

NOTICE OF A CITIZENS PROJECT UPDATE MEETING FOR THE
PROPOSED MACY GROVE ROAD (STATE ROAD 2601) IMPROVEMENTS FROM
INDUSTRIAL PARK DRIVE (S.R. 4319) TO N.C. 150 (NORTH MAIN STREET)

TIP Project No. U-2800

Forsyth and Guilford Counties

The North Carolina Department of Transportation proposes to widen Macy Grove Road to multi-lanes, extending the roadway on a new location from Old Greensboro Road to north of Old U.S. 421/East Mountain Street, and converting a grade separation at U.S. 421/Business 40 to an interchange. Grade separations are also proposed over the Norfolk Southern Railroad and Old U.S. 421/East Mountain Street. The term “grade separation” means using a bridge to separate intersecting roads and/or railroads to improve safety.

The primary purpose of the project is to provide a roadway link between U.S. 421/Business 40 and N.C. 150 north of Kernersville. In addition, other potential benefits include reducing congestion in downtown Kernersville and at the existing N.C. 66/N.C. 150 interchange with U.S. 421/Business 40, as well as providing a segment of the future Kernersville Loop Road.

NCDOT will hold a meeting to update the public about the Macy Grove Road Improvement Project on Thursday, June 6, from 4 – 7 p.m. at the Grady P. Swisher Center on a satellite campus of Forsyth Technical Community College, located at 1251 Dudley Products Boulevard in Kernersville.

The purpose of the meeting is to present the final design of the project, and explain how the contractor will construct the improvements and show how the project will affect pedestrian access during construction. Interested citizens may attend at any time during the meeting hours. NCDOT representatives will be available to answer questions and listen to comments, regarding the project. Citizens will also have the opportunity to submit comments and questions in writing. The comments and information received will be taken into consideration as the project develops.
