the maximum annual payments for all bonds.

#### Constraints for Non -GARVEE AC

First Constraint: Limit AC (by funding source) to 4 years of anticipated federal apportionments

Second Constraint: Limit amount of unreimbursed state funds (by funding source) on AC to 1 year of anticipated federal apportionment

# First Constraint Test FFY 2026 National Highway Performance Program (NHPP) Example

#### First, calculate limit for threshold:

- FFY 2026 Apportionment = \$819.9M
- Amount of NHPP needed for GARVEE payment = \$154.8M
- Net FFY 2026 NHPP apportionment = \$819.9M
   \$154.8M = \$665.0M
- Limit on NHPP AC = \$665.0M x 4 = \$2,660.1M

#### Next, calculate projected AC balance at end of FFY 2026:

- AC balance at end of FFY 2025\* = \$1,723.1M
- Projected obligations in FFY 2026 = \$0.2M
- Projected new AC in FFY 2026 = \$739.7M
- Projected AC conversion in FFY 2026 (Net apportionment projected obligations) = \$665.0M \$0.2M = \$664.8M
- Projected AC balance at end of FFY 2026 (AC balance at end of FFY 2025 + new AC AC conversions) = \$1,723.1M + \$739.7M \$664.8M = \$1,798.0M
- \$1,798.0M is under the 4 -year limit of \$2,660.1M, we pass first test

## Second Constraint Test FFY 2026 NHPP Example

- Net FFY 2026 NHPP apportionment = \$665.0M
- Current amount of unreimbursed NHPP AC expenditures\* = \$52.4M
- Since \$52.4M < \$665.0M, we pass the second test

Note: This test needs to be done in real time, so we have done the calculation for the end of FFY 2025. We also check periodically throughout the year.

North Carolina Department of Transportation's mission is "Connecting people, products, and places safely and efficiently with customer focus, accountability and environmental sensitivity to enhance the economy and vitality of North Carolina." The Office of Inspector General conducts audits, reviews and investigations to assist the Secretary and agency in fulfilling this mission.

#### **Executive Summary**

We are pleased to present the results of the Office of Inspector General (OIG) Annual Risk Assessment and Internal Audit Plan. The Internal Audit Plan consists of a risk-based approach to provide the most effective coverage of the North Carolina Department of Transportation's (Department) programs, systems and contracts with outside entities. The risk assessment was developed based on input from executive and senior level management and OIG staff.

The audit engagements outlined in the Internal Audit Plan address various operations of the Department and seek to optimize the use of our resources. The plan includes an allocation of 10,440 audit hours and will guide our activities throughout the year. The plan will be adjusted to meet management needs as deemed necessary when other priorities are identified.

#### Introduction

The North Carolina Department of Transportation Office of Inspector General has developed an Internal Audit plan for the period July 1, 2025, through June 30, 2026, which includes three in progress and two carryover engagements from the 2024-2025 Audit Plan in addition to engagements based on a current year assessment. The assessment encompasses a risk-based approach. This approach is in keeping with the Institute of Internal Auditors' *Global Internal Audit Standards* (IIA Standards), the United States Government Accountability Office *Generally Accepted Government Auditing Standards* (GAGAS) and the Internal Audit Act (NCGS § 143-746) which generally requires the development of a risk-based audit plan. The risk-based audit approach ensures audit resources are allocated effectively and efficiently to assist management in the identification of risk and concerns impacting the organization's operations.

While the initial work plan is developed based on a risk assessment process, risk change throughout the year. Therefore, we will continuously assess risk within the Department and revise the audit plan as needed.

#### **Risk Assessment and Audit Plan Process**

OIG identified auditable units within NCDOT by reviewing the overall organization in addition to verifying with various members of executive and senior management the areas under their span of control. Assessment questionnaires were developed using nine risk categories which were aligned with risk events which impact or could potentially impact the Department, Division(s) or Unit(s). Within each risk factor, there were multiple questions designed to determine the area of risk for the area. The questionnaires were distributed to executive and senior levels of management throughout the Department.

The following are nine risk categories utilized in the assessment questionnaires:

- 1) *Strategic* Risks related to not having a strategic plan or goals and objectives in place. Determine if risk assessments are conducted. Unit promotes an ethical environment.
- 2) *Financial* Risks related to financial exposure: number and complexity of transactions. Annual budget. Cash receipts.
- 3) *Operational* Risks related to turnover, management experience, training, employment, policies and procedures, complexity of operations, planned changes and business continuity plan.
- 4) *Information Technology* Risks related to usage and reliance of technology. Artificial intelligence usage. Data restoration and backup.
- 5) Public & Political Sensitivity Risks related to media, public, political and legal exposure.
- 6) *Compliance* Risks related to regulatory requirements for federal, state, local or other oversight. Engagements and findings. Other challenges or issues.
- 7) Fraud, Waste, Abuse and Misconduct Risks related to ongoing challenges to ensure all operations are running as should be. Corruption, asset misappropriation, errors, or fraudulent financial activities are kept to a minimum. Training. Reporting process.
- 8) *Criticality of Unit* Risks related to customer base both internally and externally. Effect on NCDOT. Impact on citizens. Third party reliance.
- 9) *Concerns* Any other concerns that a unit may have and would like to express. Employee morale. Other concerns that could keep you up at night.

Responses to the assessment questionnaires were evaluated and any additional discussions warranted were held with executive and/or senior levels of management to obtain additional information about areas of risk and concerns. Managements' responses were rated and scored in terms of high, moderate and low risk. Weight factors were also considered to the impact and likelihood of occurrence for each risk factor. We calculated the composite score for each risk factor. We also determined and identified auditable activities for inclusion in the audit plan based on the risk scoring. Auditor judgment was also utilized throughout the process. The highest areas of risks were identified in the *Division of Highways*. There were also three areas that have not been audited in several years that were determined should be on the audit plan.

#### **Developing the Internal Audit Plan**

The following methodology was used to develop the FYE 2026 Internal Audit Plan:

- 1) Audit engagements which were in progress at the close of the 2025 fiscal year.
- 2) Reviewed engagements listed on FYE 2024-2025 Audit Plan which were not started.
- 3) Included reoccurring engagement for annual testing of agency financial, compliance and information technology general and end-user computing controls (*EAGLE*).
- 4) Evaluated the results of the current year risk assessment for prioritization of audit areas.
- 5) Allocated staffing hours to three engagements in progress, two carry-forward engagements, one reoccurring engagement and five engagements resulting from the risk assessments.
- 6) Allocated unscheduled staffing hours for management requests, special projects, administrative, training and paid time off.

#### Allocation of Audit Hours

The Internal Audit Unit is comprised of four auditors and a manager. The Internal Audit Unit will expend approximately 10,440 total hours on audit plan engagements as follows:

While general audit objectives are included in the plan for auditable activities resulting from the risk assessment, specific audit objectives will be determined during the planning phases of the engagements. During the planning phase, the Internal Audit Unit will use preliminary questionnaires and conduct research and interviews to gain an understanding of the respective department(s), unit(s) or functions and to develop the specific audit objectives. Most engagements presented in the plan will be conducted as compliance or performance audits. Projected hours are preliminary estimates and will be evaluated and finalized during the audit planning phase.

The Internal Audit Plan is subject to change as management priorities change, and new risks are identified.

The NCDOT Integrated Mobility Division along with Division engineers from Division 5 and 7 provided an overview of Bus Rapid Transit (BRT), explaining what it is and how these projects are funded. It then focused on the status of BRT projects in the Triangle region, with specific attention to the Western, Southern, and New Bern Avenue corridors in Raleigh and the North-South BRT in Chapel Hill. The presentation detailed how these projects are being coordinated across their respective divisions and the collaboration efforts between NCDOT and locally. The presentation overviewed the progress of these initiatives, their key features like dedicated lanes and signal priority, and the expected timeline for service, which aims to provide faster, more reliable public transit for the growing region.

Katy Fontaine, Transit Development Manager, Town of Chapel Hill Chapel Hill Transit gave an update on the North-South Bus Rapid Transit Project. The update included an overview of the current progress report, accomplishments achieved through collaboration and community engagement, and discussed next steps.

Het Patel, Assistant Director of Transportation-Transit, City of Raleigh The City of Raleigh gave a presentation on the current Go Wake Bus Rapid Transit Program that included an overview of the bus rapid transit's key features, program overview and project process, and the coordination with NCDOT. Updates included construction and design, planning processes, project development and grant agreement along with updates to other corridors included in the program overview.



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# What is Microtransit?

#### **Microtransit Definition and Purposes**

- FTA Definition:
  - Microtransit is a **technology-enabled** service that uses multi-passenger vehicles to provide **on-demand services** with dynamically generated routing. Microtransit services are traditionally provided in **designated service areas**. Service models include first mile/last mile connections to fixed route services; hub to hub zone-based services; the commingling of ADA complementary paratransit services with general transit service; and point-to-point service within a specific zone or geography.
