TEEN DRIVER LEVEL 2 Checklist



Once you have reached the age of 16, had a Level 1 limited learner permit for nine months, and logged at least 60 hours of driving, you can take a road test to get your Level 2 Limited Provisional License. You can now take a road test at a certified driver education school or at an NCDMV driver license office.

Here's what to bring to the DMV to get your Level 2 Limited Provisional License:

- Your Level 1 learner permit
- <u>Driving log showing at least 60 hours of driving</u> (must be printed)
- Printed proof of liability insurance coverage in the teen driver's name from a provider licensed to operate in North Carolina. (images on a mobile device will not be accepted)
 Note: The teen driver may be listed as an insured driver on the vehicle owner's insurance policy.

If you are taking a road test at a driver license office:

- Bring your own vehicle, present valid vehicle registration card. The vehicle must pass pre-trip inspection.
- You must have a parent or guardian present for a road test. Anyone other than the
 parent or guardian must provide written documentation from a parent or guardian
 giving consent for the minor to have the designated individual as a supervising driver.

If you took your road test at a certified driver education school:

 Bring the certificate showing you have passed the road test, in addition to the items listed above.

Additional details:

Your Level 2 Limited Provisional License will arrive in the mail within 20 business days. Applicants receive a temporary driving certificate to use until their license arrives.

There is a \$25.50 fee to obtain a level 2 limited provisional license.
