*Did you know?*

- Do not allow more passengers in your car than you have seat belts for them to use.
- North Carolina prohibits ALL drivers from texting or reading a text message while a vehicle is in motion.
- In 2011, there were more than 42,000 crashes that involved teen drivers, resulting in more than 12,000 injuries and 111 deaths.
- How much does it cost if you receive a ticket for not wearing your seat belt?
  - \$25.50, plus court costs of \$135.50
  - Backseat passengers 16 and older not buckled will receive a \$10 fine.
  - No driver license or insurance points are assessed.

# Parent/Guardian and Student Parking Privilege Agreement

**The Governor's Highway Safety Program has developed a program to ensure that teen drivers and passengers use their seat belts. Student drivers who do not buckle up and/or whose passengers are not safely restrained will risk losing on-campus parking privileges. It is recommended that student drivers and their parent or guardian sign this agreement prior to the student obtaining a parking pass to park their vehicle on campus.**

The level of enforcement and punishment can be determined by the school. This model is only a suggestion for implementation.

The **first time** a student driver is observed driving on campus not buckled or has unbuckled passengers in the car, he or she will receive a written warning.

- The student and their parent or guardian must sign and return the written warning to ensure continued access to on-campus parking.

A **second violation** will result in a one-week (five consecutive school days) loss of parking privileges.

- The written violation will require the signature of the student and their parent or guardian to restore on-campus parking privileges after one week.

If a removable parking pass is administered by the school, the school will retain the pass until the suspension is complete.

A **third violation** will result in a two-week (10 consecutive school days) loss of parking privileges.

- The written violation will require the signature of the student and their parent or guardian to restore on-campus parking privileges after two-weeks.
- If a removable parking pass is administered by the school, the school will retain the pass until the suspension is complete.

A **fourth violation** will result in a one-month (20 consecutive school days) loss of parking privileges.

- The written violation will require the signature of the student and their parent or guardian to restore on-campus parking privileges after one week.
- If a removable parking pass is administered by the school, the school will retain the pass until the suspension is complete.

## Did you know?

- It is against the law in North Carolina for drivers under the age of 18 to use a mobile phone or any technology associated with a mobile telephone while a vehicle is in motion.
- In North Carolina, the law now requires ALL persons in a vehicle wear seat belts. There are no longer age exceptions for passengers in the back seat.


