Minutes**

Secretary Gene Conti called the meeting to order at 1:07pm. The Secretary read the State Ethics Act and declared that a quorum was present. Sang Hamilton moved to approve the August 2009 minutes. The motion was seconded by Lanny Wilson, and the minutes were approved as presented.

Grady Rankin introduced Barbara Fava, Managing Director of PFM Asset Management. Ms. Fava made a presentation on the Triangle Expressway Financial Investment Plan. Ms. Fava discussed the project fund disbursements of the three sources - TIFIA, ABAB Bonds and Revenue Bonds. She discussed the overall investment strategy. She also discussed the construction funds, capitalized interest and debt service reserve as of August 31, 2009. (See attached presentation.)

Jim Eden gave a presentation on the Triangle Expressway Toll Collection System Selection Committee Report. He thanked the staff for their hard work and all vendors that submitted proposals. He stated that all proposals were outstanding and demonstrated a very high level of expertise. Mr. Eden discussed the RFP components – Roadside Toll Collection System, Back Office System, and Operation Services. Mr. Eden reported on the proposals received from vendors and discussed the evaluation process along with the schedule for the contract award. He extended a special thanks to the selection committee. Mr. Eden discussed the evaluation components that made up the Best Value Procurement – technical score, pricing score, response to questions, change order analysis, exceptions to terms and conditions, and combined pricing. He then revealed the evaluation outcome of the Selection Committee recommendations: the Roadside Toll Collection System – ACS State & Local Solutions, Inc., Back Office

System – ACS State & Local Solutions, Inc., and Operations Services – Washington Division of URS. Mr. Eden asked if there were any questions regarding the recommendation.

- *Action item:* Secretary Conti made the following motion:
I move to recommend approval for the NCTA staff to proceed with negotiations with the selected teams. Lanny Wilson seconded the motion and it was approved unanimously. Anthony Fox recused himself as ACS State & Local Solutions, Inc is a client of his firm.

Reid Simons gave a Public Affairs update on the Monroe Connector/Bypass and the Garden Parkway. Reid discussed public involvement and meetings on the Monroe Connector/Bypass. The TCC and MPO have recommended Alternative D. Also the Monroe City Council has presented letters of support to change the project name to the “Monroe Parkway.” David Joyner sent a letter to the City Council, and the Board will be asked to take action on the matter at the appropriate time. The Aesthetic Committee decided on the final draft of the design concept of the regional architecture theme. Ms. Simons also discussed the Garden Parkway public involvement and meetings. She discussed the recommended Alternative 9. Ms. Simons discussed the Gastonia City Council rally which included both supporters and opposers of the project. She reported that the Triangle Expressway “Thank You” Reception will be on September 30, 2009 at the RTP Headquarters. (See attached presentation.)

Executive Committee: Lanny Wilson stated that the Executive Committee met and there were no action items.

Operations and Personnel Committee: Sang Hamilton discussed that the Operations Committee met and received an industry update from Jim Eden. The upcoming Operations bids and the Operations Business Plan were also discussed. Andy Lelewski provided procurement updates. Jim Eden stated that in addition to IBTTA’s Annual Meeting to be held in Raleigh next year, IBTTA would also like to do a charity project in the area and any ideas are welcome.

Plans and Programs Committee: Lanny Wilson discussed the Plans and Programs meeting. Mr. Wilson stated that Shannon Sweitzer gave a presentation on the Garden Parkway Practical Design Workshop and provided photos of TriEx construction activities. Jennifer Harris gave an update on the status of all NCTA projects. Secretary Conti recognized the efforts of the Engineering team on all of their hard work.

Finance Committee: Bob Spencer reported that the Finance Committee met and there was not a quorum. He stated that Bob Weisenberger gave the monthly TriEx Financial Report. He also discussed the Right-of-Way status for TriEx and the Annual Plan of Work. There were no action items.

Secretary Conti introduced the contract policy resolution.

- *Action item:* He made the following motion:

I move to approve the contract policy resolution as presented. Lanny Wilson seconded the motion. Secretary Conti discussed the role of the Board under the new contract policy and stated that the Board will work with the Executive Director and the Secretary of Transportation to develop and monitor the Annual Plan of Work. The motion was seconded by Lanny Wilson and approved as presented. Mr. Spencer dissented.

The meeting was adjourned at 2:00 pm.



Project Fund Disbursements





Projected Monthly Disbursements (Project Fund Only) August 2009 – April 2013



Overall Investment Strategy




- The money market mutual fund currently outperforms alternative short-term investments.
- Liquidity to cover constructions draws through May 2010 will come from the money market mutual fund.
- The Treasury Short-Term Investment Fund (STIF) is being used in lieu of intermediate-term investments.
 - Maximum allocation to STIF permitted by Treasury is \$263 million.
- Reserve Fund investments targeted to the 2 to 3 year maturity range to balance risk and return.




Construction Funds (as of August 31, 2009)



Asset Allocation






Maturity Distribution




Capitalized Interest (as of August 31, 2009)




Maturity Distribution




Debt Service Reserve (as of August 31, 2009)



Asset Allocation





(1) The Average Portfolio Yield is a snapshot of the yield on the portfolio as a particular date. The other Average Gross Yield quoted are Internal Rate of Returns or the rate at which the average dollar is invested over the projected time period.

As redemptions that reduce the allocation to lower yielding investments, the Average Portfolio Yield will increase.

A significant portion of the investment strategy is invested in the North Carolina STIF. The rate is variable and would be expected to decline over time. A 1.00% average investment rate is assumed for the purpose of this analysis.










