Nationwide, 25,000 accidents can be attributed to roadway debris annually.

The N.C. Department of Transportation spent \$16 million last year picking up litter from the state’s roadsides.

**Litter affects more than our roads. A large amount of litter ends up in our streams and waterways as pollution.**

The N.C. Department of Transportation created the Highway Stormwater Program to reduce the contaminants that enter our state's waterways from North Carolina's highways.

You can make a difference in keeping North Carolina's waters clean by:

- **NOT LITTERING**
- Washing your car on the grass or taking your car to the car wash
- Directing stormwater to your lawn, garden or natural areas to promote soaking into the ground
- Fertilizing your lawn by following the product label instructions
- Picking up your pet's waste and disposing of it properly
- Fixing vehicle oil leaks
