

NCDOT TO HOLD PUBLIC MEETING AUGUST 14 FOR THE PROPOSED SAFETY IMPROVEMENT ON CHARLES BLVD (N.C. 43) FROM GREENVILLE BLVD (U.S. 264A) TO RED BANKS RD IN GREENVILLE

The N.C. Department of Transportation will hold a public meeting in August to inform citizens of a proposed project to construct a median on Charles Boulevard (N.C. 43) from Greenville Boulevard (U.S. 264A) to Red Banks Road in Greenville, Pitt County.

The purpose of this project is to address crashes at this location. No additional right of way will be needed.

The public meeting will take place on **Thursday, August 14**, from **4:30 p.m. to 7 p.m.** in the Fellowship Hall of the **Oakmont Baptist Church** located at **1100 Red Banks Road, Greenville**. Interested citizens may attend at any time and NCDOT representatives will be available to answer questions and receive comments regarding the proposed project. No formal presentation will be made. Attendees will also have the opportunity to submit written comments and questions, which will be taken into consideration as the project is planned.
