

Developing a Vision Statement CTP Style

First Ask:

1. What would the Vision Statement be for your jurisdiction?
2. What would your jurisdiction's end goals be for its future transportation system.

Then:

3. List all the key elements that are important for your jurisdictions future transportation and land use goals.
4. Pick and prioritize the major objectives that incorporate those elements.

Last: Can you measure it?

Goals and Objectives should be quantifiable. Can you test them to see if you were successful in five years? Ten years?



STATEWIDE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

1. Vision/Mission: *Connecting people and places in North Carolina - safely and efficiently, with accountability and environmental sensitivity.*

2. NCDOT Goals: *Make our transportation network **safer**; Make our transportation network **move people and goods more efficiently**; And Make our **infrastructure last longer**.*

3. Key Elements for NCDOT

- Public Safety, Mobility, Connectivity;
- Economic and Environmental Stewardship;
- Support the economic growth and vitality;
- Enabling local, regional, state and global competitiveness, productivity, and efficiency;
- Protect and enhance the environment, promote energy conservation;
- Improve quality of life;
- Enhance the integration and connectivity of the transportation system for people and freight;
- Emphasize the preservation of the existing transportation system.
- Congruency with national transportation system plan, statewide transportation plan, and SHC's Vision Plan;
- Compliance with statewide regulations and policies;



STATEWIDE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES Continued.....

4. Objectives and Goals

- Provide a network of high mobility, safe and reliable highways throughout North Carolina.
- Protect and preserve select corridors focused on providing mobility; connectivity to activity centers and other major routes; and safety.
- To serve the mobility needs of people and freight and foster economic growth and development within and through urbanized areas.
- Minimize transportation related fuel consumption and air pollution.



DEVELOPING COUNTY LAND USE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Taken from Land Use Plan as an Example (by
Frances not MC Planning Dept.)

Vision: ? Goals? not sure yet?

What are the important elements?

- **Preserve farmland, maximize use of existing roads.**
- **“Use land-use zoning wisely” and “balance community interests with private interests.”** Transportation system should be consistent and in tandem with future land-use zoning.
- **Develop a Land Classification System** which designates growth areas and rural/conservation areas.
- Recognize that urban-like sprawl in rural areas increases the cost of services for everyone – prevent sprawl thereby minimizing tax increases.
- Citizen concerns about the **impact of growth and development on environmental quality** were the strongest and most consistent across the board.



DEVELOPING COUNTY LAND USE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES.....(Examples by Frances)

- Concerns about development centered around **quality growth** which would **limit sprawl** and **cluster commercial development**, **planned infrastructure to keep pace with growth** according to an overall plan, the need to **promote a sustainable economy**, and a **careful analysis of the need for new roads**.
- Overall, **growth** should be directed to areas of the county equipped with utilities to serve it and **should not outpace the county's ability to provide adequate infrastructure**.
- **Work with the Department of Transportation**, or hire an unbiased traffic expert, to prepare a new County Thoroughfare Plan that considers **separating local traffic from through traffic**.



DEVELOPING
COUNTY LAND USE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES.....(Examples by
Frances cont.)

- **Encourage municipalities to consider alternatives to the automobile** in their Transportation Planning efforts.
- Consider new zoning regulations that **allow for mixed use developments** to encourage communities where people can work and live.
- Consult with the **Department of Transportation regarding traffic light needs especially at busy intersections** (NC211, US15/501 Eastwood).




WESTERN CONNECTOR

PINEHURST FUTURE LAND USE MAP





SOUTHERN PINES FUTURE LAND USE MAP








Turning to Data and Analysis

- Identify roads to be included in the model.
- O & D study to determine traffic patterns and internal flow.
- Traffic Counts
- Existing congestion and traffic issues.



Resume Standard Transportation Planning Process




Identifying Roads to be Included in the Model

- Functionally Classified Roads
 - These are federally recognized
 - Include US, NC and some SR roads.
- Locally Significant Roadways
 - These should coincide with land use plans, development, and local activity centers.
 - Function as local connector roads for traffic flow.






