

**PROPOSED TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENTS TO THE INTERSECTION OF  
SOUTHEAST SCHOOL ROAD (S.R. 3330)  
AND WOODY MILL ROAD (S.R. 3389) IN GREENSBORO**

The N.C. Department of Transportation will hold an informal public meeting regarding proposed improvements to the intersection of Southeast School Road (S.R. 3330) and Woody Mill Road (S.R. 3389).

The meeting will take place on Tuesday, October 28, from 4:30 p.m. until 7 p.m. at the Community in Christ Church, Presbyterian, 5401 Liberty Road, Greensboro.

The purpose of this meeting is for NCDOT representatives to provide information and answer questions regarding the proposed transportation improvements to this intersection. The opportunity to submit written comments will be provided at the meeting or by November 11, 2014 to the provided contact information. Interested citizens may attend at any time during the above mentioned hours. Note: There will be no formal presentation.

The purpose of this project is to realign Woody Mill Road and Southeast School Road to improve sight distance and traffic flow in this area. There are three alternatives under consideration: two T-type intersections and a roundabout. There will be maps displaying the three alternatives and potential impacts for each alternative for the public to review. The proposed project may require acquisition of some additional right of way.
