Purpose: A vehicle with an Unregisterable Title may only be sold for parts, scrap, or recycling.

► Part 5: Verification and notarization

G.S. 20-109.1A(e) Any owner, lienholder, or subsequent purchaser harmed as a result of an unregisterable certificate of title being issued pursuant to this section, or harmed by the sale of any such vehicle following issuance of the same, shall have no cause of action against the Division, and the Division shall not be liable to any such persons in any matter related to actions taken under this section.

► **Authorized agent or representative:** This is to certify that I am a North Carolina used motor vehicle dealer whose primary business is the sale of salvage vehicles on behalf of insurance companies. I have read and understand the conditions of North Carolina General Statute 20-109.1A, and I verify under penalty of perjury that those conditions have been met as part of this application.

What are the conditions of North Carolina General Statute [G.S. 20-109.1A](#)?

To receive an Unregisterable Title in North Carolina, each of the following conditions must be met (if helpful, you can use this as a checklist as you prepare your application):

- The vehicle is declared a total loss as indicated by a written claim record;
- The incident that damaged the vehicle occurred within the boundaries of North Carolina;
- The vehicle has remained within North Carolina continuously since the incident;
- The owner of the vehicle has accepted a total loss settlement offer from the insurance company; and
- The insurance company, or its agent or contractor, has made written request for the title from the vehicle owner and any lienholders of record at the addresses contained in the records of the state of registration, and the owner or lienholder has failed to deliver the title for more than 30 days from the receipt of such written request, or the written request has been returned undeliverable, as indicated by written correspondence.

What if I am missing information?

If you cannot complete all information within this form, then an Unregisterable Title cannot be issued. If an accident/police report can not be produced, then the attestation must be completed and verified with notarized signature confirming the accident or vehicle damage occurred in the State of North Carolina.

How can I use my online vendor to help submit this application?

If you use an the online vendor system, you will be able to enter information through your online vendor system. This application and required attachments must be mailed to the Division of Motor Vehicles, following the current process.

What happens after I submit this application?

The Division of Motor Vehicles will process your application. Communication will be by mail. If your application is approved, you'll be mailed the Unregisterable Certificate of Title. If your application cannot be approved as submitted, you'll be mailed a request for additional information.
