

NCDOT TO HOLD PUBLIC MEETING JUNE 3 IN RALEIGH FOR THE PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS TO THE INTERSECTION OF FALLS OF NEUSE ROAD AND SPRINGFIELD COMMONS DRIVE

TIP Project No. SS-4905CB

The N.C. Department of Transportation proposes to improve the intersection of Falls of Neuse Road and Springfield Commons Drive in Raleigh, Wake County. The purpose of this project is to improve safety at this location.

The meeting will take place on **Tuesday, June 3rd** at the **Ann Gordon Center**, located at **1901 Spring Forest Road** in **Raleigh**. The open house will be held from 5-7 p.m. Interested citizens may attend at any time during the above hours as there will be no formal presentation. NCDOT representatives will be available to answer questions and receive comments regarding the proposed project. Citizens also will have the opportunity to submit comments and questions in writing.

This project proposes to construct a directional crossover (a partial median) at the intersection, which is currently a full-movement intersection without a traffic signal. The new configuration will continue to allow all right turn movements. Northbound left turns from Falls of Neuse Road onto Springfield Commons Drive will still be allowed, but southbound left turns from Falls of Neuse Road onto Springfield Commons Drive will not be permitted. Southbound traffic will be able to access the shopping center at the next driveway further south or from Spring Forest Road. These improvements are proposed to address the crash patterns at this intersection.
