

Description

NCDOT is proposing to replace the existing two-lane, 2.8-mile-long Lindsay C. Warren Bridge on U.S. 64 over the Alligator River with a modern two-lane, fixed-span, high-rise bridge on new location, just north of the existing bridge.

The project is needed to replace the existing "structurally deficient" bridge. This does not imply that the bridge is unsafe. It means the bridge is reaching the end of its useful life and must be monitored, inspected and maintained on a frequent basis, which negatively impacts the bridge's ability to provide a reliable connection between Columbia, Manns Harbor, Manteo, and the Outer Banks.

Project Description & History

In 2021, NCDOT completed the preliminary design and environmental study phase for the HB-0001 project, which proposes to replace U.S. 64 Tyrrell County Bridge Number 7 over the Alligator River, and is working now to complete the final designs so that construction can begin in 2024. This bridge replacement was previously included as part of a larger study that looked at widening U.S. 64 from Columbia to Manteo, approximately 27 miles (STIP Project R-2544/R-2545). That project progressed through the environmental review process, but was later put on hold in 2013 and is no longer included in the State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP).




For the HB-0001 project, NCDOT proposes to replace the existing Lindsay C. Warren Bridge with a modern two-lane, fixed-span, high-rise bridge with 8-foot shoulders to accommodate bicyclists and emergency vehicle access. A traffic forecast, as well as a roadway capacity analysis, determined that existing U.S. 64, as a two-lane roadway, continues to function sufficiently through to year 2045. Traffic will be maintained on the existing bridge during construction.

Funding

In January 2023, the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT) announced that the project will receive a \$110 million federal Multimodal Project Discretionary Grant. The grant will also fund installation of broadband infrastructure along U.S. 64, from I-95 in Rocky Mount to N.C. 12 on the Outer Banks. The receipt of grant funding allows the project to move forward through final design and right of way acquisition, with an anticipated Let date (start of construction) of Summer/Fall 2024, and an anticipated construction completion date by the end of 2028.
