RALEIGH – United States Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg visited the Triangle on July 1 to view several highway projects and attend the Durant Road groundbreaking for the first S-Line on the Raleigh to Wake Forest corridor.

The Durant Road grade separation in Raleigh is the first in a series of construction projects associated with the \$1.09 billion Federal-State Partnership (FSP) grant awarded in December 2023. The groundbreaking event on July 1 will celebrate the kickoff of this specific project and the beginning of construction work on the S-Line Raleigh to Wake Forest project and the larger Raleigh to Richmond Program.

Thanks to \$1.5 million contract awarded to ST Wooten Corp. by the N.C. Department of Transportation, 42 sections of secondary roads in Franklin and Wake counties will see a smoother drive.

Contractors will be responsible for milling, resurfacing and shoulder reconstruction along a total of 11.8 miles of roadway. More than 10 miles of roadway is located in Franklin County with the rest being in Wake County.

Work can begin as early as later this month and finish in the fall of 2025.
