

**NCDOT TO HOLD PUBLIC MEETING IN SEPT FOR IMPROVEMENTS TO
WEST 15TH STREET (S.R. 1306), BETWEEN CAROLINA AVENUE AND
NORTH BRIDGE STREET IN WASHINGTON**

The N. C. Department of Transportation will hold a public meeting regarding a proposed project to construct operational improvements to West 15th Street (S.R. 1306) from North Bridge Street to Carolina Avenue in Washington. Improvements will include widening the section to five lanes and construction of a raised median along 15th Street.

The purpose of the project is to improve traffic and operational safety along West 15th Street.

The meeting will take place on **Tuesday, September 30th** at the **NC Department of Environmental and Natural Resources Office located at 943 Washington Square Mall** from **4:00 to 7:00 p.m.** Interested citizens may attend at any time during the meeting hours, as there will be no formal presentation. NCDOT representatives will be available to answer questions and listen to comments regarding the project. Citizens will also have the opportunity to submit comments and questions in writing. Comments received will be taken into consideration as the project develops.
