

**NOTICE OF A CITIZENS INFORMATIONAL WORKSHOP
FOR IMPROVING VEHICULAR SAFETY AND TRAFFIC OPERATIONS
AT NC 68 FROM 600 FEET SOUTH OF SR 2111 (EAST HARRELL ROAD) TO
SR 4831 (BARTONSHIRE DRIVE)**

The North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) will hold the above Citizens Informational Meeting on March 14, 2011 between the hours of 4:30 p.m. and 6:30 p.m. at Oak Ridge Town Hall, 8315 Linville Road, Oak Ridge, 27310.

The purpose of this meeting is for NCDOT representatives to provide information and answer questions regarding this project. The opportunity to submit written comments will also be provided. Interested citizens may attend at any time during the above mentioned hours.

NCDOT is proposing two alternatives that will improve the vehicular safety and operations on NC 68 at the East Harrell Road and West Harrell Road intersections. Alternate No. 1 will relocate East Harrell Road to the south and West Harrell Road to the north providing a greater distance between the intersections. Left-turn lanes will be provided on NC 68 at these intersections. The existing culvert on the Haw River will remain in place. Alternate No. 2 will relocate East Harrell Road to the south and provide a left-turn lane on NC 68 for this intersection. The intersection of NC 68 and West Harrell Road will be eliminated. West Harrell Road will be made a cul-de-sac at its current location. The culvert on the Haw River will remain in place. Traffic on NC 68 will be maintained on-site during construction. No on-site or off-site detours are anticipated for this project.
