

State infrastructure supporting maritime trade includes its ports, waterways, highways and rail network, as well as inland production, logistics and distribution centers that serve the ports and other means of transporting freight. Service between the Port of Wilmington, Charlotte and the CSX network is provided by the Queen City Express, which was initiated in 2017.



Imports and Exports

In fiscal year 2018, more than 6.7 million tons of cargo moved through the North Carolina ports, supporting more than \$15.4 billion in gross revenues for North Carolina businesses. The ports located at Wilmington and Morehead City, offer services for a variety of cargo types.
