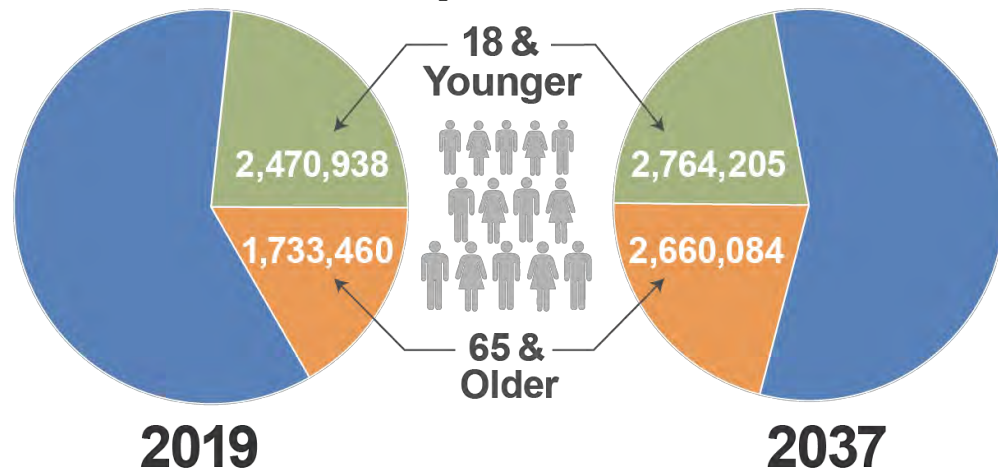

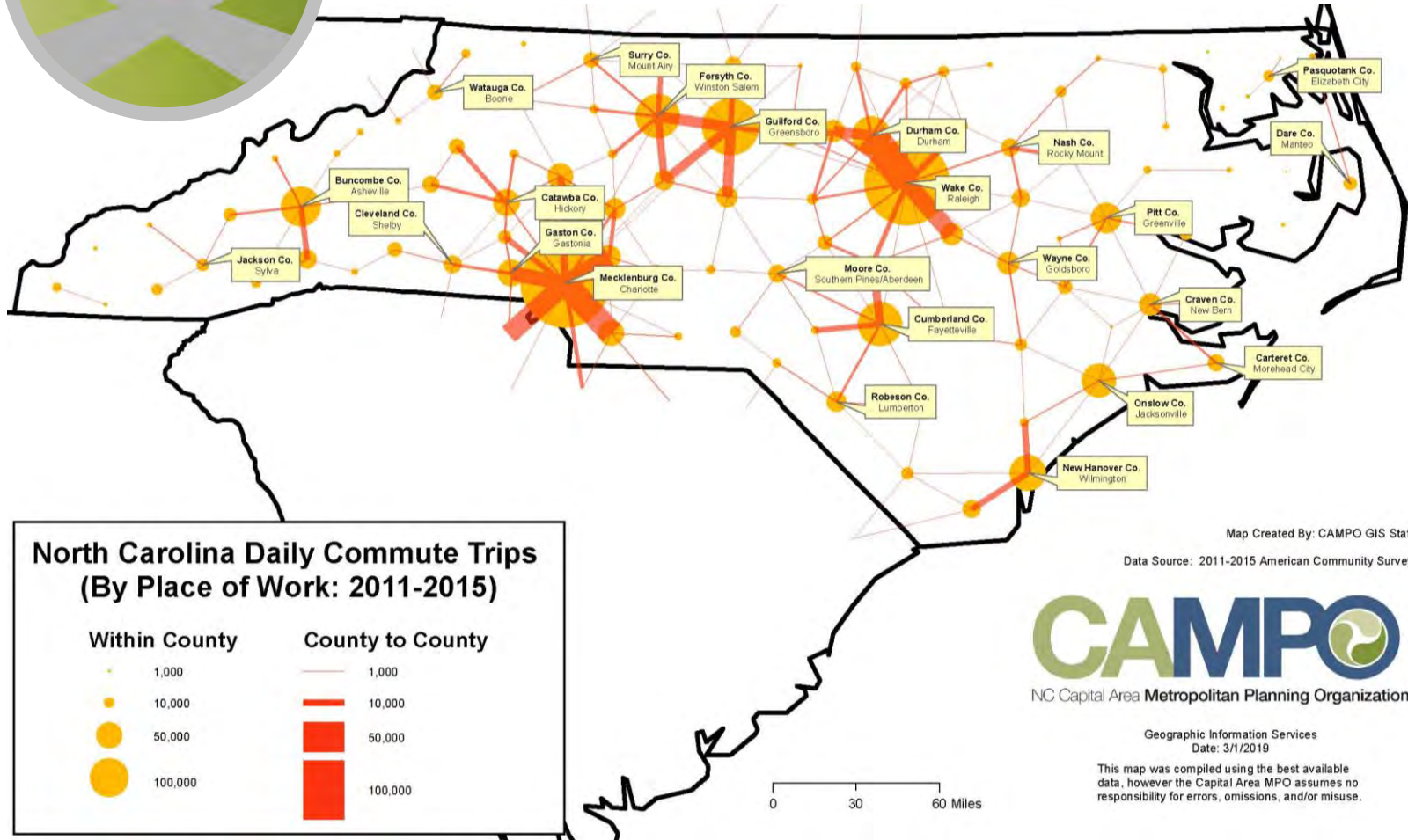

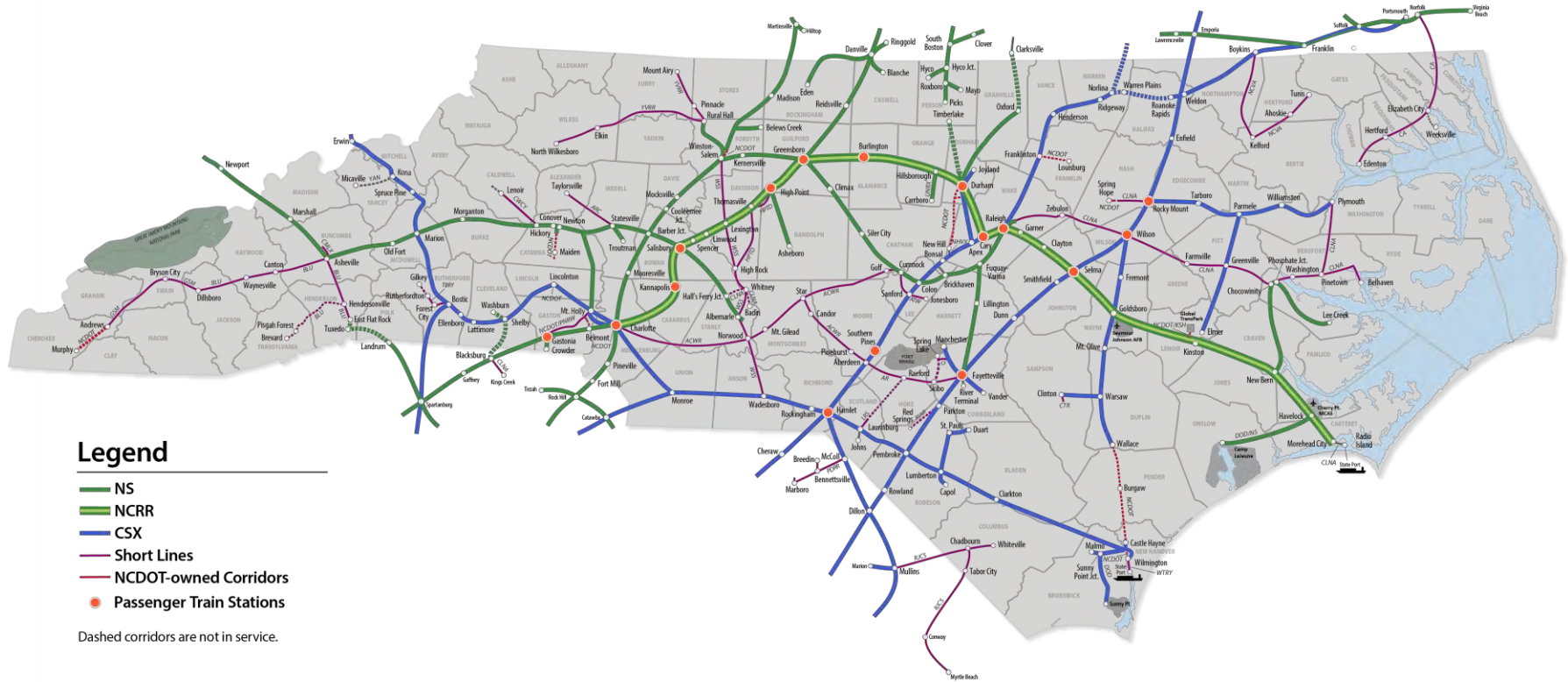

# Building Our Statewide Rail Network



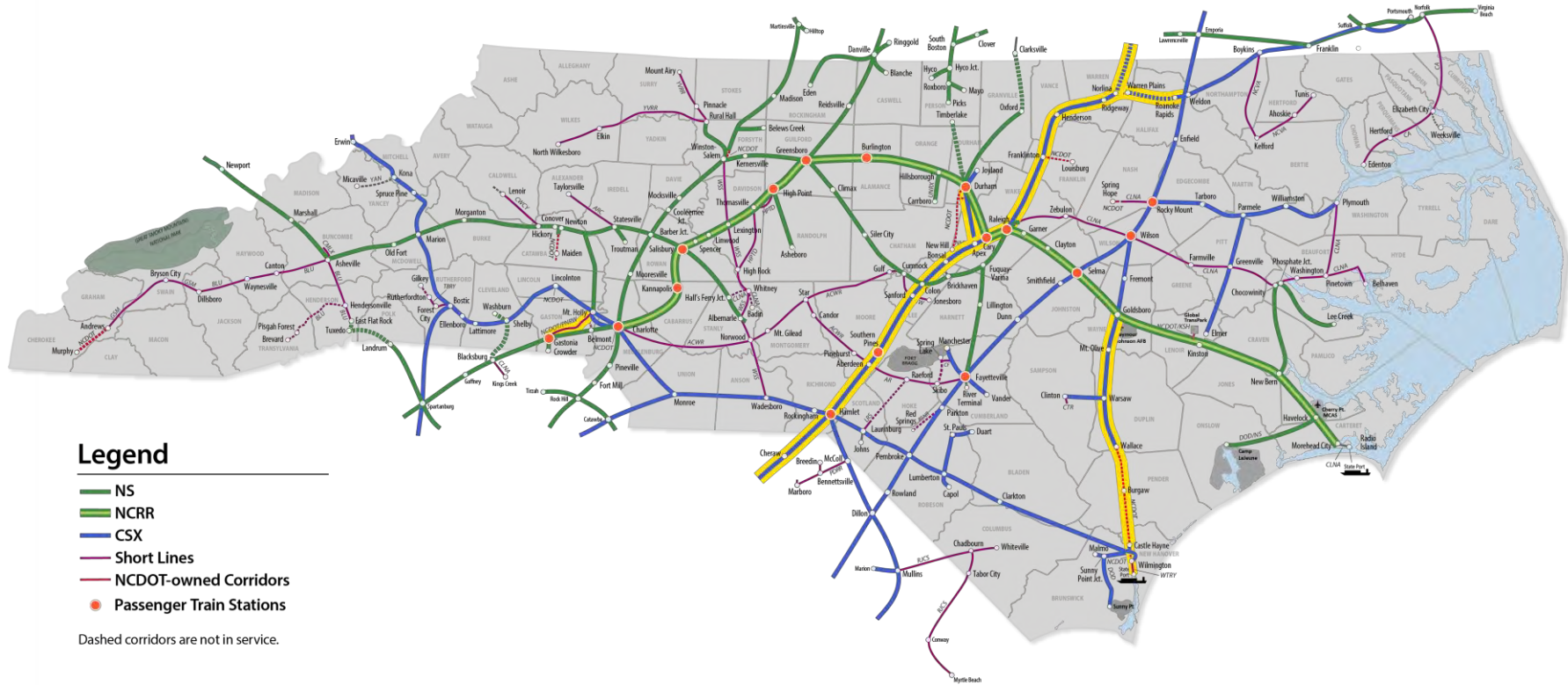
