

Project Overview

N.C. 51 (Matthews Township Parkway) is currently a four-lane road with a raised median, curb and gutter and areas of sidewalk. NCDOT Division 10 plans to widen and improve approximately one mile of N.C. 51 (Matthews Township Parkway) between Sardis Road and Monroe Road/W. John Street in Matthews.

The road will be widened from four to six lanes with a raised median, intersection improvements at Monroe Road/W. John Street, Fullwood Lane, and Sardis Road, as well as pedestrian and bicycle improvements and enhancements. A partial continuous flow intersection (CFI) will be constructed at the N.C. 51 (Matthews Township Parkway) and Monroe Road/W. John Street intersection. Purpose & Need

The purpose of the proposed project is to increase capacity along N.C. 51 (Matthews Township Parkway) between Sardis Road and Monroe Road/W. John Street and to improve traffic flow at intersections.

Why Improve N.C. 51 (Matthews Township Parkway)?

The 2017 Average Annual Daily Traffic (AADT) along N.C. 51 (Matthews Township Parkway) ranges from 33,200 to 43,600 vehicles per day (vpd) within the study area making this stretch of roadway one of the busiest roadways in Matthews during peak traffic hours. Traffic forecasts for this stretch of road show up to 60,400 vpd in 2040, an increase of 92%. N.C. 51 (Matthews Township Parkway) at its intersection with Monroe Road/W. John Street currently operates at 38,400 vpd, with 2040 forecasts showing approximately 54,800 vpd.



N.C. 51 (Matthews Township Parkway) as it currently exists will not accommodate the high traffic volumes expected in the future. Without additional travel lanes and improved intersections, congestion along the corridor, especially during morning and evening rush hours, will be significant. To help minimize current congestion and accommodate the future growth in traffic, improvements are needed.

N.C. 51 (Matthews Township Parkway) Widening Project Development

As part of the State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) process, the NCDOT project team is preparing a Minimum Criteria Checklist document that examines the proposed project - including intersection and roadway improvement alternatives, costs, and impacts to the environment - in order to identify issues that may require future consideration in the planning and/or design phases. The examination and identification of potential impacts to the social, natural or cultural environments, businesses and homes within the project area allows planners and designers to minimize impacts during future design and construction phases.


Once traffic studies have identified congested areas and concepts for improving mobility, a preliminary roadway design is developed. The preliminary design will show the potential roadway alignment, proposed intersection improvements/designs and potential impacts as a result of these improvements.

This conceptual design, based upon the results of the traffic studies, is what is being presented at tonight's meeting.




What Will the Improved N.C. 51 (Matthews Township Parkway) Look Like?



N.C. 51 between Sardis Road and Monroe Road/W. John Street will be widened from four to six lanes with a sidewalk along Westbound and a shared use path along Eastbound N.C. 51.



At the intersections of Sardis Road/N.C. 51 and Fullwood Lane/N.C. 51, expanded turn lanes and additional through lanes will be added to N.C. 51. Expanded turn lanes and sidewalks will also be added to Fullwood Lane. A raised median will be added to N.C. 51 between Sardis Road and Fullwood Lane.



At N.C. 51 and Monroe Road/W. John Street, a new partial continuous flow intersection (CFI) will be constructed. Improvements along Monroe Road/W. John Street include dual rights from Southbound Monroe to Westbound N.C. 51. The intersection improvements will also include pedestrian and bike accommodations utilizing a shared use path along Eastbound N.C. 51. Sidewalk improvements along Westbound N.C. 51 will also be constructed. (Sidewalk improvements are subject to municipal agreements.)

What Is a CFI?

A continuous flow intersection (CFI), sometimes referred to as a displaced left turn intersection, is an innovative design that allows vehicles to travel more efficiently through an intersection. A CFI enhances safety and increases traffic flow through intersections by allowing left-turning traffic to move simultaneously. A CFI shifts left turning traffic to the outside edges of the road, which allows through traffic to move through the middle of an intersection simultaneously, thus increasing the number of vehicles that can navigate through the intersection in a single traffic light cycle.

While operations of a full CFI at the N.C. 51 (Matthews Township Parkway) and Monroe Road/W. John Street intersection operates the best of all the screened intersection concepts (with the Partial CFI East-West concept coming in second), the Partial CFI East-West has the least number of business displacements at nine as opposed to 10 with the full CFI. Therefore, the Partial CFI East-West concept was selected as the Recommended Alternative for the N.C. 51 (Matthews Township Parkway) and Monroe Road/W. John Street intersection.



What is Next?

After the public comment period ends on August 31, 2018, NCDOT will review all comments. Comments received will be considered and suggestions incorporated as the project design progresses.

Following any updates to the recommended alternative design from input received during the public involvement process, impacts to the social, natural and cultural environments will be assessed and a Minimum Criteria Checklist document will be prepared for review and approval by NCDOT.

Design plans will continue to be refined and advanced to right-of-way plan approval along with the submittal of necessary permits to federal and state agencies required for project construction.




