The North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) will hold the above Citizens Informational Workshop on Monday, September 27, 2010, beginning at 5:00 pm and ending at 7:00 pm, at the Queheel Volunteer Fire Department, located at 108 East Rockingham Road, Maxton.

Maps denoting the proposed project will be displayed and NCDOT representatives will be available to discuss the project, answer questions, and receive comments. Written comments are encouraged. Citizens may drop-in anytime during the workshop hours. Please note: there will be no formal presentation.

A Citizens Informational Workshop is held to provide the public an opportunity to participate in the planning process and update them on a project's status. Comments and information received from the public will be taken into consideration as work on this project progresses.

NCDOT proposes to permanently close SR 1108 (Hayes Road), Bridge No. 445 and Bridge No. 161 over Woodland Farm Pond. The bridges are made of timber and concrete and are reaching the end of their useful life in carrying vehicles.

Improvements proposed for the project include the paving of Hayes Road (State Road 1108), the construction of parking areas at both ends of the dam and footpaths across Woodland Farm Pond dam.
