

NOTICE OF A CITIZENS' INFORMATIONAL WORKSHOP FOR THE PROPOSED  
GRADE-SEPARATION OF MCLEANSVILLE ROAD (STATE ROAD 2918) OVER THE

BLACK CROSSING BETWEEN MCLEANSVILLE ROAD AND CARMON ROAD

The North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) will hold an informal, open house-style Citizens' Informational Workshop for the above-mentioned railroad safety improvement project on Tuesday, April 24, 2012, from 5–7 p.m. at the McLeansville Fire Department, located at 5326 Frieden Church Road.

NCDOT representatives will be available to answer questions and receive comments about the proposed project. The opportunity to submit written comments and/or questions will also be provided and is encouraged. Interested citizens may attend at any time during the above-mentioned hours. There will not be a formal presentation.

The proposed project would include the construction of a bridge on McLeansville Road that will be constructed over the North Carolina Railroad tracks. Proposed alternate roadway alignments for the new bridge construction will be presented at the workshop. The existing at-grade railroad crossings at Frieden Church Road and Carmon Road will be closed along with the new bridge construction. The private Bullard & Black crossing between McLeansville Road and Carmon Road will also be closed along with providing alternate access. The project is scheduled for right-of-way acquisition in 2013, followed by construction in 2014.

Construction of a bridge on McLeansville Road, over the railroad tracks, and the closings of the Frieden Church and Carmon Road railroad crossings will reduce the risk of vehicle/train collisions, improve safety for vehicle and rail passengers, reduce vehicle and train traffic congestion, and reduce train horn noise.
