

C.F. Harvey Parkway Extension Public Meeting

R-5703 | July 19, 2016 | 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. | Global Transpark Center of Excellence



Welcome to this evening's meeting for the C.F. Harvey Parkway (NC 148) Extension from NC 58 to NC 11. The purpose of this meeting is to provide you with an update on the project, review the proposed plans, and discuss the next steps. You will have an opportunity to review study area maps and displays, talk with the project team members, and offer your input.

WHAT IS THE PROJECT?

NCDOT is proposing to extend C.F. Harvey Parkway (NC 148) as a four-lane, median-divided freeway with full control of access. The project extends from NC 58 to NC 11 in Lenoir County, north of the City of Kinston in North Carolina.

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THIS PROJECT?

The purpose of this project is to improve regional and area connectivity in Northern Kinston between US 70, NC 58, NC 148, and NC 11.

PROJECT UPDATES

The North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) completed the state Environmental Assessment and submitted it to the N.C. State Environmental Review Clearinghouse for public review and comment on June 30, 2016. The Environmental Assessment documented the anticipated impacts to the environment from the project and resulted in a Finding of No Significant Impacts.

Based on this analysis, NCDOT is recommending Alternative 2. The primary reasons for selecting Alternative 2 is that it provides a more direct connection to areas northeast of Kinston and has less impacts to the natural environment.



WHY IS ALTERNATIVE 2 PREFERRED?

After detailed and thorough environmental screening, review, and documentation, it was determined that Alternative 2 would have the least amount of detrimental effects on the human and natural environment. More information on this evaluation and decision can be found in the Environmental Assessment documentation located on the project website or in person at the NCDOT office in Greenville. See back of this handout for detailed links and addresses.

NEXT STEPS

Following the public comment period on the Environmental Assessment, next steps include:

-  1 NCDOT will move forward with completing the final designs for the preferred alternative.
-  2 The proposed right-of-way limits will be set based on the final designs and a right-of-way agent from NCDOT will contact the affected property owners to initiate the right-of-way acquisition process.
-  3 Once the required right-of-way has been purchased, NCDOT will begin construction of the roadway.

PROPOSED TYPICAL SECTION FOR THE C.F. HARVEY PARKWAY EXTENSION




Image for Conceptual Purposes Only - Not to Scale

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WHAT IS THE RIGHT-OF-WAY PROCESS?

After decisions are made regarding the final design, the proposed right-of-way limits will be staked in the ground. If you are an affected property owner, a right-of-way agent will contact you and arrange a meeting. The agent will explain the plans and advise you as to how the project will affect you. The agent will inform you of your rights as a property owner. If any part of your property is needed, professionals who are familiar with real estate values will evaluate or appraise your property. The evaluations or appraisals will be reviewed for completeness and accuracy, after which the right-of-way agent will make a written offer to you. The current market value of the property at its highest and best use when appraised will be offered as compensation. The Department of Transportation must:

1. Treat all owners and tenants equally.
2. Fully explain the owner's rights.
3. Pay just compensation in exchange for property rights.
4. Furnish relocation advisory assistance.

WHAT RELOCATION ASSISTANCE IS AVAILABLE?

If you are a relocatee, that is, if your residence or business is to be acquired as part of the project, additional assistance in the form of advice and compensation is available. You will also be provided with assistance to determine locations of comparable housing and/or commercial establishments, moving procedures, and moving aid. Moving expenses may be paid for you. Additional monetary compensation is available to help homeowners cope with mortgage increases, increased value of comparable homes, closing costs, etc. A similar program is available to assist business owners. The right-of-way agent can explain this assistance in greater detail.




WHERE CAN I VIEW MAPS FROM TONIGHT'S MEETING?
