NCDOT Asking Drivers to Report Potholes



Because of last December's winter storm, potholes are appearing earlier than normal across the state. They are caused by water seeping into cracks in the road and ice forming. Those cracks widen, causing the asphalt to rise while traffic loosens the pavement eventually creating a hole in the road. Maintenance crews in Division 14 will make additional permanent pothole repairs once warmer weather patterns exist.

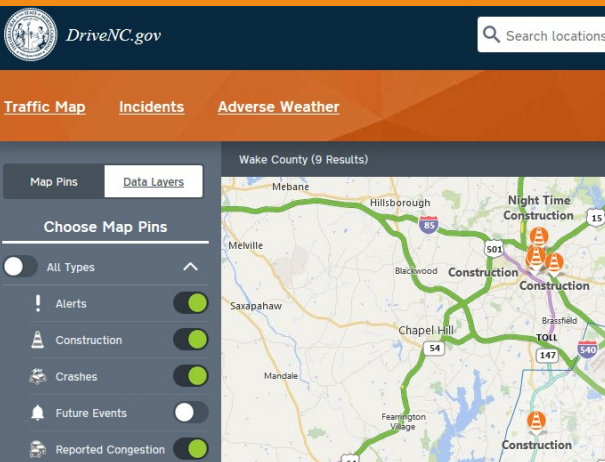
Help Reduce Pedestrian & Bicycle
