100 Deadliest Days of Summer Begin

The period between Memorial Day and Labor Day is nationally recognized as the most dangerous time of year for teen drivers.

In 2021 alone, nearly 14,000 crashes in North Carolina involved teen drivers. The Governor's Highway Safety Program and its partners are working to promote safer driving habits among teens.

Division 4 Holds Equipment Operator Safety Training Conference

WILSON – More than 100 employees of highway Division 4 competed on April 30 in a training competition involving heavy equipment, such as tractors, backhoes, motor-graders and lowboy trucks.



The annual event is informally known as the 'roadeo' and provides an opportunity for the employees to hone their driving and operating skills, but in a safe environment away from traffic.

All 14 highway divisions of the N.C. Department of Transportation hold these events each spring. The winners from each division advance to the state finals this month.

Rocky Mount Highway Interchange Requires Ramp Closure

ROCKY MOUNT – One of the ramps at the large junction of Interstate 95 and U.S. 64 in Nash County temporarily closed this month.

A state highway contractor closed the I-95 North ramp to U.S. 64 East and U.S. 64 West. This ramp is expected to reopen by the end of June.

While the ramp is closed, the contractor will be placing the collector-distributor lane in its final pattern to serve the new Sunset Avenue interchange on I-95. Once the ramp from I-95 North to U.S. 64 is reopened, motorists on I-95 will continue to use Exit 138 to access

U.S. 64, but this exit will be one mile farther south than its current location.
