What is the STIP?

The State Transportation Improvement Program is a document developed cooperatively by local, regional and state transportation entities. It includes a list of multi-modal transportation projects, such as highway, transit and bicycle based on the state's long-range transportation goals. The projects are drawn from and are consistent with a Statewide Long-Range Transportation Plan, Countywide Transportation Plans and Metropolitan Transportation Plans.

The projects included in the document were selected using a data-driven prioritization process created by the <u>Strategic Transportation Investment</u> Law (STI), which was passed by the General Assembly in 2013.

What is the purpose of these sessions?
