



For a better state.

More than 100,000 vehicles travel along the 11.5-mile stretch of I-40/I-440 south of Raleigh, causing a lot of wear and tear on the 30-year-old highway. The goal of Fortify is to replace and reinforce the pavement materials along the roadway and to repair select bridges for safer, more efficient travel for many years to come.

Fortification Efforts

- **Replace pavement** along 11.5-mile southern stretch of I-40 / I-440.
- **Extend the lanes** between ramps in each direction at
 - US 1/64 (Exit 293) / Gorman St (Exit 295)
 - Gorman Street (Exit 295) / Lake Wheeler Rd (Exit 297)
- **Extend deceleration lane**—off-ramp for Rock Quarry Road (Exit 300B)
- **Rehabilitate 14 bridges** within project zone

More than 100,000 cars travel on this weakened section every day. A project like this one will have an impact on traffic.



Do your part. To help reduce congestion, try an alternative route or work schedule. The goal is to get 30,000 cars off the road during heavy commute times: 6 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. and 4 p.m. to 6:30 p.m.

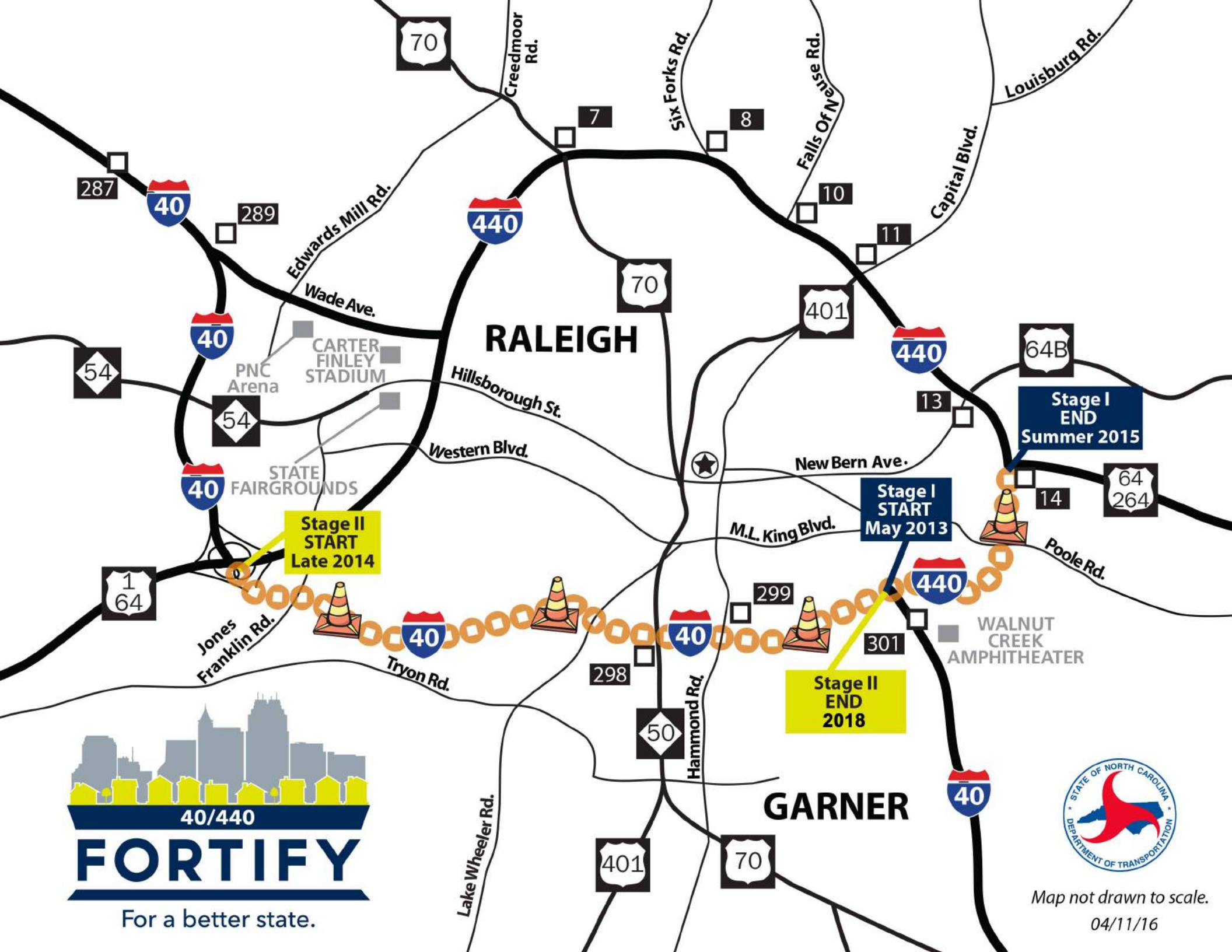
