

**NCDOT TO HOLD PUBLIC MEETING  
FOR THE PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS TO FAYETTEVILLE ROAD (S.R. 1118)  
FROM WOODCROFT PARKWAY TO BARBEE ROAD (S.R. 1106)  
DURHAM COUNTY**

**STIP PROJECT NO. U-6021**

The N.C. Department of Transportation will hold a public meeting regarding the proposed project to widen Fayetteville Road from a 2-lane road to a 4-lane road with a median from Woodcroft Parkway to Barbee Road with bicycle and pedestrian accommodations. The proposed project is approximately 1.4 miles long. This project will connect to the existing 4-lane section south of Woodcroft Parkway, and the City is underway with a separate project to widen Fayetteville Road to four lanes north of Barbee Road. The meeting will take place on Thursday, December 6, from 4:30-6:30 p.m. at Berea Baptist Church located at 5011 Fayetteville Road in Durham.

The public may drop-in at any time during the meeting hours. NCDOT representatives will be available to answer questions and listen to comments regarding the project. The opportunity to submit comments will also be provided at the meeting or via phone, email, or mail by January 4, 2019. Comments received will be taken into consideration as the project develops. Please note that no formal presentation will be made.
