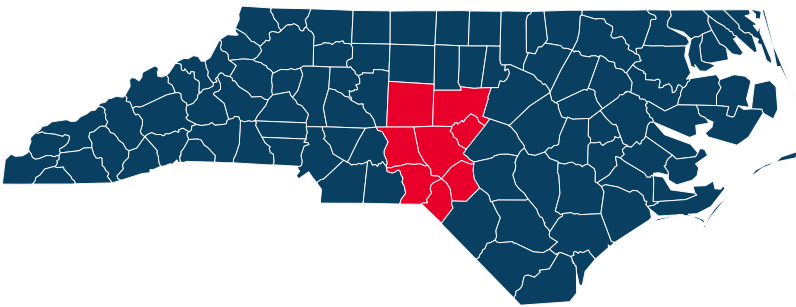

MAJOR PROJECTS COMPLETED IN 2020

U.S. 64 ASHEBORO BYPASS AND ZOO CONNECTOR (RANDOLPH COUNTY)

- ⇒ A 16.4-mile bypass under a \$244 million construction contract awarded in 2015; now open to traffic
- ⇒ Addresses congestion, travel delays and high crash rates on U.S. 64 through Asheboro
- ⇒ Part of plan to upgrade key corridors from Statesville to Raleigh (U.S. 64) and Charlotte to Raleigh (N.C. 49 and U.S. 64)
- ⇒ Provides new connector to the N.C. Zoo from U.S. 64 Bypass

U.S. 1 WIDENING (RICHMOND COUNTY)

- ⇒ Widening 3.5 miles of U.S. 1 between Fox Road and Marston Road
- ⇒ Will improve mobility by adding a travel lane in each direction on the highway east of Rockingham

MAJOR PROJECTS UNDERWAY IN 2021

I-73/I-74 ROCKINGHAM BYPASS (RICHMOND COUNTY)

- ⇒ A 7.2-mile, four-lane, median-divided freeway on new location
- ⇒ Existing U.S. 74 Rockingham Bypass will be upgraded between Zion Church Road and U.S. 74 Business interchange to six lanes with a 60-foot median with new interchanges

U.S. 15-501 BRIDGE OVER DEEP RIVER (LEE COUNTY)

- ⇒ New, 603-foot-long bridge over Deep River
- ⇒ 260-foot mid-span will help reduce debris buildup

The Coming Decade

The State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) lays out the N.C. Department of Transportation's plan for transportation projects during the next 10 years. The STIP is updated approximately every two years. The 2020-2029 STIP includes **115** projects in Division 8. Among the improvements planned are:

- ⇒ In Chatham County, upgrade U.S. 64 (North Glenn Avenue) in Siler City to a four-lane divided section with designated u-turns, sidewalks, crosswalks and multi-use path; construction to start in 2024
- ⇒ In Hoke County, widen Wayside and Lindsay Roads to multi-lane facilities from Plank Road to Rockfish Road; construction to start in 2024
- ⇒ In Lee County, realignment of Kelly Drive at Central Carolina Community College; construction to start in 2022
- ⇒ In Montgomery County, widening of N.C. 24/27 to 4-lane divided facility from Troy Bypass to N.C. 73; construction to start in 2022
- ⇒ In Moore County, access management improvements to U.S. 1 and U.S. 15-501 by installing a median with signalized u-turn movements; construction to start in 2024
- ⇒ In Randolph County, widen U.S. 64 from the Asheboro Bypass to east of I-73/74 including interchange modifications at I-73/74 and N.C. 49; construction to start in 2022.
- ⇒ In Richmond County, improvements to Greene Street from U.S. 1 to U.S. 220 in Rockingham; construction to start in 2023

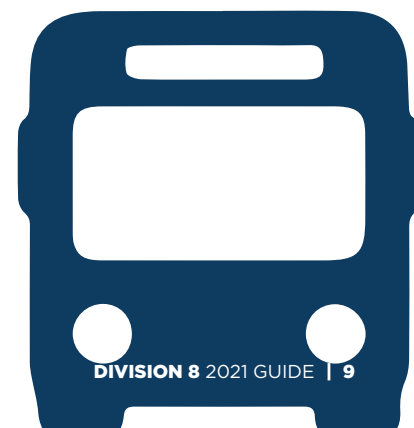

ROCKINGHAM BYPASS

Work is moving forward on a project to construct a 7.2-mile bypass around the City of Rockingham. The bypass will provide an interstate extension from the current end of I-73/74 near Ellerbe down to U.S. 74 on the southwest side of Rockingham. This connection will improve the movement of people, goods and services in the region.

MOORE COUNTY PROJECTS

NCDOT has updated construction project schedules around the 2022 U.S. Women's Open at Pine Needles Lodge & Golf Club in Southern Pines and the 2024 U.S. Open at Pinehurst Resort & Country Club. The goal is to avoid disrupting traffic routes, buses, business access and overall area preparation for these major sporting events. Projects with adjusted schedules involve U.S. 1, U.S. 15-501, N.C. 211, N.C. 24-27 and N.C. 5 in Moore County.



ASHEBORO BYPASS

Drivers traveling in and through Randolph County have a faster and safer way to get around Asheboro, thanks to the 16.4-mile bypass scheduled to open to traffic by the end of 2020. The four-lane highway carries U.S. 64 south of the city, reducing traffic volumes where U.S. 64 formerly followed Dixie Drive into the city. This project also includes a 1.8-mile connector that improves access to the N.C. Zoo.

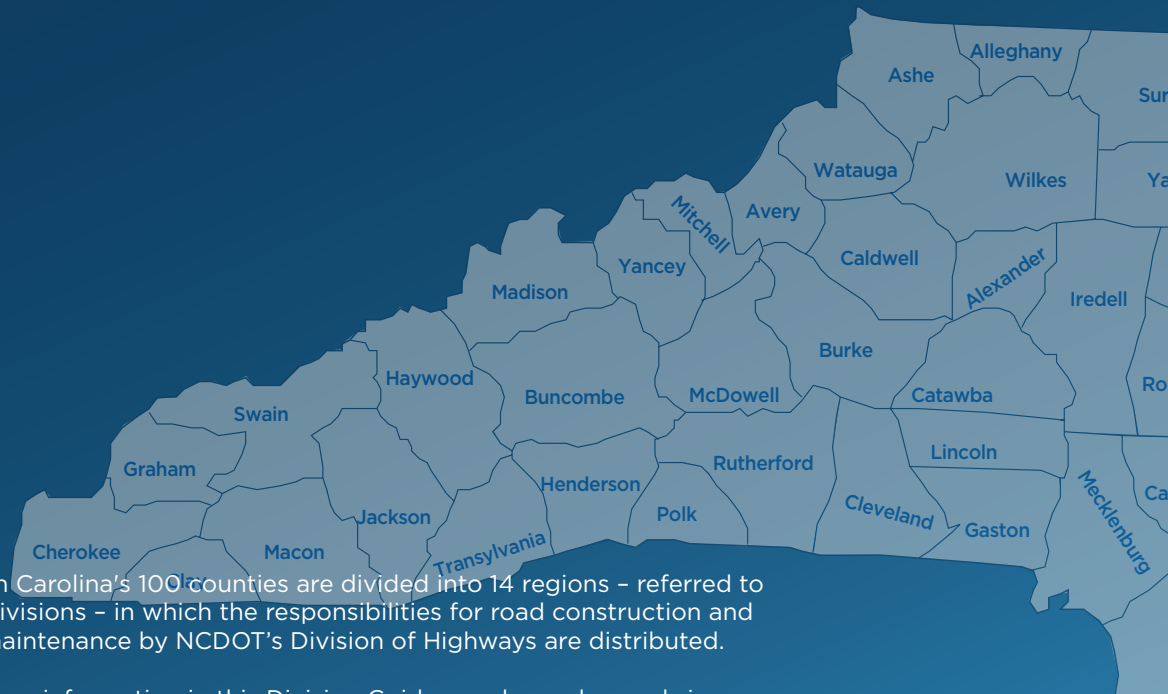
