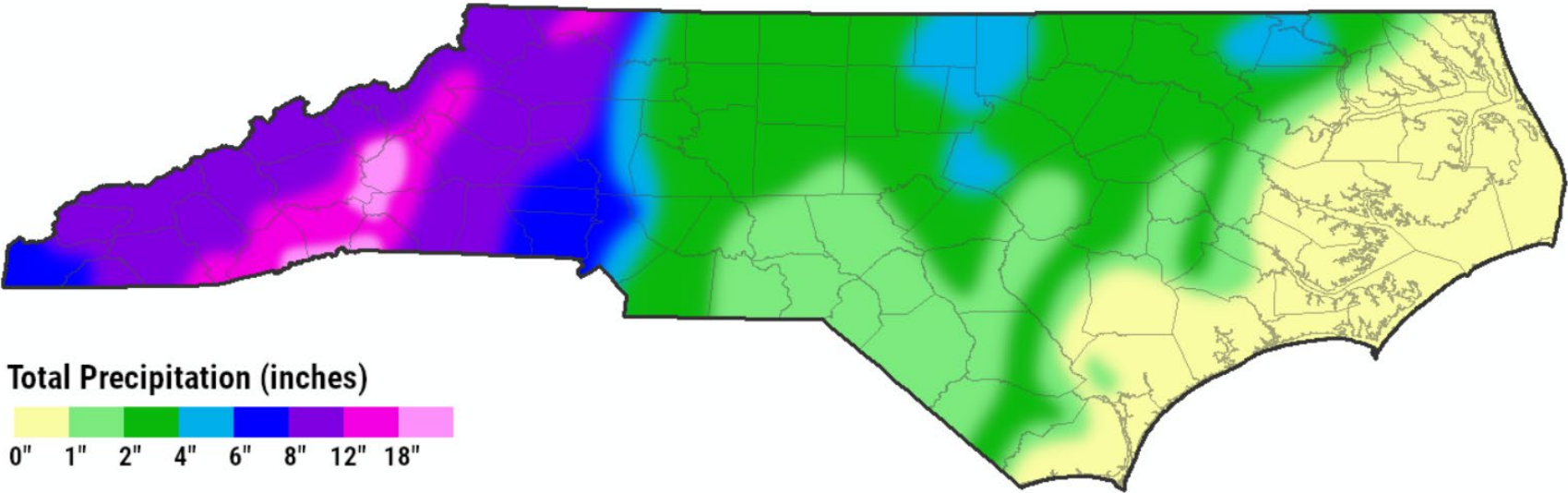

2. Financial and Spend Plan Update – Mark Newsome

DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mark Newsome provided the available cash information. As of April 30, 2026, HF and HTF's available cash was a combined \$2,411M. There were approximately 98 days of available cash on hand at current levels of expenditure. The Department's open commitments were \$10,157M, which decreased from last month by \$34M. Total revenues and other receipts were \$92.8M or 1.3% above forecast. Total expenditures and other disbursements were \$20.9M or 0.3% above forecast.

3. Hurricane Helene Recovery Financial Update – Mark Newsome

DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mark Newsome provided an update on Hurricane Helene's impact on the Department's financial status. As of June 1, 2026, the Department has incurred approximately \$1.6B in storm-related expenditure, equating to approximately 27% of the overall cost estimate. FHWA reimbursements were \$396M and FEMA reimbursements were \$255M. As of March 2026, total projected spend is \$5,857M with an anticipated federal share of \$4,866M and an anticipated State share of \$991M.

4. Oil Price Impact – Mark Newsome, Adeel Farooqi, Economist, Jonathan Mauldin, Multimodal Business System Analyst Supervisor

DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Mr. Mauldin discussed fuel cost overview on the Ferry Operations, since the onset of the Iran conflict, ferry diesel prices have increased 75% on average (\$2.35 to \$4.15/gal) and 50% at peak (\$3.37 to \$5.07/gal) between January and May 2026. \$0.85M (0.36M gal) remains in the FY26 fuel budget; prices must hold below \$3.20/gal to avoid a budget overrun. Sustained elevated prices could create FY27 operational and budget pressures. This could lead to a reduced schedule or even a possible fully reduced schedule, reducing departures by roughly 40%.

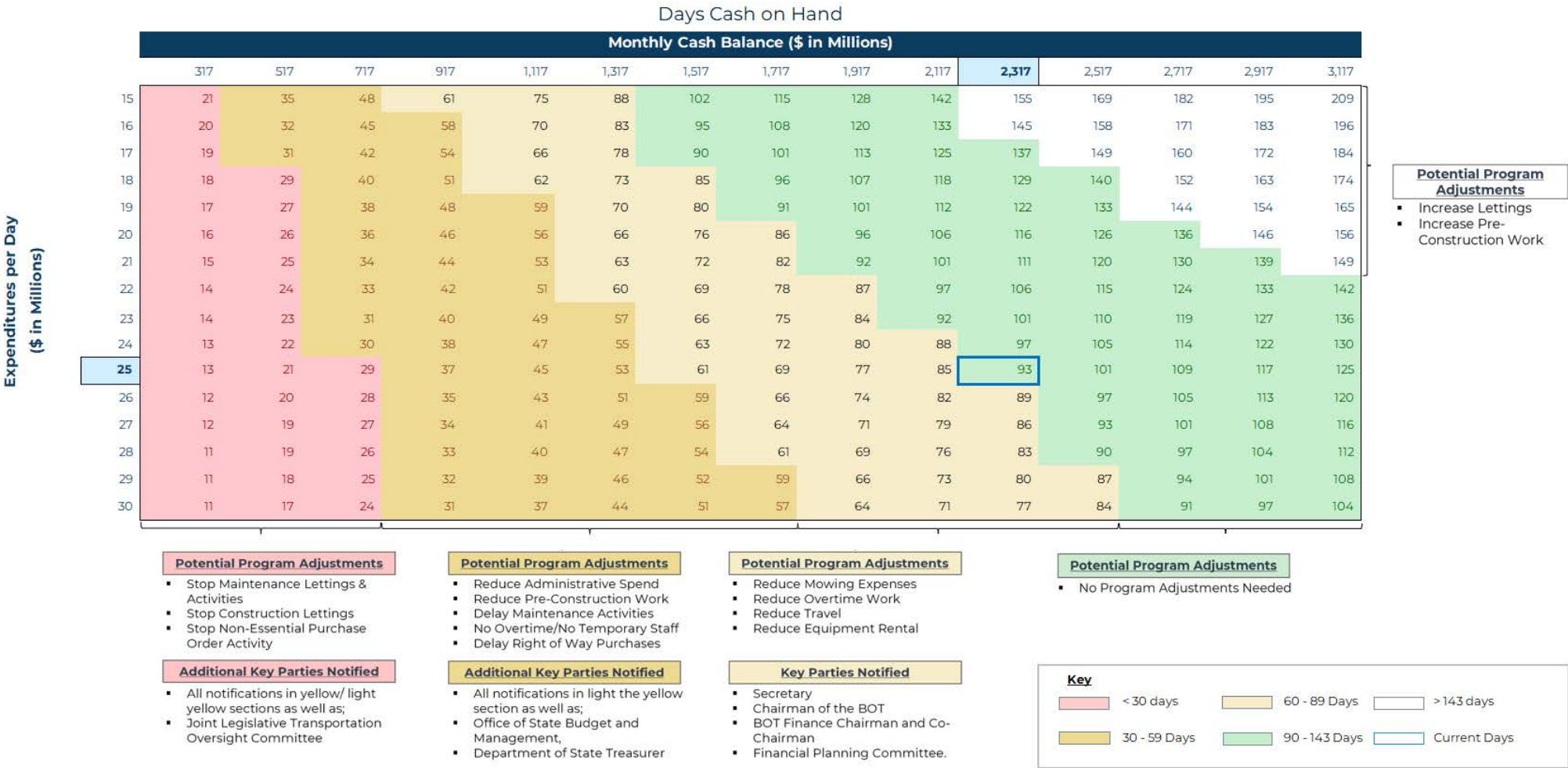

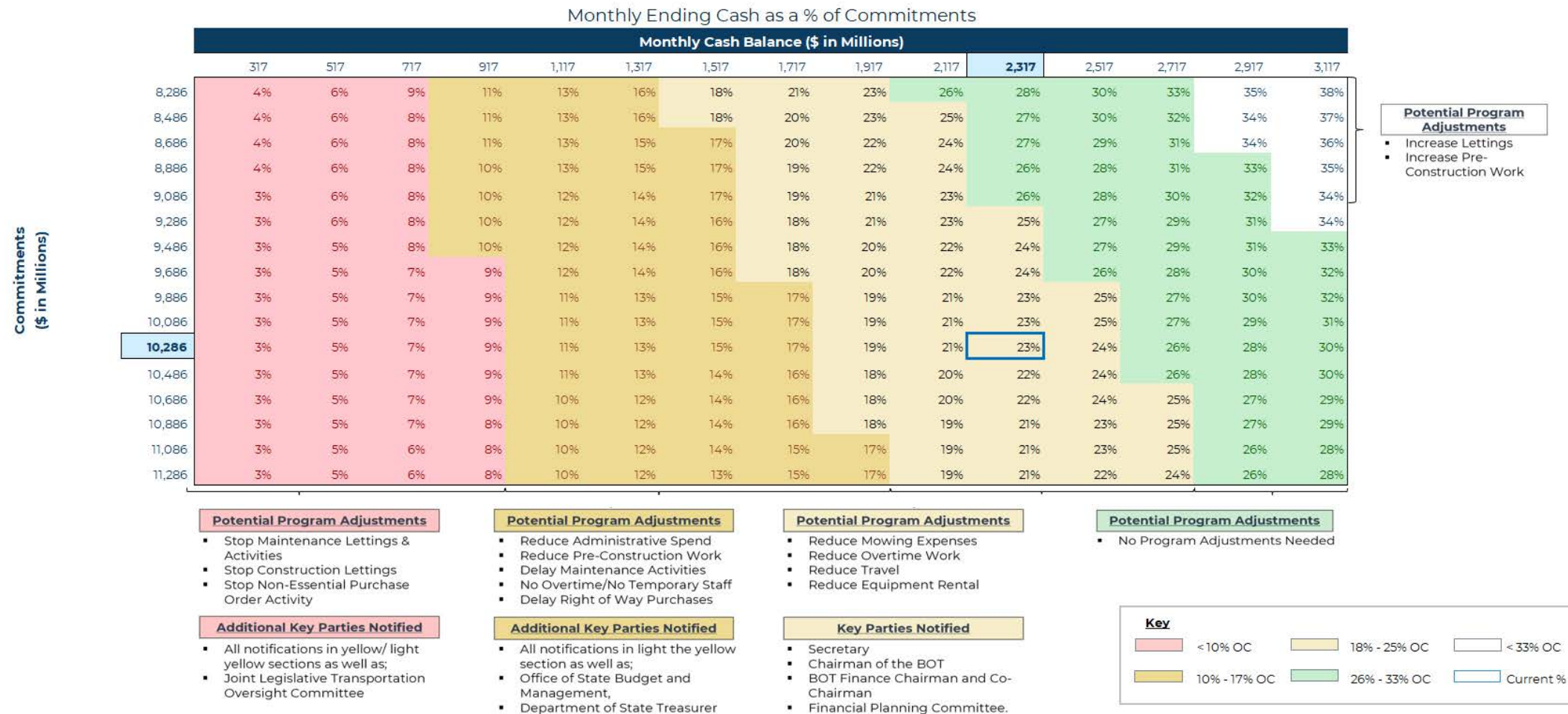

Monthly Ending Available Cash as a % of Commitments

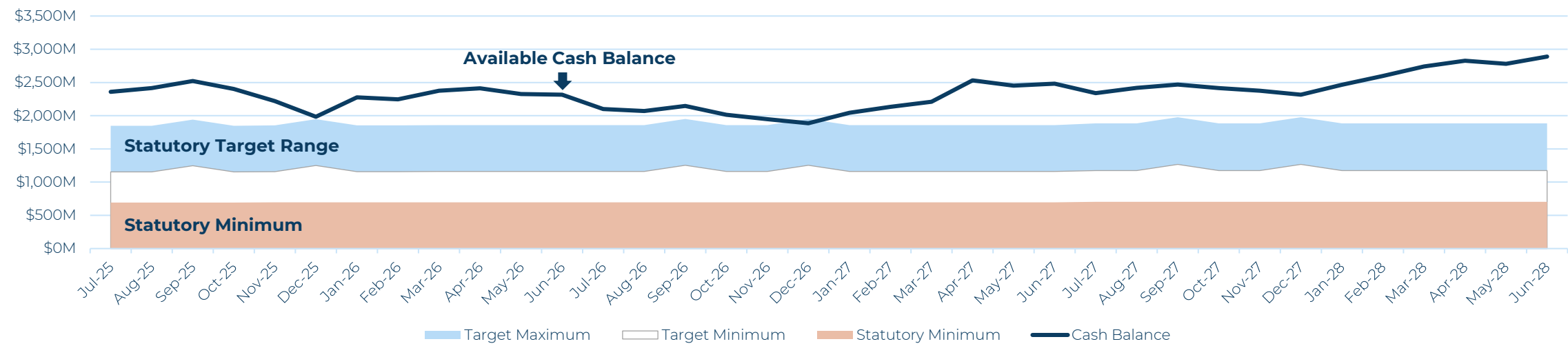

Annual Cash and Expenditure Levels

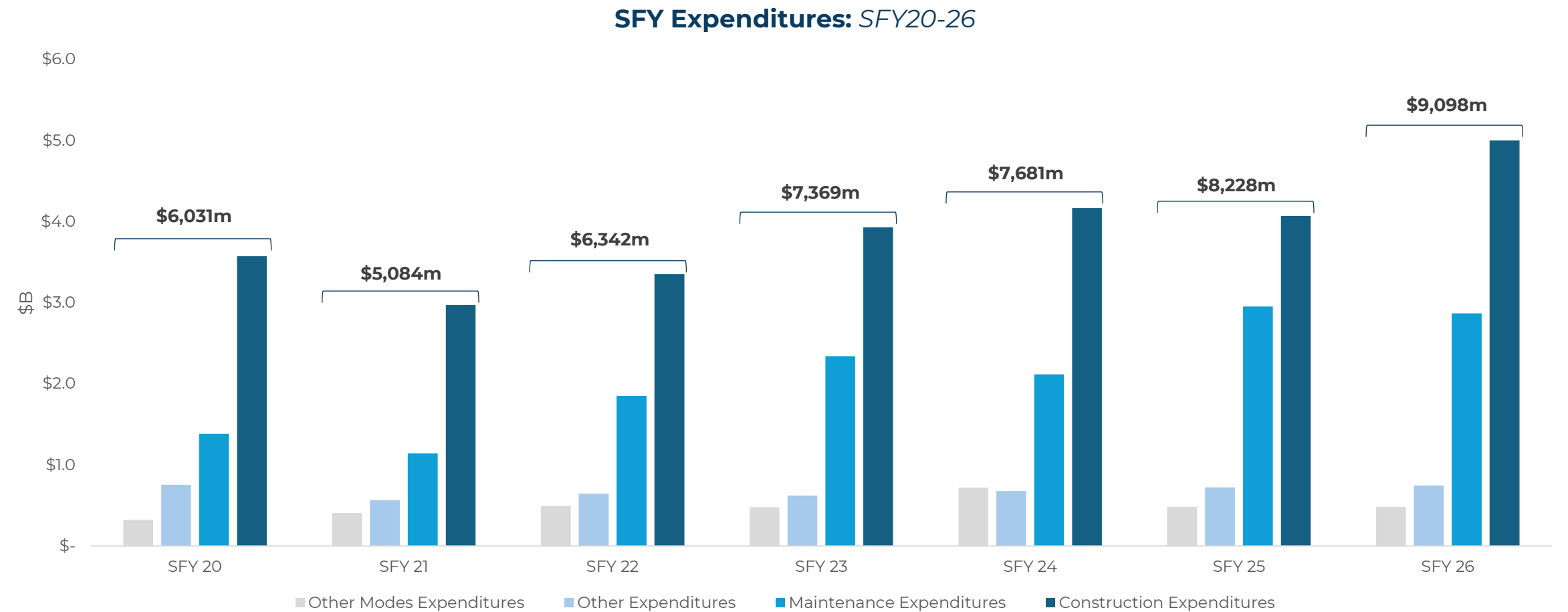
Historical: Ending Cash Balance

Expenditures have grown since SFY20, with SFY expenditures increasing from \$6,031M to \$9,098M in SFY26



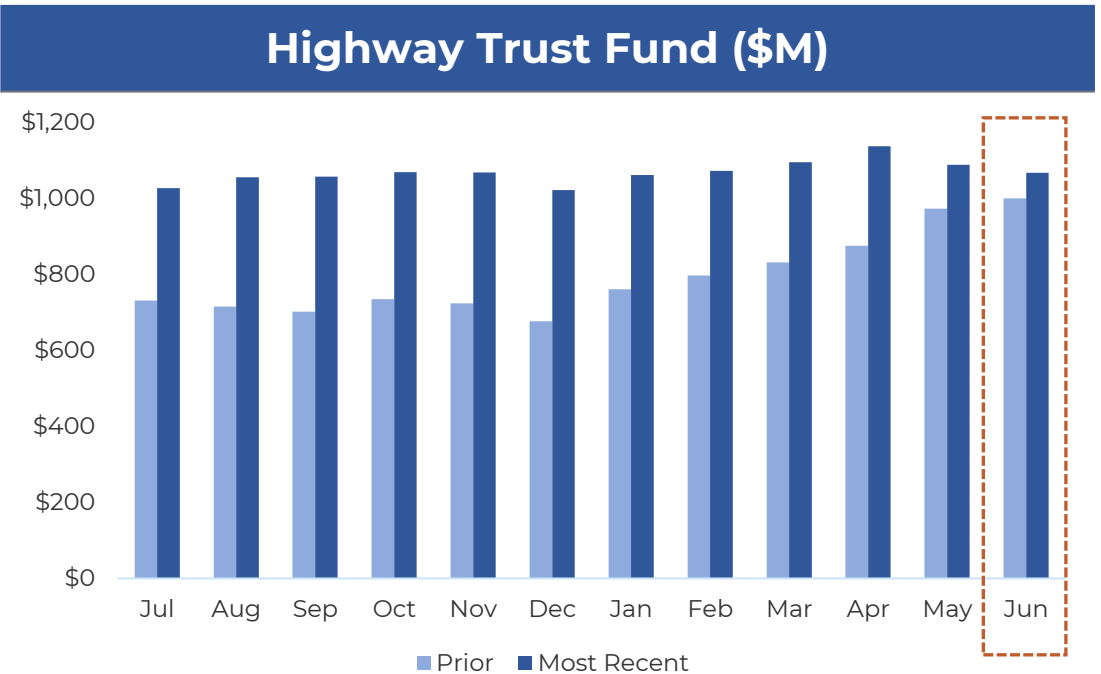
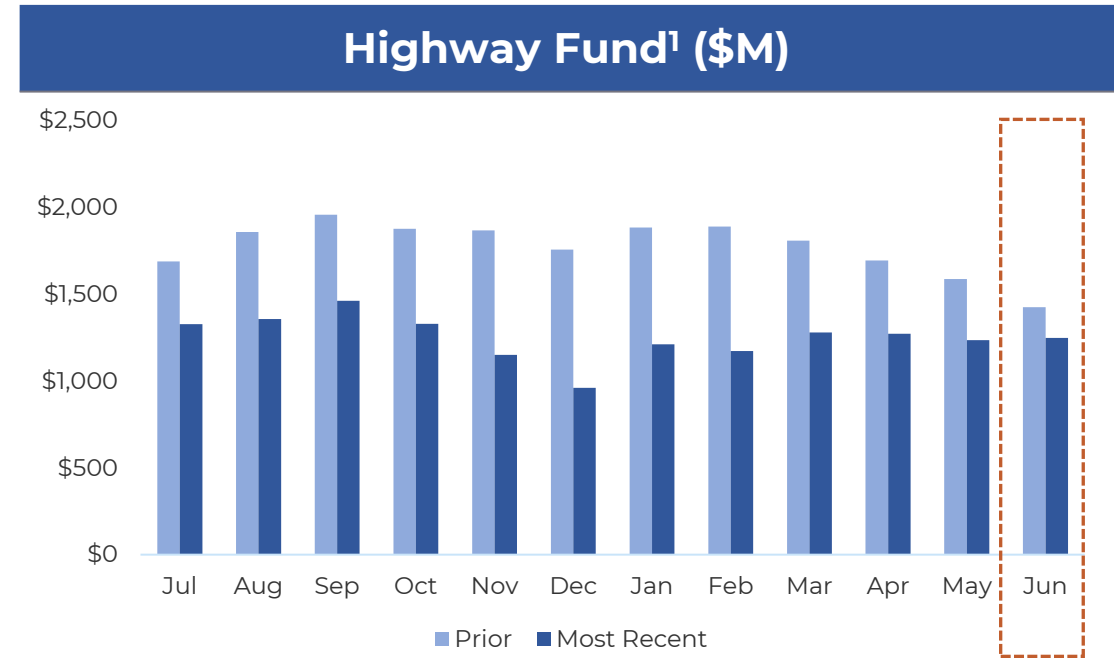

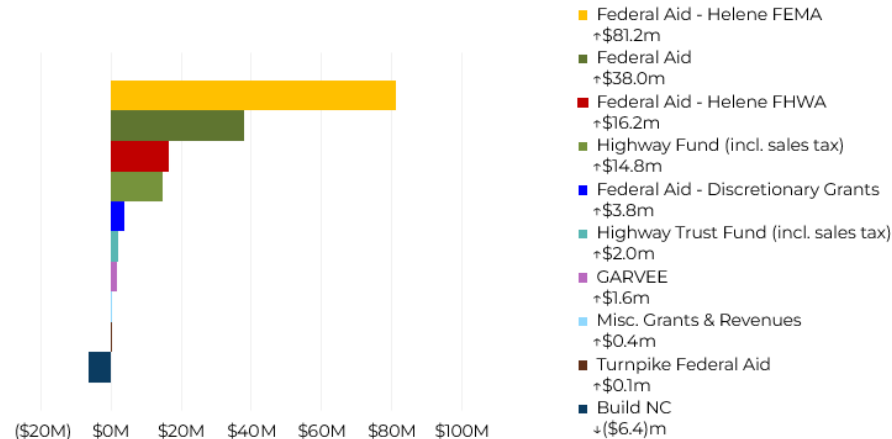

State Revenues by Source – Highway & Trust Fund – June 2026 (\$M)

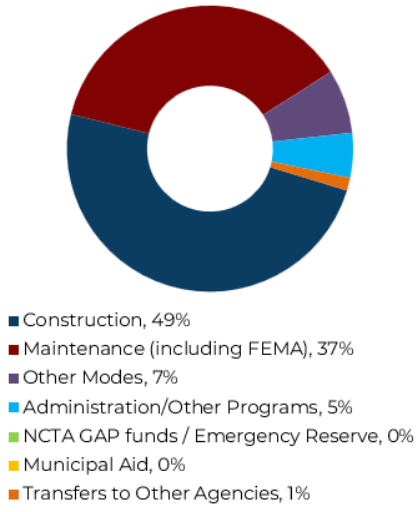


Overall Expenditures and Other Disbursements Actuals vs Forecast – Monthly (\$M)

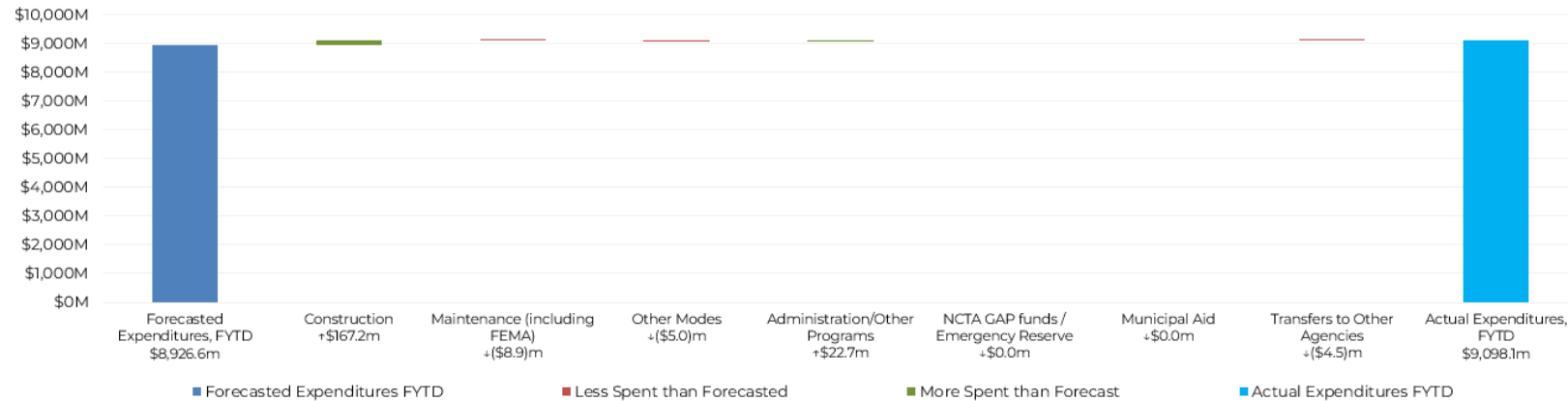

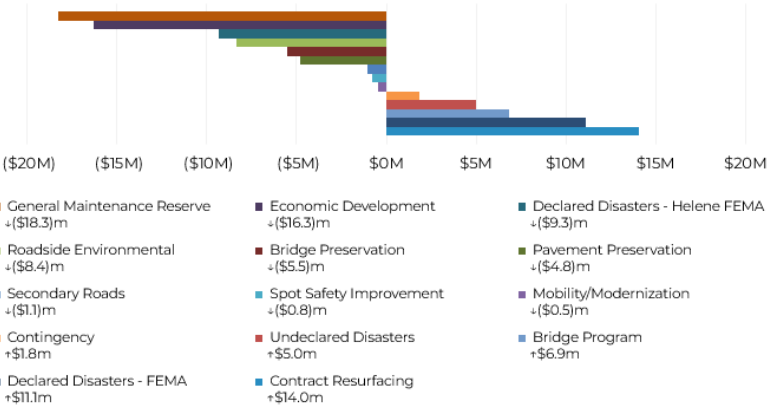
Maintenance Expenditures and Other Disbursements Actuals vs Forecast – Monthly (\$M)

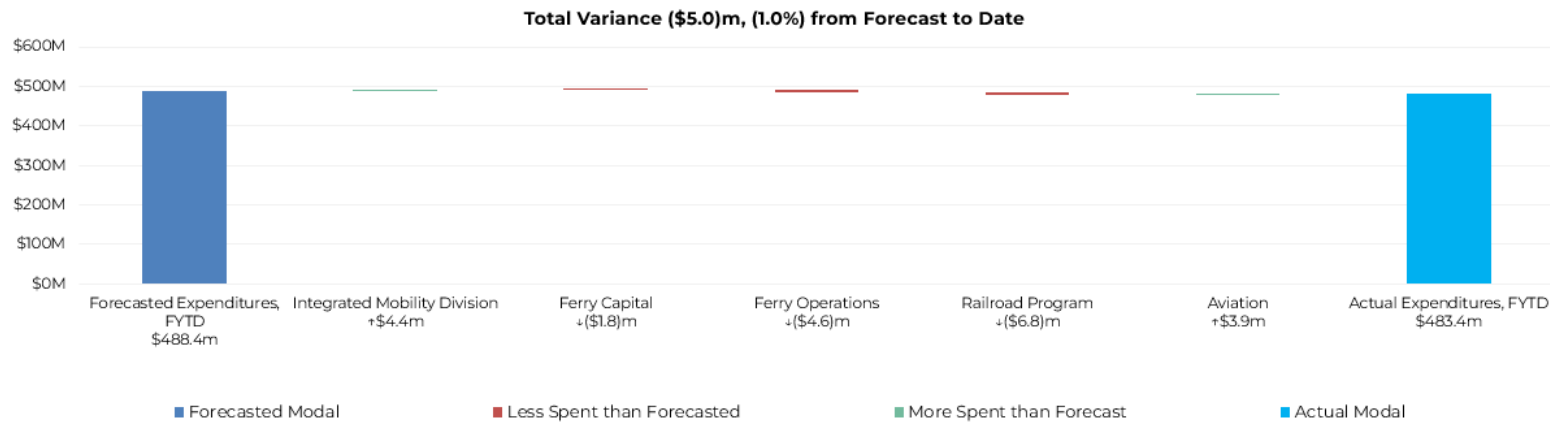

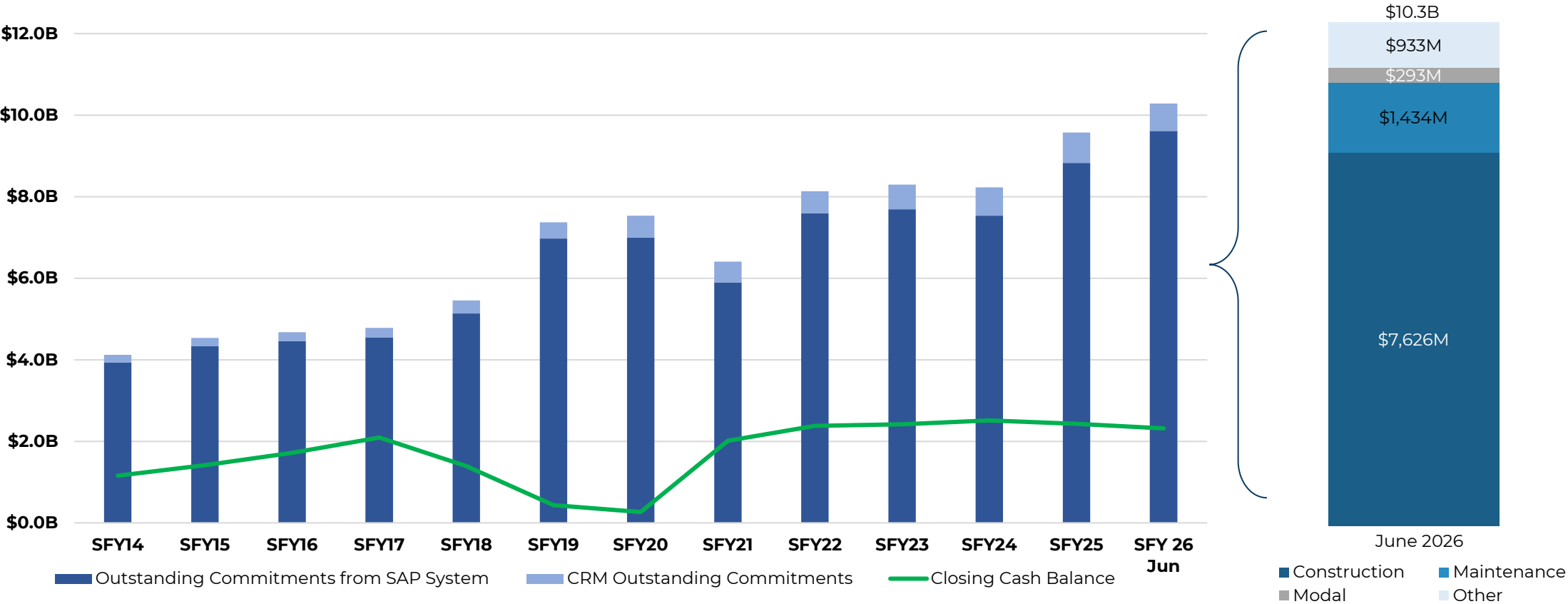

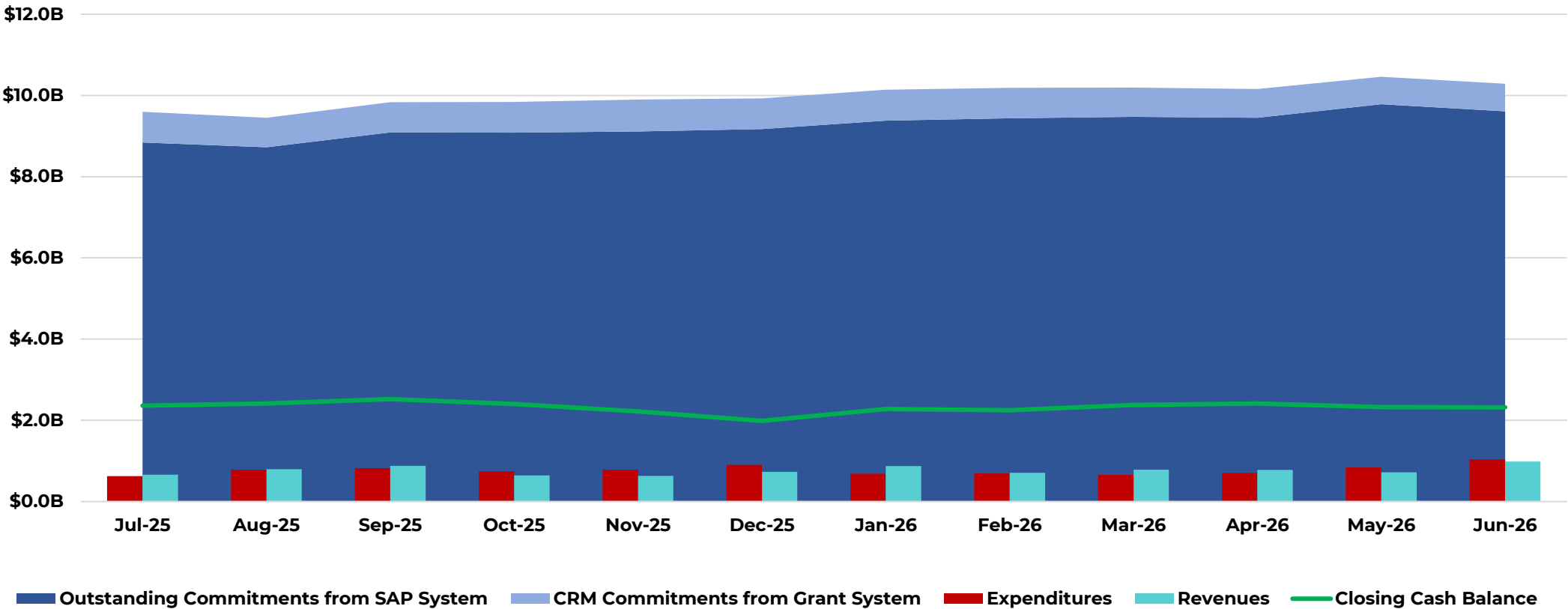
NCDOT Outstanding Commitments & Closing Available Cash Balances by State Fiscal Year



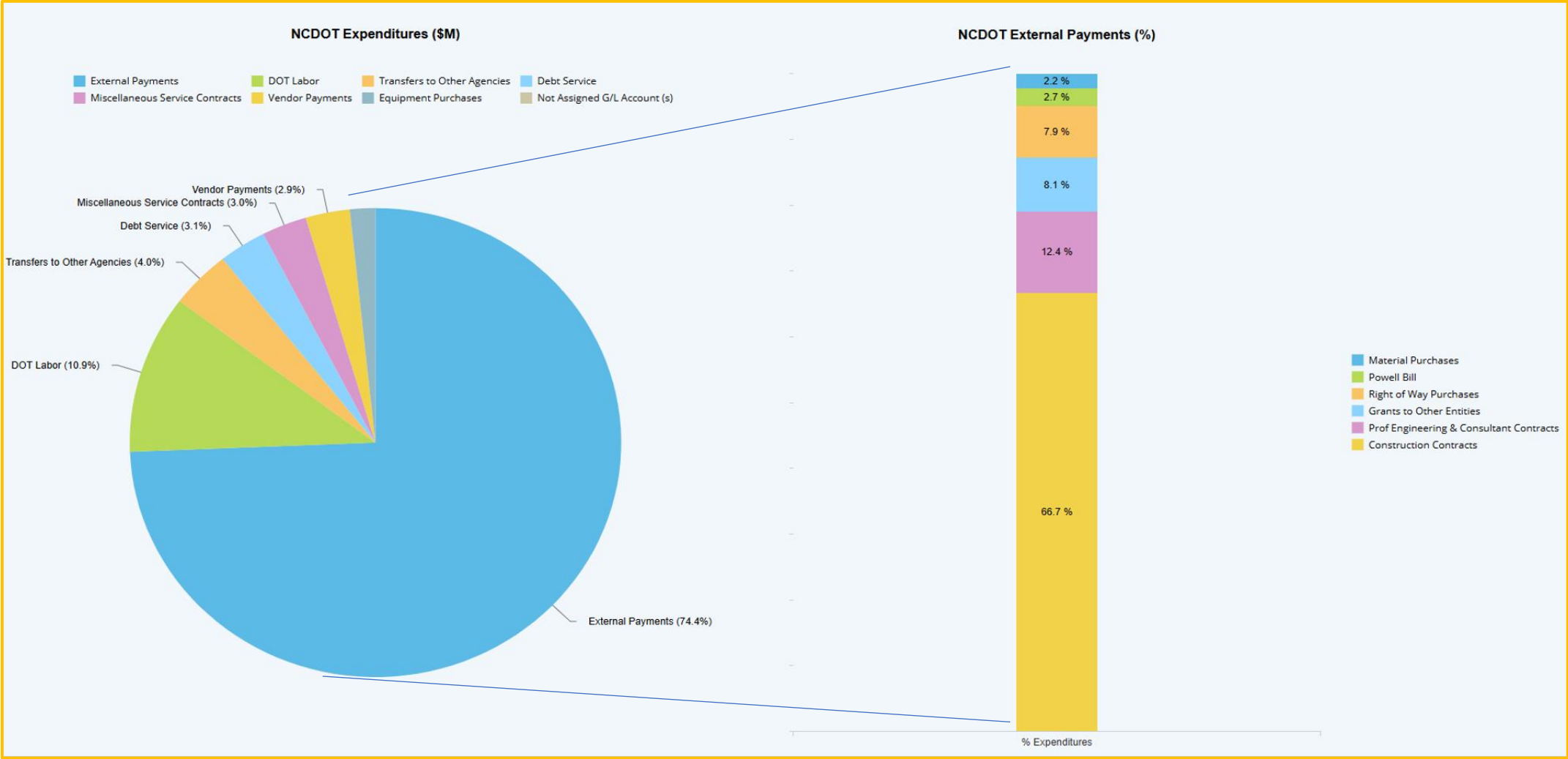

NCDOT Expenditures SFY2026 as of Jun 30, 2026



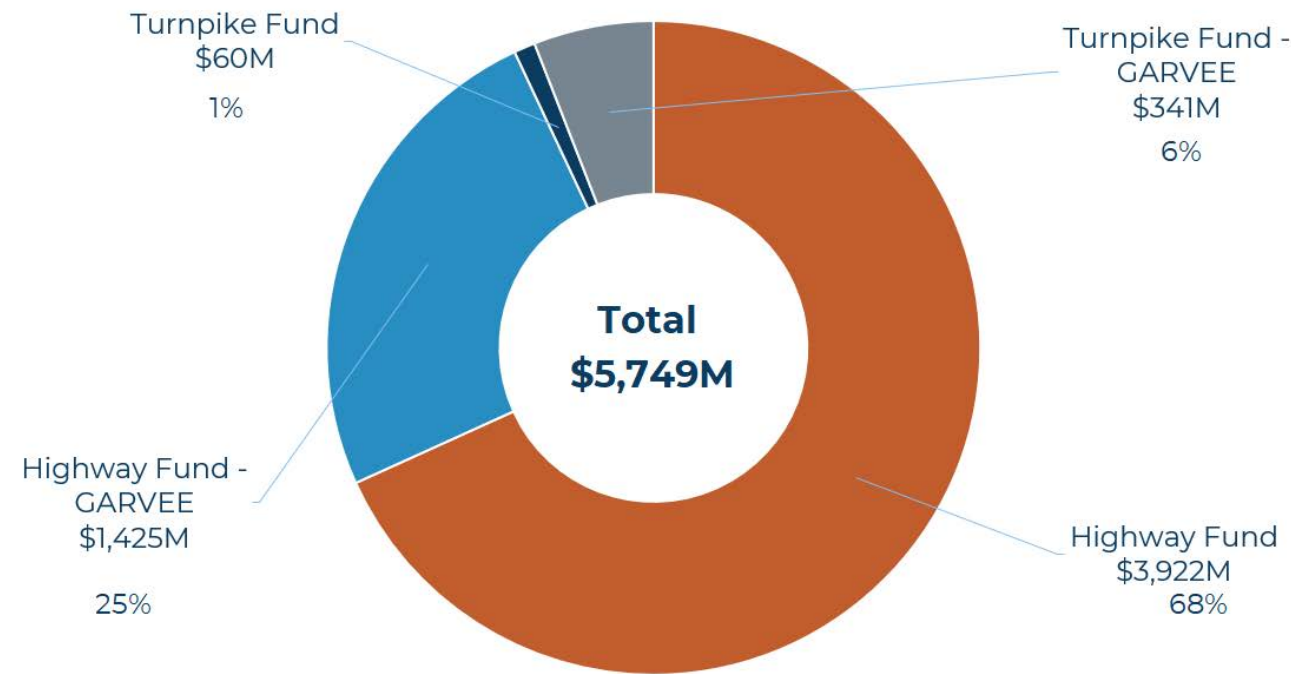

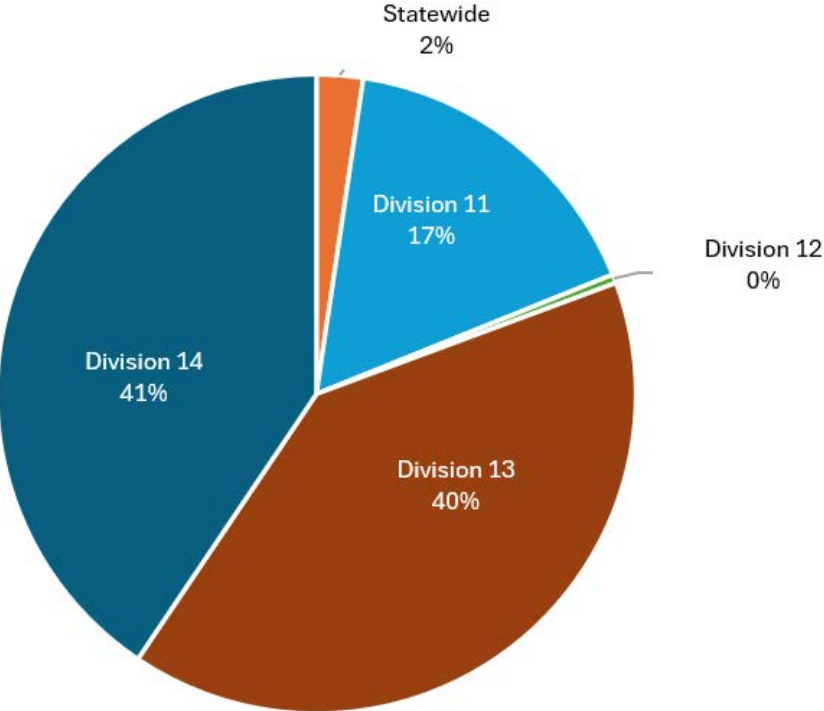

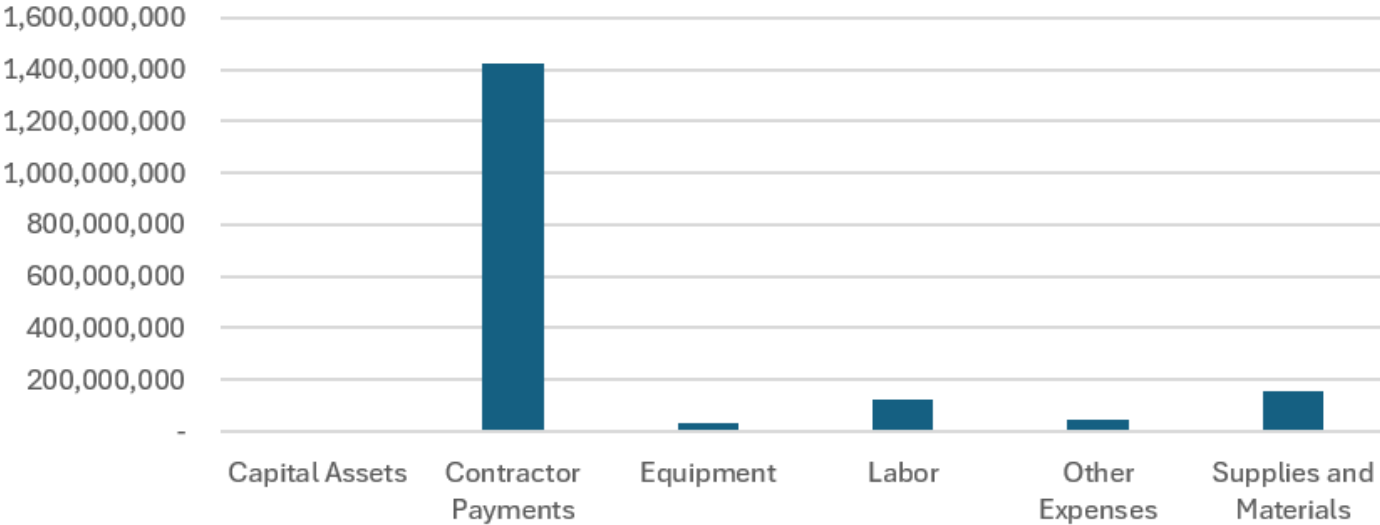

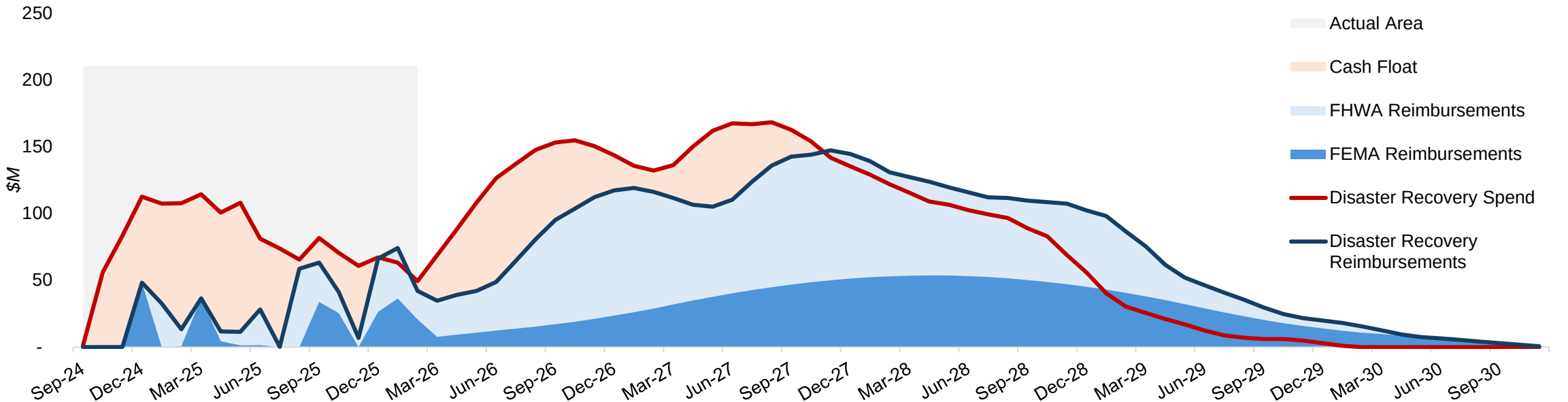

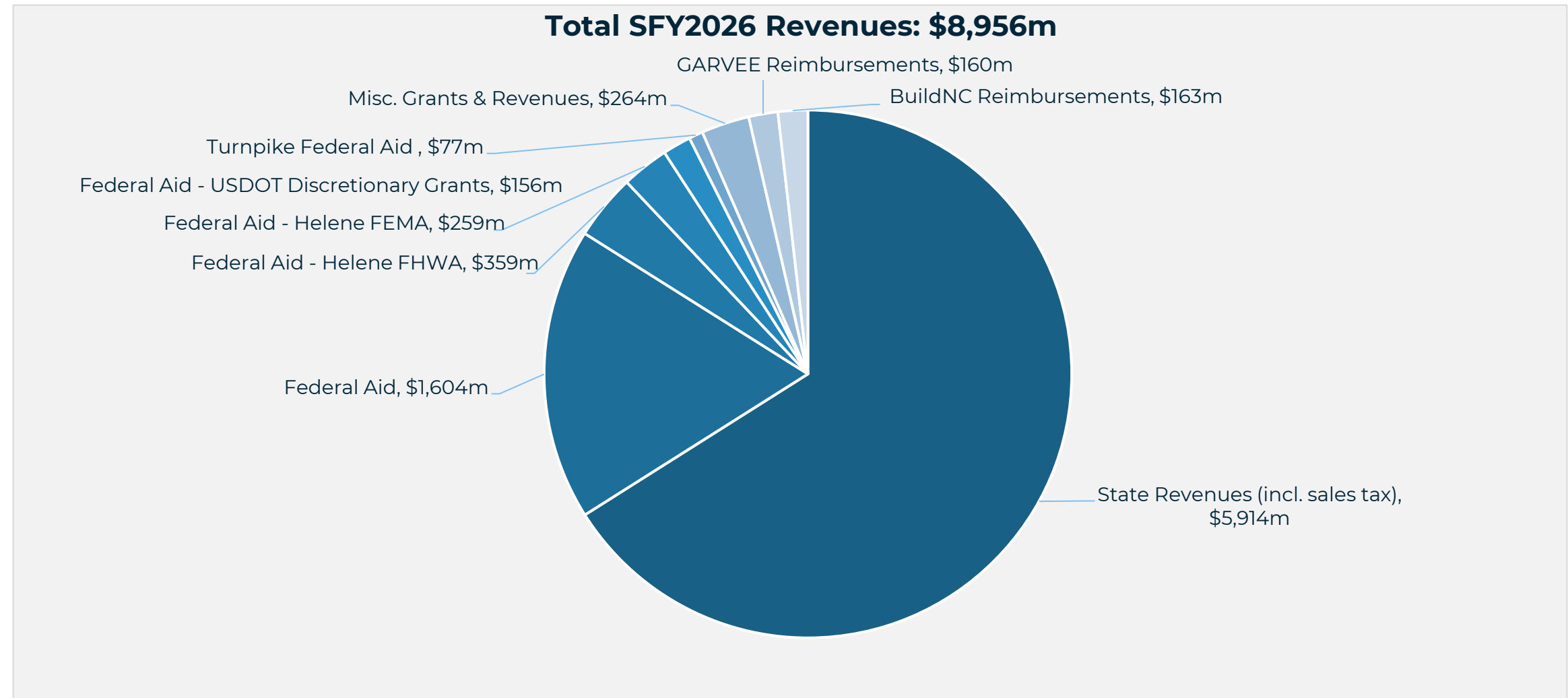

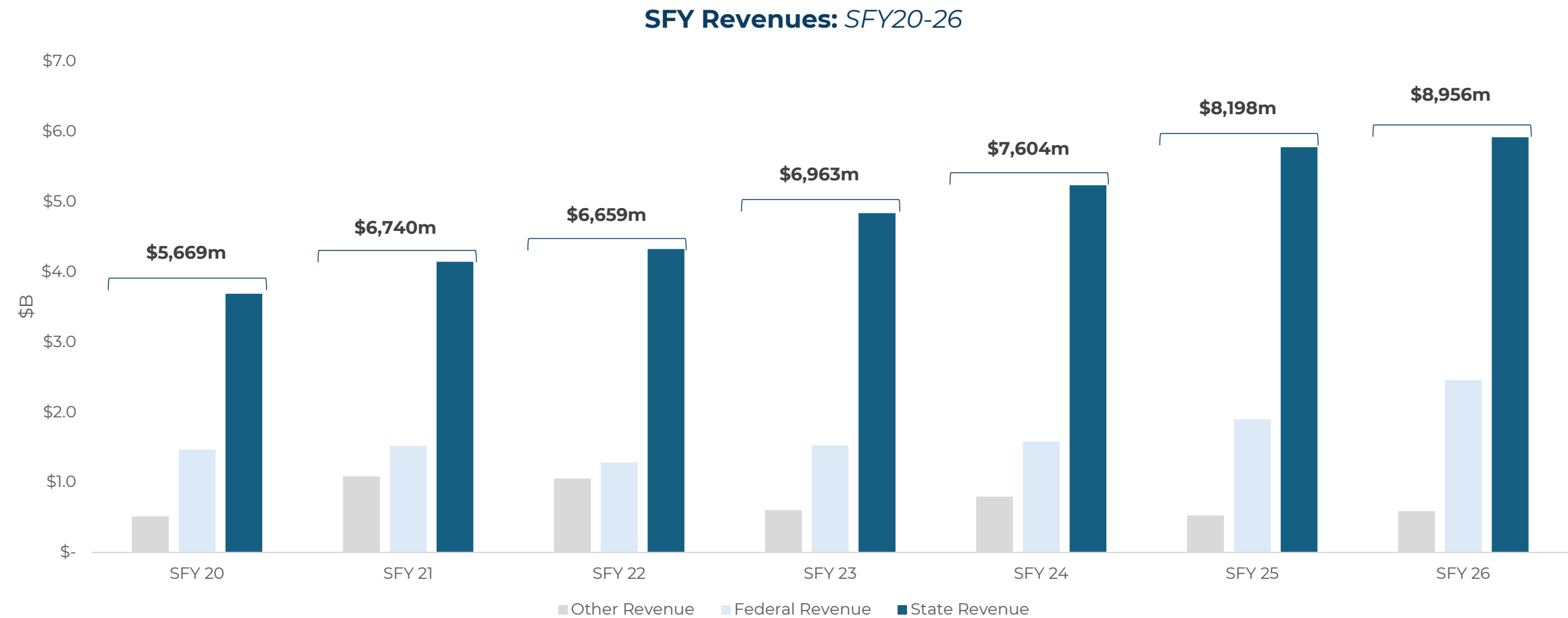

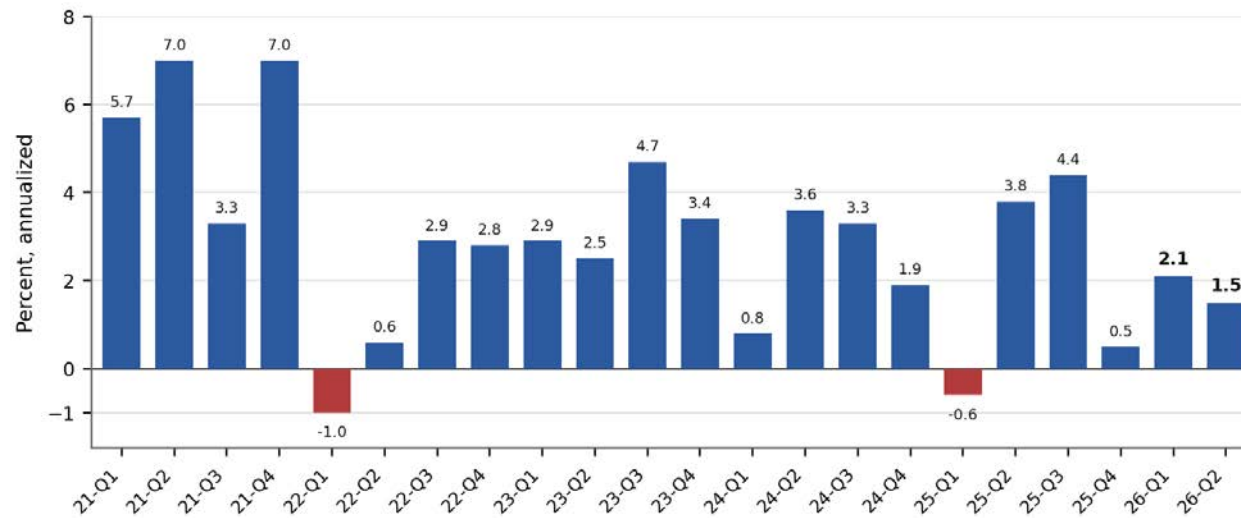

Slowing Growth, Cooling Labor, and Energy-Led Inflation

- **Steady Growth:** Q2 GDP grew 1.5% annualized (advance estimate, July 30), slowing from 2.1% in Q1 as government spending fell
- **Lower Hiring:** Unemployment 4.2%, but driven by people leaving the labor force
- **Consumers Spending:** Consumer spending accelerated. June retail sales rose a fifth straight month (+6.7% YoY) despite flat real wage growth
- **Inflation:** Consumer prices peaked in at +4.2% vs. a year ago in May and eased to +3.5% in June; the Fed's preferred PCE measure eased to 3.7
- **Interest Rates:** The Fed held rates at 3.50–3.75% on July 29 in a split 9–3 vote — three officials preferred a hike on oil-driven inflation risk.

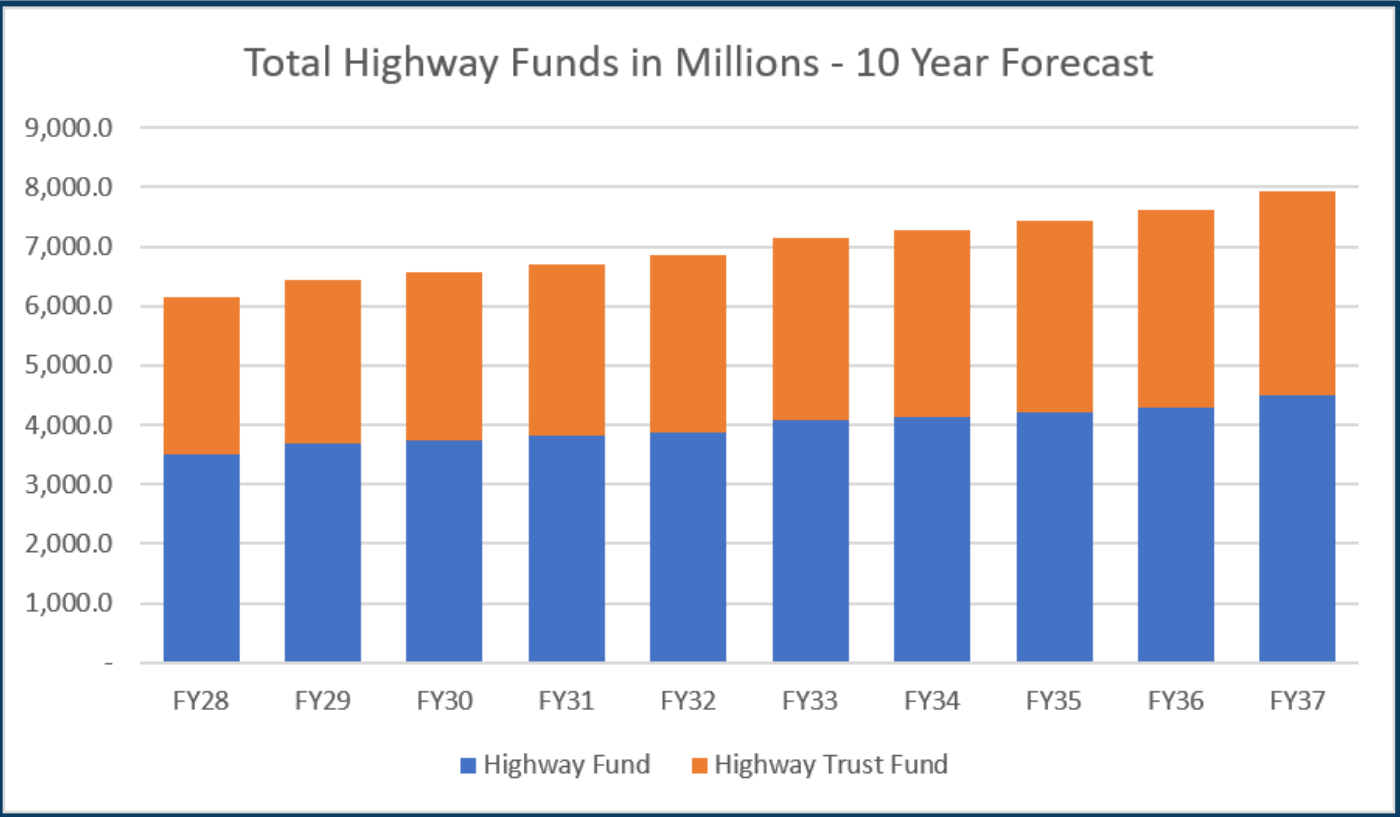

3. *UBO RELOCATION CONSTRUCTION OVERSIGHT*

A solution:

- Some NCDOT Divisions are identifying alternative methods to assign staff to oversee UbO work
- This has helped to ensure correct relocations and the opportunity to address issues related to field conditions
- The Department is exploring options for how to fund more UBO inspectors

DISCUSSION SUMMARY	Multimodal divisions continue advancing initiatives that improve connectivity and mobility across North Carolina. The Rail Division is preparing to launch the new Rail & Ride program in July 2026, providing seamless connections between NC By Train and local transit systems along the Raleigh–Charlotte corridor. Asheville’s restored intercity bus service has surpassed 10,000 riders since relaunching after Hurricane Helene, demonstrating strong demand for regional mobility options. The Division of Aviation continues expanding Advanced Air Mobility planning efforts with a second round of planning grants currently open. The Ferry Division also continues to generate strong engagement following the recent shipyard tour and board vote, with Transportation Committee legislators expressing significant interest in participating in similar tours later this summer.
4. Presentation- - Railroad Engineering and Development – Jason Orthner, Rail Division Director	
DISCUSSION SUMMARY	The presentation provided an overview of the North Carolina Department of Transportation Rail Division’s Railroad Engineering and Development program and its role in planning, designing, constructing, and operating rail infrastructure across the state. The presentation highlighted the division’s management of more than 170 rail projects through 2035, including grade separations, safety enhancements, track improvements, and station developments. It explained key railroad engineering principles, advanced technologies such as Positive Train Control, and innovative track designs that improve safety, reliability, and passenger experience. Several major projects are showcased, including the Charlotte Junction Wye, the Piedmont Atlantic Intermodal Rail System (PAIRS), and the Wilmington Beltline improvements, all aimed at improving freight movement and rail safety. The presentation also emphasized North Carolina’s investment in future passenger rail expansion through the S-Line corridor, Raleigh Union Station improvements, and proposed intercity rail routes, positioning the state to develop one of the most advanced and connected rail networks in the Southeast while supporting economic growth, mobility, and freight efficiency.

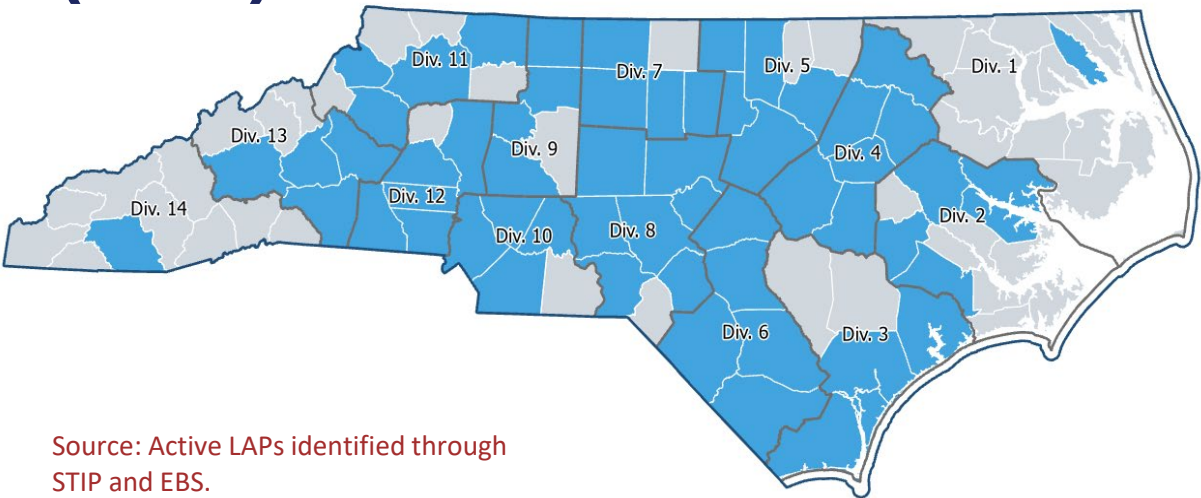

A locally administered project is a transportation project for which a local government agency (LGA) serves as the delivery sponsor and manages some or all phases, including design, right-of-way, construction, and closeout. NCDOT provides oversight, required approvals, and stewardship to ensure compliance with all applicable federal and state requirements.

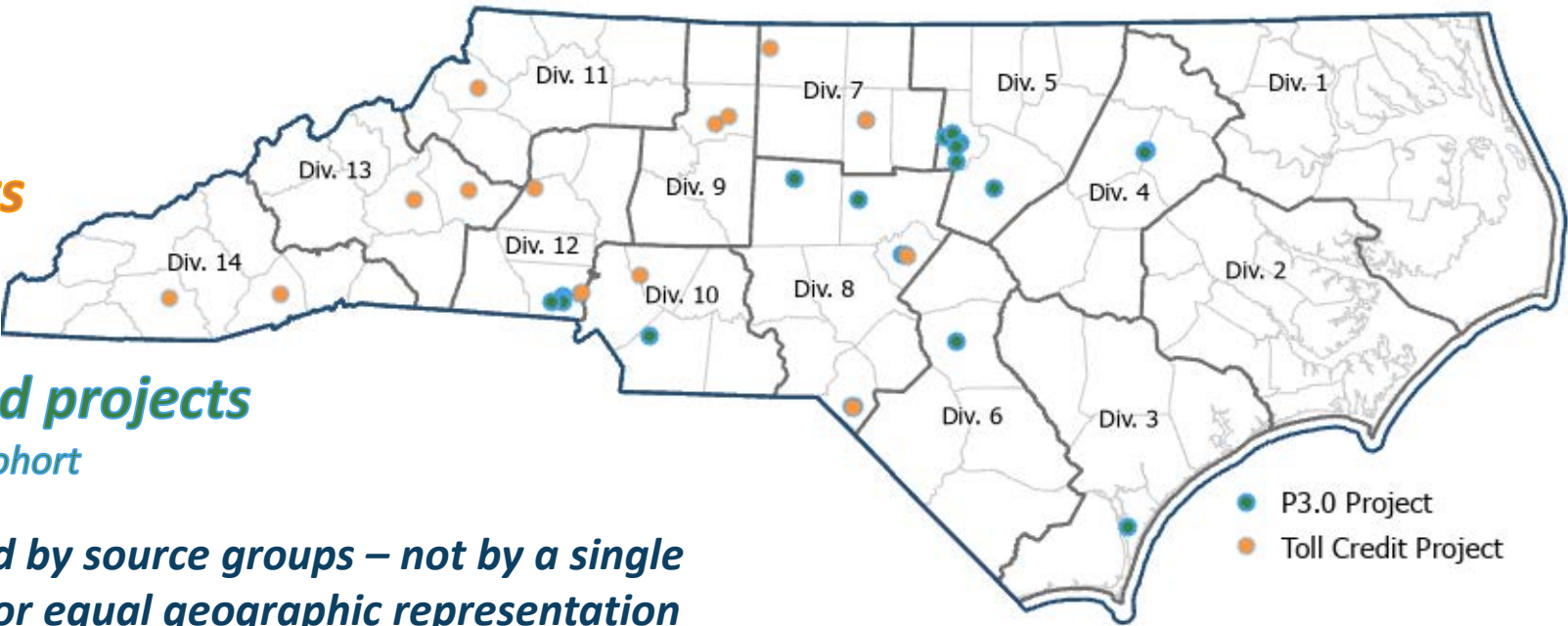

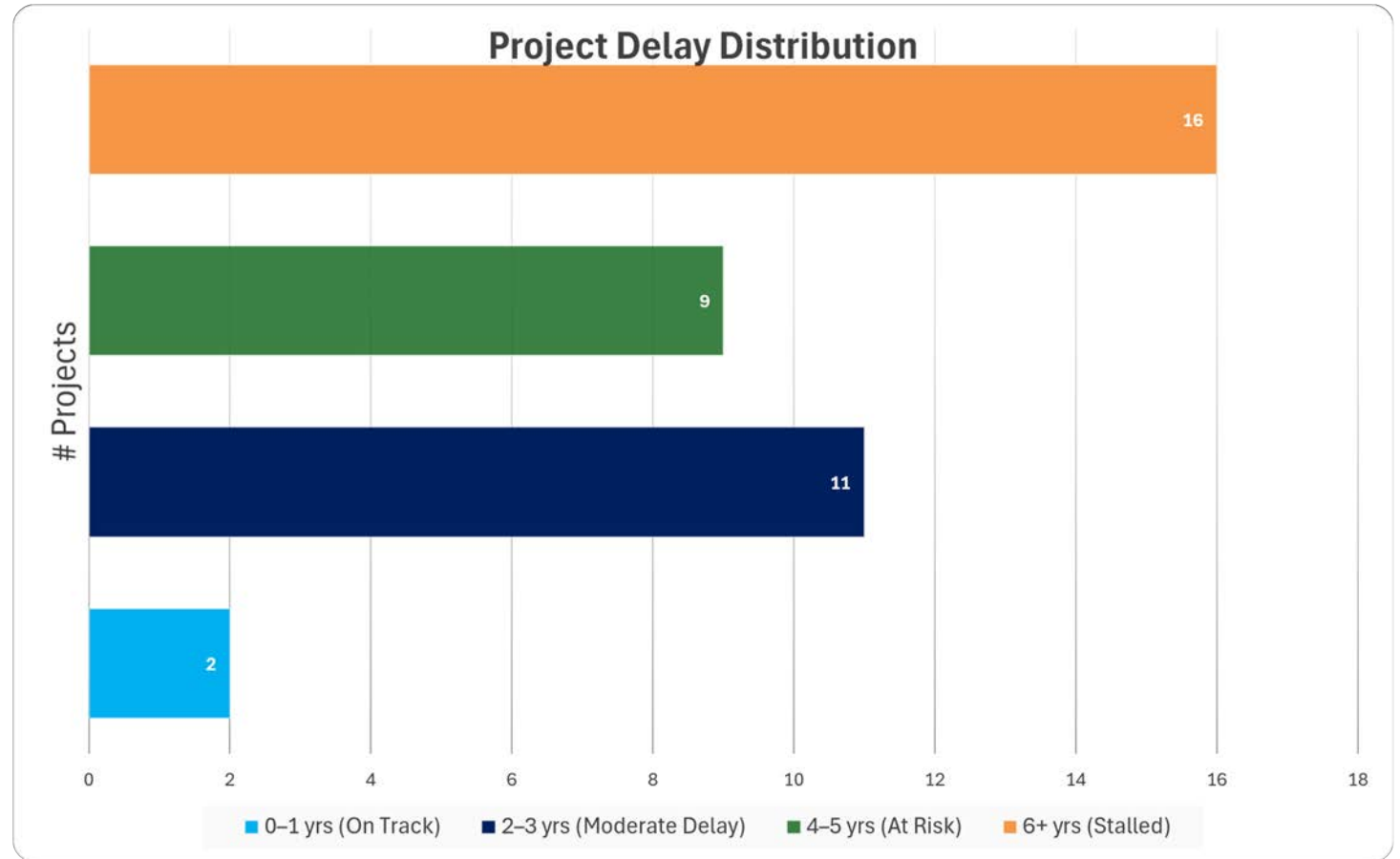

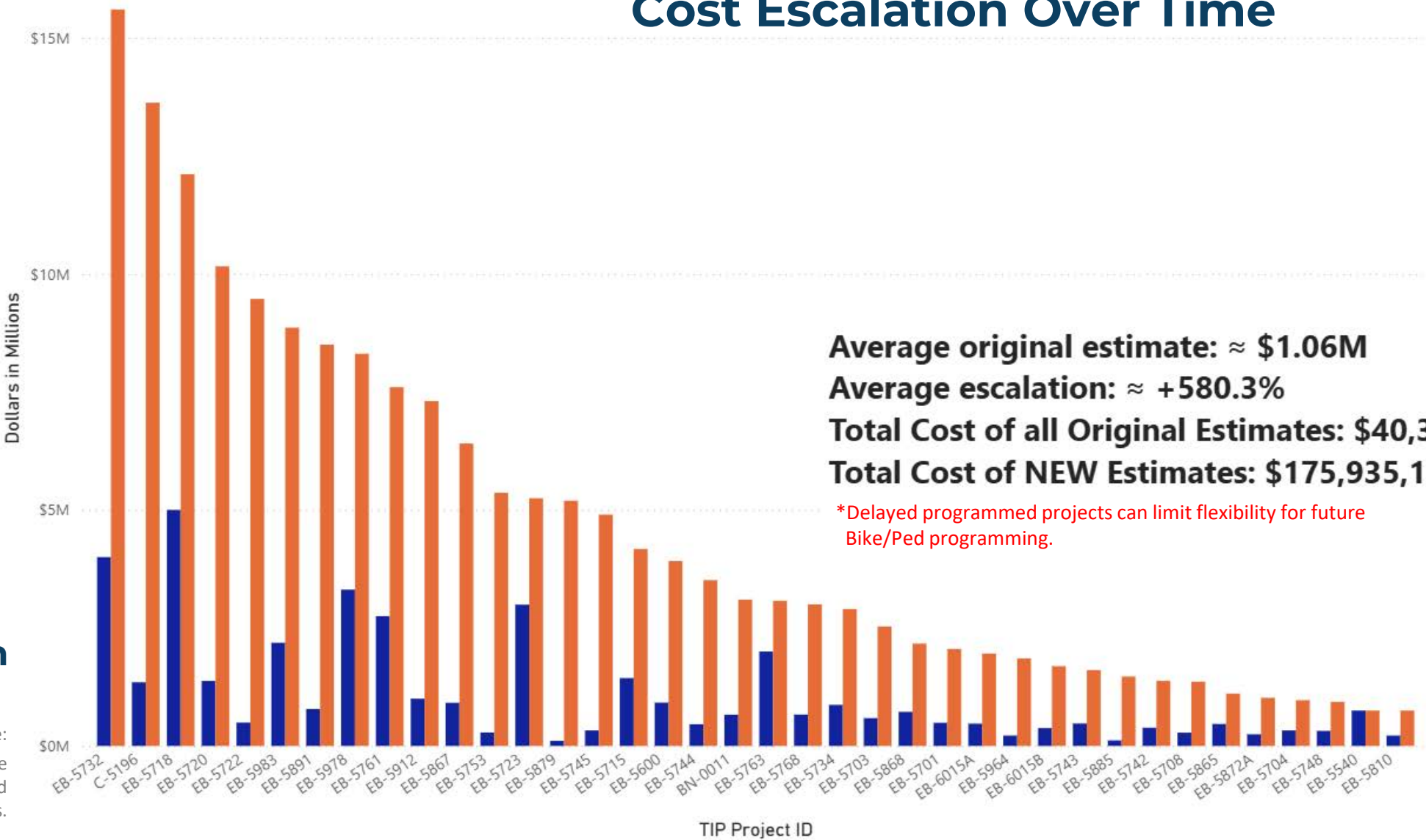

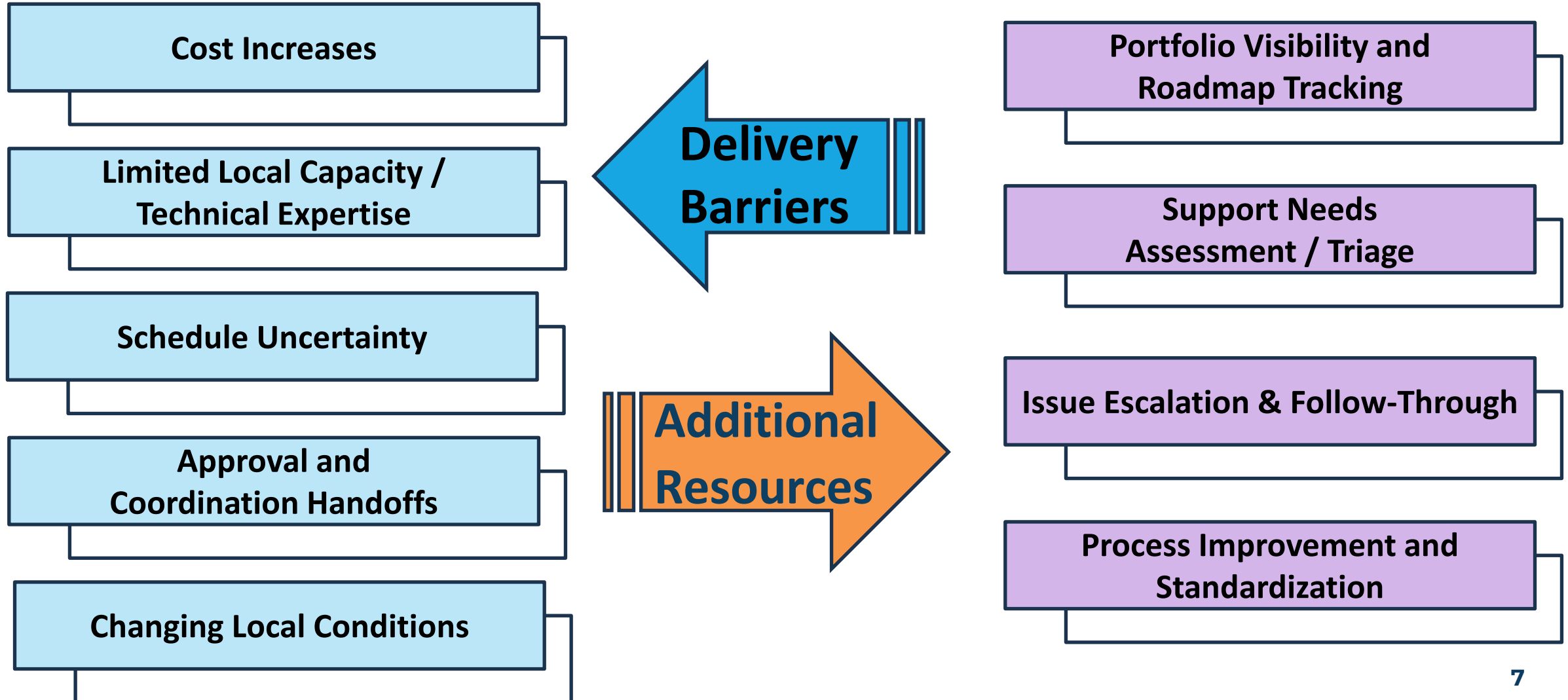

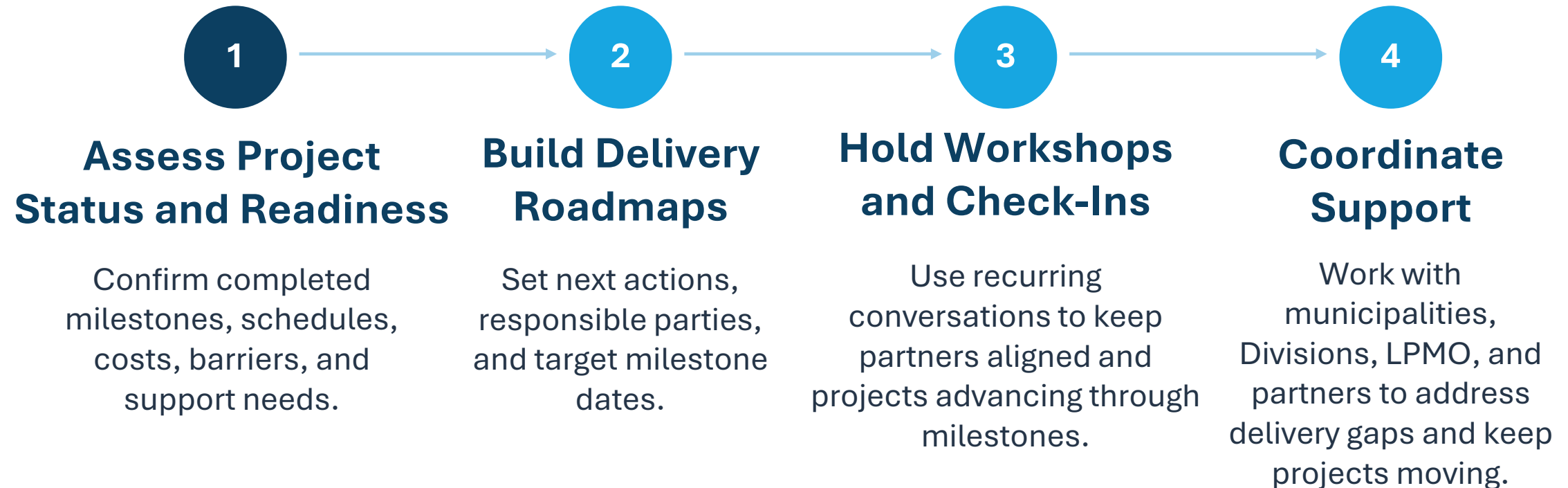

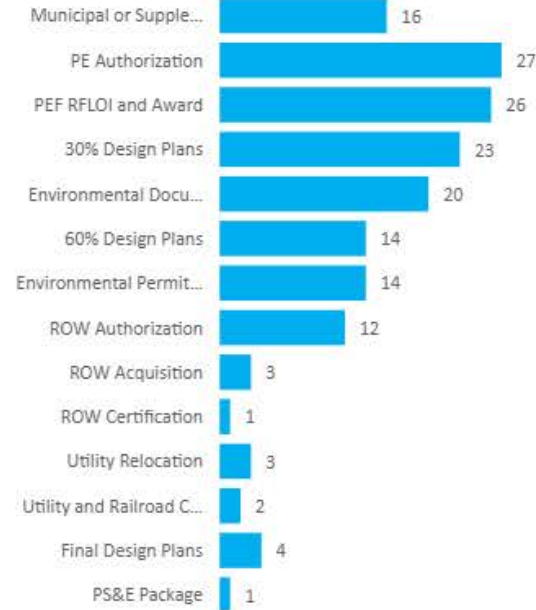

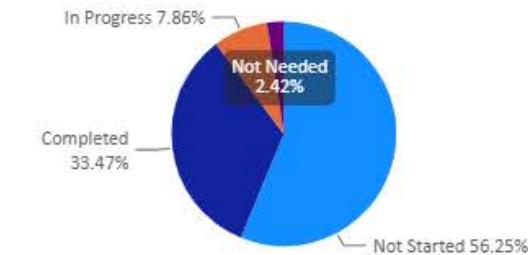

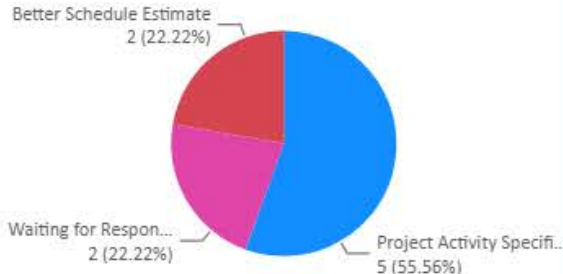
Project Milestone Progress

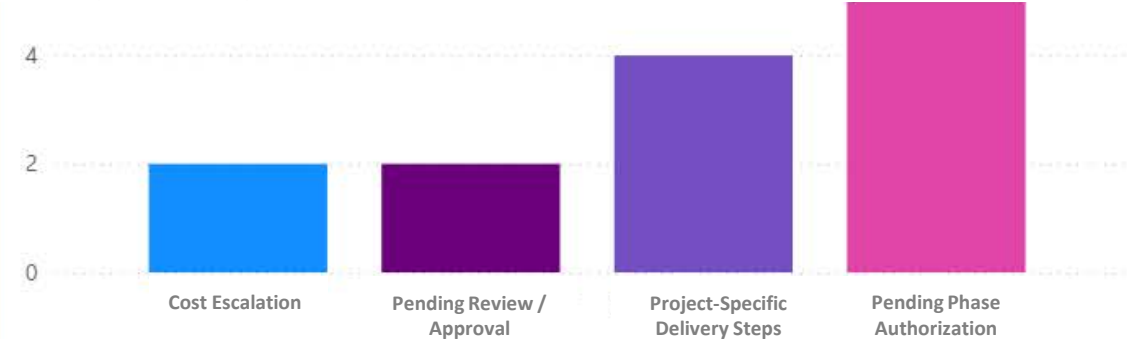

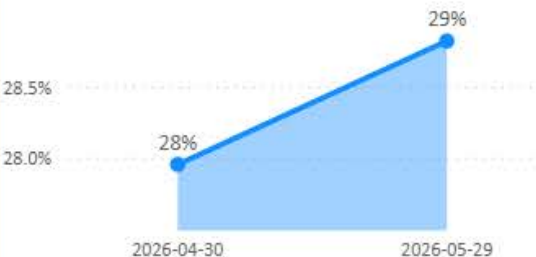

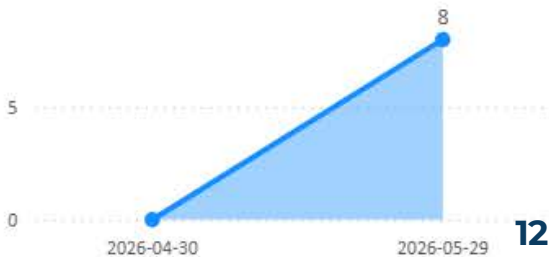

Average Project Progress Changes (Monthly)



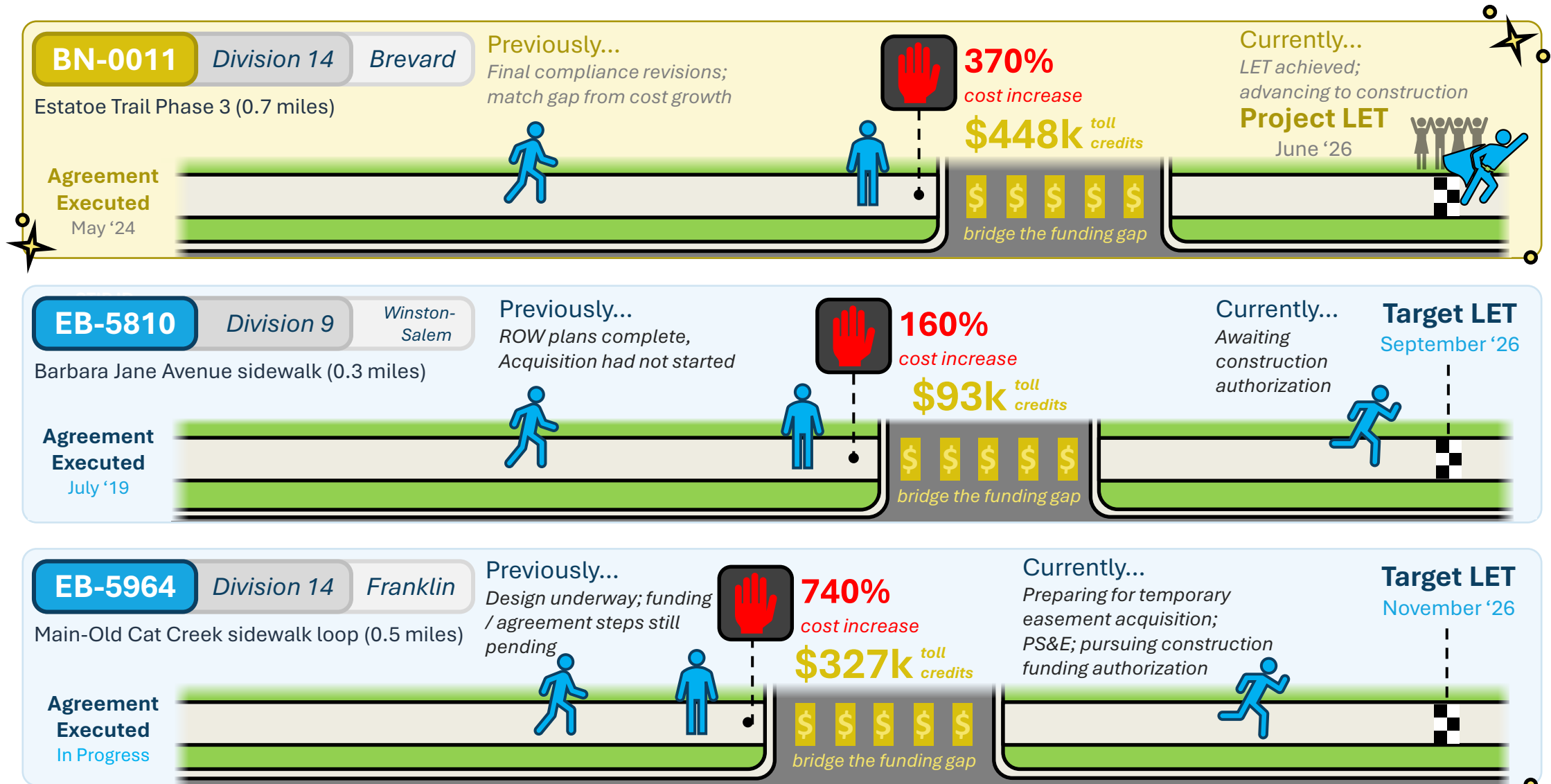

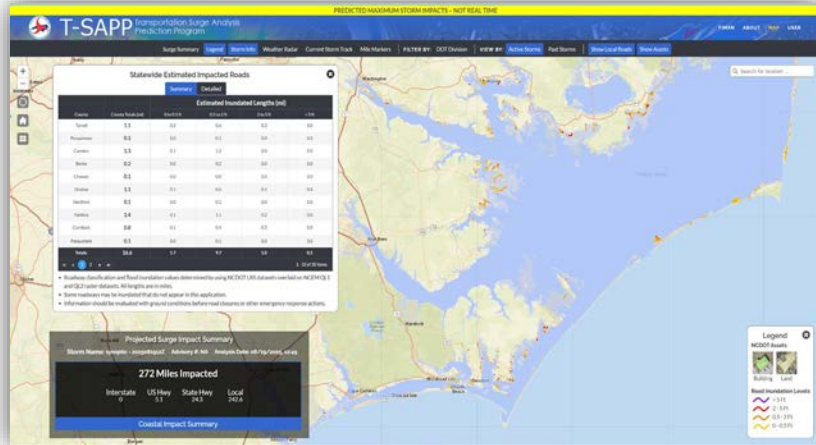


- The National Weather Service's Weather-Ready Nation initiative seeks to build a more resilient nation by improving how communities prepare for, respond to, and recover from high-impact weather, water, and climate events.
- As weather threats become more complex and impactful, the NWS is strengthening partnerships with emergency management, public safety, transportation, utilities, and other critical decision-makers.
- A key evolution of the initiative is embedding NWS meteorologists alongside core partner agencies to provide direct, real-time weather interpretation and decision support. This face-to-face ("eye-to-eye") engagement allows meteorologists to translate forecast uncertainty, impacts, and timing into actionable information *tailored to an agency's specific operational needs*.
- Starting this summer, the NWS Raleigh and NCDOT are piloting this initiative by having an NWS Raleigh meteorologist embed with NCDOT at the STOC before, during, and after all statewide high-impact weather events. In addition, NWS personnel will embed with NCDOT on a routine basis even on blue sky days to work with NCDOT on various weather-related collaborative projects.



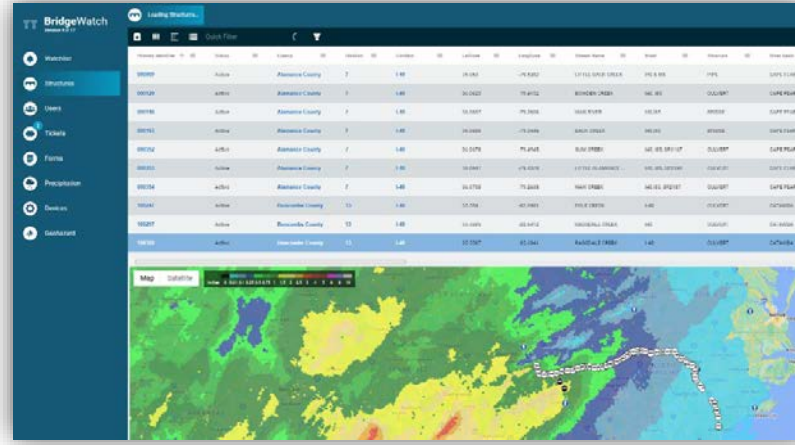

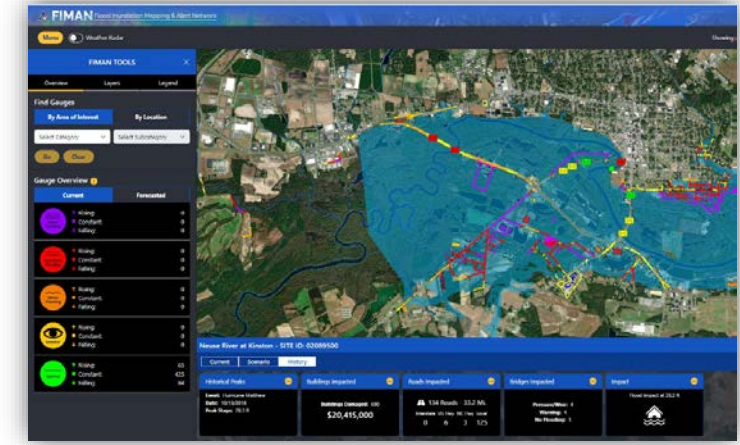

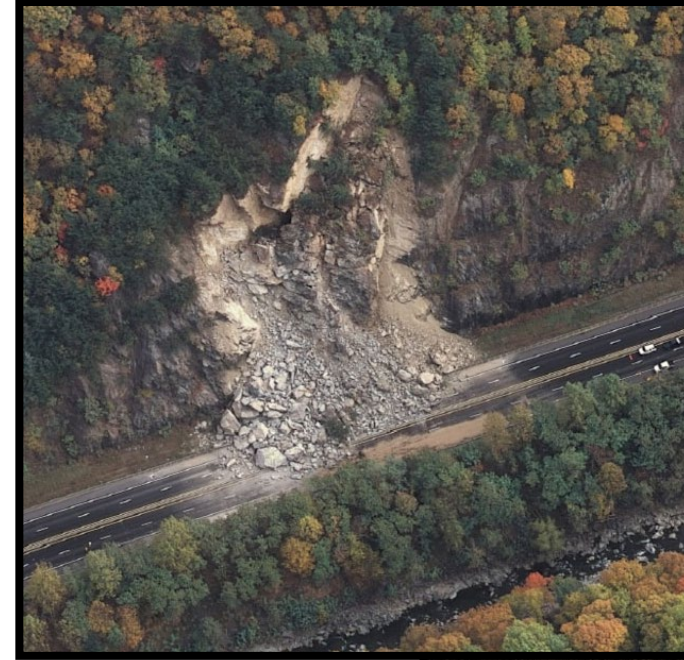

Building Resilience Every Day

Preparedness is not a seasonal activity, it is an ongoing responsibility.

Our annual exercises, severe weather planning, vessel staging strategies, interagency coordination, and recovery procedures are designed to ensure we can:

- Protect employees and assets
- Minimize service disruptions
- Recover quickly after weather events
- Continue serving communities that rely on ferry transportation



Ferry Division Severe Weather Plan

Plan Purpose

- Provides structured guidance for hurricanes, nor'easters, and winter weather events
- Establishes clear authority, alert levels, and emergency governance
- Supports evacuation operations, asset protection, and service restoration
- Updated on a regular basis to provide accurate and complete guidance

What the Plan Covers

- Alert conditions and escalation triggers
- Defined chain of command (Primary & Secondary Control)
- Pre-storm preparation procedures
- Emergency operations mode and evacuation protocols
- Vessel dispersal and staging
- Post-storm recovery and reporting requirements
- Financial tracking and reimbursement documentation

Ferry Division Pre-Storm Activities

- Monitor storm forecasts and activate appropriate alert level.
- Establish command and communication structure.
 - Includes establishing conference call schedule with units, NOAA, and NCEM
- Participate in NCDOT agency wide calls.
- Secure vessels, facilities, ramps, equipment, and records.
- Top off fuel and essential supplies.
- Coordinate with Emergency Management, USCG, counties, and NCDOT leadership.
- Adjust or suspend schedules as necessary and transition to emergency operations mode if evacuation is ordered.
- Document pre-storm conditions (photos, status reports).
- Remind team to prepare their homes and families so they can focus on post storm work.

NCDOT Ferry Division - Severe Weather Pre & Post Pictures

Pre storm photos of each terminals buildings, grounds, assets, etc. prior to storm events to document future damage. Pre storm photos of vessels secured with mooring lines are also required from operations and the Marine Maintenance Unit. If damages occur, this same form will be used to submit photos. Repair requests should continue to be submitted through the Facility Maintenance request page. If cell or internet service is out, please revert back to utilizing email for submission.

Ferry Division Post-Storm Activities

- Account for personnel and assess immediate safety conditions.
- Conduct vessel and facility damage assessments with documentation.
- Coordinate USCG channel test runs and obtain authorization through Division Engineer and USCG to resume service.
- Compile damage reports, expense tracking, and reimbursement documentation. Monitoring of released storm numbers also occurs during Pre-Storm activities. (FEMA/FHWA if applicable).
- Implement recovery plan and safely restore service.
 - This may include establishing emergency route access if NCHWY12 is closed for an extended period of time.

Ocracoke Island Recovery: Restoring a Community's Lifeline

The Ferry Division is Ocracoke's only public year-round connection to the mainland.

When NC 12 is closed by overwash, flooding, or storm damage, that role becomes even more critical.

Following major weather events, the Ferry Division works closely with:

- Hyde and Dare County Emergency Management
- NCEM
- NCDOT Divisions
- Emergency Response Agencies & Volunteers

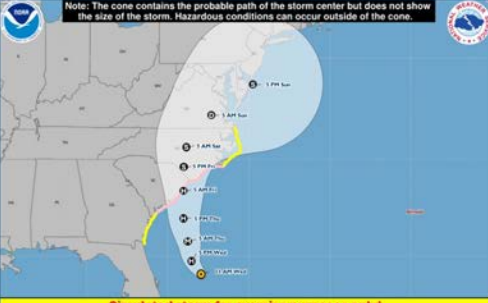

- The storm is now a hurricane with max sustained winds of 85 mph. This is a category 2 storm.
- Drake is expected to be a category 2 hurricane when it makes landfall near Myrtle Beach mid day Friday.
- A Hurricane Watch is now in effect for the NC coast that includes coastal areas from the NC/SC state line north to Cape Look. A tropical storm watch is now in effect for coastal areas from Cape Lookout north the VA border. Inland hurricane and tropical storm watches for inland areas will likely be issued by late this afternoon.
- Drake has a VERY LARGE wind field. Remember that impacts can occur WELL away from the center of the storm regardless of where it makes landfall.

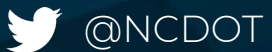

overtime status. Analyze internal and external salary data to ensure competitive pay. Make determinations for salary adjustments for positions where the job duties have changed, assumed new duties, or the complexity of work has evolved.

HR Policy Administration & Benefits: Employment Verification, Leave of Absences, Voluntary Sharded Leave, Program Review, Employee Record Maintenance, Action Approvals for Separations/Reinstatement, Orientation/Retirement, and Benefits/Insurance.

HR Qualifications & Salary Administration: Consists of 4 units, Central HR, Divisions 1-14 HR, DMV HR, and Ferry HR. Central HR performs all tasks associated with hiring process for non-delegated positions. Starts with the review and approval of posting requests and creating job postings in Workday for advertisement. Screen applications and work with the hiring manager to complete the recruitment process in Workday. Moving applicants through the required steps including interview, references, and offers. Assisting with approving payroll actions and the onboarding process in Workday. Divisions 1-14, DMV, and Ferry have delegated authority for multiple delegated classifications, which allows them to complete the qualifications and salary administration process without approval from Central HR.

HR Systems & Data Analytics: Provide oversight for all HR systems within DOT to include BEACON, Workday, and SAP. Analyze and monitor data to make recommendations for improvements and identifies systems gaps. Provide routine reports to senior leadership on strategic areas of focus with results of each that ties to DOT Dashboard and provide technology leadership in data analytics and reporting.

HR Recruitment Programs: Coordinates agency-wide recruitment strategies, workforce development programs, and talent pipeline initiatives. Manages outreach, job fairs, and specialized hiring events to attract diverse, qualified candidates (High School and College Internships, Transportation Engineering Associates Program (TEA), TAP+ Apprenticeship, and Youth Programs).

HR Services – Employee Relations: Performance Management (NCVIP) to align individual goals to the NCDOT strategic plan, Consulting on coaching and guide employees toward better performance, Disciplinary Action to ensure accountability, consistency, and legal defensibility, Grievance Process address formal employee grievances fairly, and Employee Assistance Program provide resources to help employees navigate personal issues affecting performance.

HR Services – Equal Employment Opportunity/ADA: EEO training informs NCDOT staff of EEO laws and policies, Internal EEO Complaint investigates all

	internal EEO complaints filed under the Employee Grievance Policy, EEOC charge responds to EEOC discrimination charges on behalf of NCDOT, EEO Program Review checks for equal employment opportunity plan compliance, and ADA responsible for processing reasonable accommodations requests. HR Pathways Leadership Development Programs: Distinctive leadership program that showcases its culture and addresses its needs. Utilizes Multi-modal learning – On-line e-learning, Peer collaboration, Teams engagement platform, multi-day classroom learning sessions. Program delivery started in March 2025. 260+ employees participated in the pilot program with exceptional program feedback. We anticipate 300 to participate in 2026. HR Services – Assessment Center: Comprehensive, multi-method process used to evaluate performance and potential through standardized simulations and behavioral analysis which provides candidates with clear feedback on strengths and growth areas. HR Learning & Development: Delivering professional development that aligns with organizational goals. Includes Professional Excellence and Soft Skills, Certified OSHR Leading At All Levels (LAAL), Management, Wellness and Compliance, LMS Support, and Customized Training Solutions. Safety & Risk Management: To prevent Workforce Injuries – Evaluate engineered drawings in the pre-planning phase of work, Provide hazard assessments of new technology, Evaluate and control workplace exposures, Workforce development safety training across NCDOT, Conduct Industrial Hygiene surveys for indoor air quality, Development of Safe Operating Procedures/Policies, Security/Parking, and Controlled Substances and Alcohol Program. Drug testing is required for employees who perform Safety-sensitive duties. Non-safety sensitive employees are subject to Reasonable Suspicion and Post-Accident testing. Safety & Risk Management – Worker’s Compensation: Collect required paperwork to open claim, make sure injured employees get timely treatment, Work with TPA to make sure employees out of work paid timely, Work with unit on Return-to-Work Process, Train Supervisors on how to report and handle employee injuries, and Work with TPA and AG’s office on litigation and claim closures.
