

# Draft 2018-2027 State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP)

*Nine (9) public information sessions across the state.*

## What is the STIP?

The State Transportation Improvement Program is a document developed cooperatively by local, regional and state transportation entities. It includes a list of multi-modal transportation projects, such as highway, transit and bicycle based on the state's long-range transportation goals. The projects are drawn from and are consistent with a Statewide Long-Range Transportation Plan, Countywide Transportation Plans and Metropolitan Transportation Plans.

The projects included in the document were selected using a data-driven prioritization process created by the [Strategic Transportation Investment](#) Law (STI), which was passed by the General Assembly in 2013.

## What is the purpose of these sessions?

To inform the public about the projects in the Draft STIP and gather input on the process to create it. People who cannot attend a meeting in person can also provide feedback via phone, fax and e-mail. Contact information and an on-line comment form are available at
