1	SPEAKER: All right. This is patty
2	Patrick and Rebecca Toeser. This is September 25th
3	and we're facilitating the meeting for the DOT
4	facilitators. All right.
5	The first question that we have oh,
6	it's on the other side. With one word, Rebecca's
7	going to capture on here, with one word what do you
8	feel best describes the most important thing to
9	you, or your household, or business that must be
10	considered for this project? One word. This is
11	just to get us started.
12	SPEAKER: Traffic.
13	SPEAKER: Traffic.
14	SPEAKER: Safety.
15	SPEAKER: Safety.
16	SPEAKER: I was going to say traffic
17	transportation, yeah.
18	SPEAKER: Traffic? We'll use hashtags,
19	so that way that's two for that for both of
20	those. Yeah.
21	SPEAKER: Access.
22	SPEAKER: Access. Is there anything?
23	SPEAKER: Pedestrians.
24	SPEAKER: Okay. For question one, we
25	have traffic, safety, access, and pedestrians.

1	All right.
2	Question two. What do you believe is
3	needed to ensure the safety of your family, the
4	people who live in your area and the people who
5	travel through your area? So that's kind of a
6	three-part question. What do you believe is needed
7	to ensure the safety of your family, the people who
8	live in your area and the people that travel
9	through your area?
10	SPEAKER: One word?
11	SPEAKER: No. More.
12	SPEAKER: Now, you can express anything
13	that you want to it's a game. We were just
14	we were warming up our vocal cords together as a
15	group.
16	SPEAKER: Whatever, you'd like to say.
17	SPEAKER: Vehicular speed on Ridge Road.
18	SPEAKER: So what specifically, if we
19	want to be as specific as possible? What
20	specifically about the speed?
21	SPEAKER: Limiting vehicular speed on
22	Ridge Road.
23	SPEAKER: Okay. Thank you.
24	SPEAKER: I would say the volume the
25	volume of traffic coming through the neighborhood

1	on on Ridge Road.
2	SPEAKER: On Ridge Road?
3	SPEAKER: Right.
4	SPEAKER: The volume of traffic on Ridge
5	Road.
6	SPEAKER: Is this a and I may be
7	getting a little nit-picky here, but is this a
8	question about safety? Safety of the family,
9	safety of the people who live in the area and
10	safety of the people who travel to the area?
11	SPEAKER: Yes. Yes.
12	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
13	SPEAKER: Okay. All right.
14	SPEAKER: This is
15	SPEAKER: Just safety questions? Okay.
16	Got it.
17	SPEAKER: Yes. Now, you should be be
18	particular.
19	SPEAKER: Okay.
20	SPEAKER: And when you said the volume of
21	traffic on Ridge Road, you also mean you said
22	something about the neighborhoods alongside? Are
23	you talking about the the volume of traffic on
24	the side roads as well or just Ridge?
25	Neighborhoods, everything?

1		SPEAKER:	It's roads that that could
2	be impacte	d with add	ditional traffic as a result of
3	the constr	uction.	
4		SPEAKER:	Okay. During construction and
5	then after	construc	tion?
6		SPEAKER:	Exactly.
7		SPEAKER:	Both?
8		SPEAKER:	Both.
9		SPEAKER:	Okay. Okay.
10		SPEAKER:	I was
11		SPEAKER:	Add those on that I'm not
12	concerned	about dur	ing construction, but after the
13	project, s	pecifical	ly Glen Eden Road, which is
14	already a	cut-throu	gh from Glenwood Avenue to Blue
15	Ridge so -	_	
16		SPEAKER:	And what road was that again?
17		SPEAKER:	Glen Eden.
18		SPEAKER:	Glen Eden.
19		SPEAKER:	Okay.
20		SPEAKER:	What about at Lake Boone?
21		SPEAKER:	And Lake Boone would be the
22	same conce	rn?	
23		SPEAKER:	It's a similar, like, access to
24	440. [Ina	udible].	
25		SPEAKER:	So people are using it as a

1	secondary road when the traffic is bad?
2	SPEAKER: Uh-huh. Right.
3	SPEAKER: Okay.
4	SPEAKER: That's like with the the
5	image that they have here like, Ridge Road is not
6	like the road up to there, but it's how far that
7	study area goes down Ridge because it seems like
8	they're more concerned with Edwards Mill and
9	Creedmoor and further down Glenwood.
10	SPEAKER: [Inaudible].
11	SPEAKER: Yeah, that gives them more
12	specific
13	SPEAKER: This is more specific.
14	SPEAKER: Right.
15	SPEAKER: [Inaudible].
16	SPEAKER: So there's Glen Eden and they
17	have the study area in here. So here's the road
18	she's concerned about.
19	SPEAKER: Okay.
20	SPEAKER: And Lake Boone is further down
21	Ridge.
22	SPEAKER: Right.
23	SPEAKER: So it's not actually in the
24	study area, but it's going to be impacted because
25	of the study area.

1	SPEAKER: Like, the study area only
2	really includes like the ramp that goes on the 440,
3	it looks like.
4	SPEAKER: Okay. So we want to
5	specifically say beyond the study area.
6	SPEAKER: Right.
7	SPEAKER: Yep.
8	SPEAKER: [Inaudible].
9	SPEAKER: Are there any other concerns
10	that have not been communicated?
11	SPEAKER: Safety concerns.
12	SPEAKER: Yep. Safety concerns. Let me
13	just repeat one more time. For your family, for
14	the people who live in the area and then anyone
15	whose traveling through the area, did we capture
16	SPEAKER: I would just like to be sure
17	that what gets put in is not too convoluted. It's
18	easy to, you know, drive and interchange streets.
19	Like, you know, it's something new and I'm not like
20	where do I need to go. It's easy enough to
21	navigate.
22	SPEAKER: Navigate?
23	SPEAKER: The the simplicity you
24	want simplicity in the plan?
25	SPEAKER: Yeah.

T	SPEAKER: Okay.
2	SPEAKER: You know, I don't want to get
3	in a wreck because I'm confused, for instance.
4	SPEAKER: Reduce confusion traffic
5	confusion.
6	SPEAKER: And another comment that builds
7	on that is maintaining emergency vehicle access to
8	this neighborhood. Some conversations that other
9	meetings have talked about, you know, if Ridge Road
10	is terminated at the northern end, that will
11	could potentially increase response time for fire,
12	ambulance, EMT, so just
13	SPEAKER: Any any emergency vehicles
14	
15	SPEAKER: any access time or response
16	time is not negatively impacted for the
17	neighborhood.
18	SPEAKER: And what particular area were
19	you mentioning?
20	SPEAKER: I'm talking about the in the
21	community impact.
22	SPEAKER: Okay.
23	SPEAKER: In the community impact.
2 4	SPEAKER: So along Ridge Road where
25	emergency vehicles would use Ridge Road.

1	SPEAKER: Un-nun.
2	SPEAKER: Okay.
3	SPEAKER: The other thing that's not
4	related, but that something else that I think is
5	needed to ensure my family safety and my neighbor's
6	safety is that they are no impacts to the schools
7	and to the pre-schools along Ridge Road. So there
8	are two public schools and I believe there are four
9	pre-schools
10	SPEAKER: Okay.
11	SPEAKER: Okay.
12	SPEAKER: located on Ridge Road in
13	the community impact.
14	SPEAKER: Okay. And that's a different
15	that's a separate section.
16	SPEAKER: Yeah. But I'm going to note
17	that.
18	SPEAKER: Yep. Community impact. Do you
19	feel like, for question two, we've captured the
20	safety issues? Are there any additional safety
21	issues?
22	SPEAKER: Well, do I don't know if we
23	want to get into in different types of
24	individuals that could be impacted because Ridge
25	Road has bike lanes on both on both sides, so

Τ	and a lot of people are cycling and a lot of people
2	are now using these bird scooters
3	SPEAKER: Yep.
4	SPEAKER: up and down the roads, so
5	Ridge Road is unique in that it has bike lanes on
6	both sides.
7	SPEAKER: Different types of traffic?
8	SPEAKER: Exactly.
9	SPEAKER: Okay. The diversity of of
10	traffic. So pedestrians, scooters?
11	SPEAKER: Cyclists.
12	SPEAKER: Cyclists.
13	SPEAKER: It's also a conduit for the
14	greenway. So the House Creek Greenway that that
15	goes, you know, you can access it as the base of
16	Ridge Road at 440. You can also access it at Glen
17	Eden.
18	SPEAKER: Glen Eden.
19	SPEAKER: Close to Ridge Road. They're a
20	lot of pedestrians and cyclists who travel Ridge
21	Road to get to the greenway, and there's, you know,
22	just much more pedestrian foot and bike traffic
23	than I think there are on other roads in the area.
24	SPEAKER: Okay. Yep. Do you feel good
25	about that one? Okay. We will have an opportunity

Ţ	to come back if you guys think of something as
2	other questions come up.
3	Three. Is there a specific valuable
4	community asset, something important to the
5	community or the neighborhood located within the
6	project zone that you are concerned will be
7	impacted? If so, what is it and how do you believe
8	it will be impacted?
9	So now we're talking specifically it
10	this is a confusing question a little bit
11	because community, what is the community to you,
12	but we are talking about the project area. So this
13	is the project area.
14	SPEAKER: You're talking about the
15	physical asset?
16	SPEAKER: Is there an asset? And
17	whatever you decide is the asset is the asset,
18	whether it's physical or something else so
19	SPEAKER: Yeah, I would say bike lines.
20	SPEAKER: Okay. Bike lines.
21	SPEAKER: I would say just overall
22	pedestrian flow whether it's school kids or dog
23	walkers or joggers or all all the above is a
24	huge asset that that's that's affected to be
25	a problem.

1	SPEAKER: Okay. Foot traffic, in
2	general, is what I'm hearing there. Just the foot
3	traffic that's
4	SPEAKER: Huge.
5	SPEAKER: Yeah. School, like schools and
6	churches.
7	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
8	SPEAKER: Okay.
9	SPEAKER: I would say House Creek as a
LO	SPEAKER: House Creek as a [inaudible]?
11	SPEAKER: It's not. It's a it's a
12	stream.
13	SPEAKER: Okay.
L 4	SPEAKER: It's part of Crabtree Creek,
L5	but also list Crabtree Creek. So both of those
L 6	being, you know, they absorb stormwater.
L7	SPEAKER: Okay. In environmental
18	impact?
L9	SPEAKER: Yeah. They can provide
20	ecosystems services there, water quality. Their
21	features that are part of the greenway, in fact,
22	that they attract people to that. They provide,
23	you know, a place to, you know, be active, reduce
24	stress. You know, there are a lot of quality a
25	lot of services that they provide, environmental

Τ	physical, emotional maybe even. The road
2	construction and housing and commercial
3	construction in Wade County does not really do
4	[inaudible] for water quality. There's so much
5	runoff, it's really hard to navigate the reporting
6	process. Neighbors see, you know, just sheets of
7	mud flowing off a property. They don't know who to
8	call. They have trouble just navigating that
9	complaint process or knowing which statutes maybe
10	are being violated. I think that we're at a
11	disadvantage when it comes to that as concerned
12	citizens. So I just
13	SPEAKER: Not knowing like where to
14	advocate or who to advocate, like
15	SPEAKER: Yeah.
16	SPEAKER: The process.
17	SPEAKER: It's just a it's [inaudible]
18	
19	SPEAKER: The recording process and
20	getting information.
21	SPEAKER: You see a lot of it on Facebook
22	or Next Door or Twitter, but I don't know that it's
23	ever actually getting to a place where it's
24	effective, so I think it's just
25	SPEAKER: It's like the accountability

1	for the construction services?
2	SPEAKER: Yeah.
3	SPEAKER: Yeah. That
4	SPEAKER: So can I is it fair to say
5	that you want a clear process for reporting and
6	getting information about the construction process
7	when something is not happening the way that you
8	believe it should be or it's impacting the area in
9	an unusually harmful way?
10	SPEAKER: I think that [inaudible] the
11	construction process and post-construction.
12	SPEAKER: And post-construction.
13	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
14	SPEAKER: The process to report and
15	retrieve information for accountability purposes.
16	SPEAKER: Right. And I think also just
17	in this planning and design phase, you know, having
18	some protections in place, telling us what you are
19	going to do so that House Creek and Crabtree Creek
20	don't fill up with sediment, you know? Or you know
21	that it be really nice if you don't have to report
22	anything.
23	SPEAKER: Right.
24	SPEAKER: But the construction just
25	happens in an environmentally respectful way.

1	SPEAKER: If you were competent.
2	SPEAKER: Okay.
3	SPEAKER: So being confident that they're
4	putting things in place, so you don't have to have
5	those incidents? Are there any other valuable
6	community assets? Do you want to review what has
7	been said?
8	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
9	SPEAKER: I think the just the
10	Greenway itself too. So
11	SPEAKER: Okay.
12	SPEAKER: Why don't you
13	SPEAKER: So I have two public schools,
14	four pre-schools as a community asset. Greenway,
15	bike lanes, pedestrian flow, foot traffic is huge.
16	Churches. I listed House Creek and Crabtree Creek
17	features that are part of the Greenway. Commercial
18	construction versus water quality in the area.
19	Accountability of the construction process and
20	post-construction, will there be protection in
21	place? And also environmental integrity of the
22	area. Does that spur any other thoughts?
23	SPEAKER: Does everybody feel like your
24	concern has been captured? Okay.
25	So guestion four from your perspective

1	what are some of the most problematic traffic and
2	pedestrian problems that need to be addressed? If
3	you can be specific about intersections, directions
4	and time of day that is very, very helpful.
5	SPEAKER: That whole interchange at Ridge
6	Road and 440, it gets kind of confusing with some
7	of the signs, I know. I can't really that's not
8	[inaudible] depending to certain time of day, it's
9	just a kind of, a weird intersection. So Ridge
10	Road accessing 440.
11	And you can say the traffic build up
12	there; there's like peak hours, so like 7:00 to
13	9:00 and 4:00 to 6:00, I guess. It gets pretty
14	hectic over there. And that's just not even people
15	who live in the community, that's just people
16	trying to access Wade or something like that.
17	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
18	SPEAKER: Yeah. The the major thing
19	we see is rush hour traffic that is using Ridge
20	Road as a as a cut-through to bypass traffic on
21	440.
22	SPEAKER: And then they speed
23	[inaudible].
24	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
25	SPEAKER: And two things to mention would

1	be the intersection at Glen Eden and the Lake Boone
2	Trail. The lack of turn arrows in most directions
3	means that people turn on red.
4	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
5	SPEAKER: Or they turn before the light
6	is green or after the light is red I mean, if
7	there's it leads to unsafe
8	SPEAKER: You said lack of?
9	SPEAKER: Lack of it's turn arrows.
10	SPEAKER: Directional arrows.
11	SPEAKER: Turn arrows?
12	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
13	SPEAKER: And those
14	SPEAKER: So you're northbound on Ridge
15	Road trying to turn left on Glen Eden. There's no
16	left turn lane. If you're on Glen Eden going
17	eastbound, there is a turn arrow, so that is
18	helpful. So you know, that'll happen, but then
19	there's a really large back up on Ridge Road, folks
20	can't turn, so then they start, you know, going
21	around or cutting through the neighborhood to avoid
22	that intersection. There's just a lot of traffic
23	and already and and some
24	SPEAKER: What is the name of do you
25	know the name of that neighborhood is that you're

1	referring to?
2	SPEAKER: Where where the cut through
3	is happening?
4	SPEAKER: Where you said they cut
5	through. Uh-huh.
6	SPEAKER: It happens on Tyson. It
7	happens on; I can look it up. It's West something.
8	SPEAKER: Westwood?
9	SPEAKER: On from the other side. On
10	the west side of Ridge Road.
11	SPEAKER: We'll let you look that up.
12	SPEAKER: I should know that.
13	SPEAKER: Is is there any other areas
14	where specifics, intersections, time of day or
15	directions?
16	SPEAKER: Westmoreland.
17	SPEAKER: I'd say the the intersection
18	at Ridge and Blue Ridge? No, Lake Boone. I'm
19	sorry.
20	SPEAKER: Okay.
21	SPEAKER: The intersection of Ridge Road
22	and Lake Boone. There's a tremendous amount of
23	kids during school hours, right at that
24	intersection.
25	SPEAKER: Yeah.

1	SPEAKER: Walking?
2	SPEAKER: Walking.
3	SPEAKER: Okay.
4	SPEAKER: And that's obviously morning
5	and morning and afternoon.
6	SPEAKER: I was just going to ask, both
7	times of day?
8	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
9	SPEAKER: Pickup and drop-off.
10	SPEAKER: There's a stretch of Ridge Road
11	where there are no sidewalks and there still a lot
12	of pedestrians.
13	SPEAKER: Do you know where that is?
14	SPEAKER: That's north of Lake Boone,
15	north of Airline Drive at the intersection with
16	Glen Eden. There are no sidewalks. There are two
17	crossing locations, but not full not you
18	don't get the walk on all four.
19	SPEAKER: [Inaudible]. Uh-huh.
20	SPEAKER: There also are no sidewalks on
21	the west side of Glen Eden and Ridge Road. And
22	this has always bothered me, particularly because
23	you have to go down Glen Eden to get to the
24	Greenway. So there's they've added bike lanes
25	on the east side of Glen Eden There's also a

1	sidewalk there when you crossover Ridge Road on
2	Glen Eden, there's no sidewalk and no bike lane
3	until you get down the hill. And then there's a
4	bike lane on one side, but not on the other side.
5	And so there is, kind of, a blind hill
6	that pedestrians have to navigate, cyclists as
7	well. Lots of families with small people in tow.
8	I have a concern about increased traffic there as a
9	result of the project and just, you know, greater
10	risks for folks trying to use the Greenway system.
11	SPEAKER: And this is during and after
12	construction.
13	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
14	SPEAKER: Yeah. During and after.
15	SPEAKER: During and after depending
16	upon, you know, what the traffic flow looks like
17	after all of this mess is done.
18	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
19	SPEAKER: Uh-huh. There are also school
20	bus routes that use Glen Eden and Ridge Road and
21	have to stop where there are no sidewalks or bike
22	lanes for crossings. People drive 55 - 60 miles an
23	hour on Glen Eden, and so that's already an unsafe
24	road.
25	SPEAKER: For the buses, specifically

1	you're talking about.
2	SPEAKER: For for for pedestrians
3	or cyclists and and bus traffic.
4	SPEAKER: Anybody else? Did we capture
5	everything for that question that you wanted us to
6	hear? Sir, was there something?
7	SPEAKER: No, I I agree, totally agree
8	with, you know, that's more of a city problem than
9	a DOT problem. I I personally complained
10	several times to the city about there being no
11	sidewalk on Glen Eden. Somebody will get killed at
12	that corner before it's all over.
13	SPEAKER: This is a good opportunity
14	actually to address those things, because the
15	engineers will be hearing all the the additional
16	things that are impacting. I don't know what will
17	come of that, but this is a good opportunity to
18	voice that also.
19	SPEAKER: When you talk to the city about
20	that, they say that is a pre-lane road. We only
21	deal with two-lane roads as far as cyclists goes.
22	You been through that yet?
23	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
24	SPEAKER: I've been through it twice and
25	

1	SPEAKER: And I entered it on
2	SeeClickFix, and it's in the like hundreds, so
3	they've also told me that it is on the list of
4	improvements. It's just not anywhere near the top,
5	but I guess it would be important to to clarify
6	that. My concern is that existing problems may be
7	exacerbated by changes in traffic that result from
8	this.
9	SPEAKER: That was what I was just going
10	to say.
11	SPEAKER: [Inaudible].
12	SPEAKER: That's what I was thinking
13	about.
14	SPEAKER: More cars, people driving
15	faster, you know, commuting cut-through. Not
16	SPEAKER: The current issues that you
17	already have will increase?
18	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
19	SPEAKER: Yep? Yep. Okay.
20	SPEAKER: Okay. Fair enough.
21	SPEAKER: Should we take into
22	consideration like Wade where it comes into Ridge
23	'cause that's backs that's the turn I take to go
24	homecoming from like Arts Imperious. So like that
25	little turn backs up sometimes all way to the

Ι	interchange of 440, so that causes some problems.
2	SPEAKER: Okay. So that was on?
3	SPEAKER: Wade.
4	SPEAKER: Wade to Ridge?
5	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
6	SPEAKER: Wade to Ridge, yeah. Got to
7	get into the right lane to go around at a certain
8	time of day or you just
9	SPEAKER: Get stuck?
10	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
11	SPEAKER: Or you're waiting to turn left
12	and you're not in the left lane.
13	SPEAKER: Yeah, yeah, exactly.
14	SPEAKER: It's a free-flowing lane, so
15	somebody's going to come up and rear-end you.
16	SPEAKER: Somebody's come and rear-end
17	you
18	SPEAKER: Yeah.
19	SPEAKER: because it's like a hazard
20	for both people 'cause like
21	SPEAKER: Yes.
22	SPEAKER: It says
23	SPEAKER: and then other people I know
24	wait in line, and they try to cut out, but a lot of
25	times you like, can't see when the cars are coming

Τ	up because cars are coming, you know, still 60
2	miles an hour right passed where they're supposed
3	to be 45 so
4	SPEAKER: Uh-huh. Uh-huh. Any other
5	specifics that you want us to capture? Okay.
6	We'll go to question five.
7	What additional one or two things are
8	important things to your household business you
9	want considered as this project moves forward?
10	This is really what is not in the questions that
11	you want to voice.
12	SPEAKER: Get ready to write.
13	SPEAKER: Okay.
14	SPEAKER: There is another project that
15	the DOT is implementing that would widen I-440
16	further down from the the area there. And what
17	
18	SPEAKER: Can you say where that is? Do
19	you
20	SPEAKER: Yeah, it's down near Meredith
21	down near Meredith College. That area.
22	SPEAKER: Okay.
23	SPEAKER: That that part of 440
24	SPEAKER: From Wade to [inaudible]
25	SPEAKER: is going to be widened, and

1	what people can do or what they will do is, as that
2	project is being done, they'll cut off the Beltline
3	and cut onto Ridge Road to bypass that stretch
4	that's being put under construction. So yeah, this
5	is one project, but other projects that are pending
6	could severely impact this area.
7	SPEAKER: Is it a pending project or is
8	it am approved project?
9	SPEAKER: Approved.
10	SPEAKER: It's approved.
11	SPEAKER: Okay.
12	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
13	SPEAKER: It's approved. Yeah.
14	SPEAKER: Okay.
15	SPEAKER: So that's an
16	SPEAKER: [Inaudible] detour on this, I
17	guess.
18	SPEAKER: Yes.
19	SPEAKER: Yes, that's true.
20	SPEAKER: They'll use Ridge as a detour
21	all the way through and and it's it happens
22	today when there's a backup there. They they
23	come off of of the Beltline onto Ridge Road.
24	SPEAKER: One thing we've talked about at
25	other community meeting related to that 440

Τ	widening from wade to to house it is the impacts
2	to traffic on 440 that will happen, not just during
3	the construction, but after that is completed. And
4	having those data available to inform this project.
5	But this project is started, it's signed before
6	that project is finished and we understand how
7	traffic might change, you know, we're it seems
8	like we're we just don't have all the
9	information that we might, if we waited for that
LO	project to finish.
11	SPEAKER: So timing of other projects?
12	SPEAKER: Uh-huh. Which we'll certainly
13	have in a fact on here.
L 4	SPEAKER: Like, if there was a traffic
L5	forecast, for like that project. Like they're
L 6	thinking about this project when they make that
L7	forecast.
L8	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
L 9	SPEAKER: So make yeah.
20	SPEAKER: Any other additional things
21	that we have not asked about?
22	SPEAKER: One thing that I heard about is
23	a program that the City of Raleigh has called the
24	Safe Routes for Schools.
25	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.

1	SPEAKER: And it's a traffic impacted
2	project that the schools request for their
3	surrounding access roads.
4	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
5	SPEAKER: Has DOT looked at that? Are
6	there changes that the city can make to help with
7	traffic around the schools in a community impact
8	project area that would make us, as neighbors and
9	residents, more comfortable with this bigger
10	project?
11	SPEAKER: Okay.
12	SPEAKER: I just haven't heard any
13	connection between the two. I don't understand how
14	[inaudible]
15	SPEAKER: So are they talking to each
16	other is what you're asking?
17	SPEAKER: Right.
18	SPEAKER: Yes.
19	SPEAKER: Okay.
20	SPEAKER: That's kind of coming off the
21	projects talking to each other. Like if those
22	projects are
23	SPEAKER: In separate bubbles?
24	SPEAKER: Yeah.
25	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.

1	SPEAKER: Yeah.
2	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
3	SPEAKER: Okay. We because we have
4	time, I'm going to go to the next question and then
5	we're going to review and just make sure that if
6	there's anything else you that has come up, I
7	want to give you plenty of time I don't want to
8	keep you any longer than we need too. But I want
9	to give you plenty of time.
10	The last question is basically how can
11	the DOT demonstrate being a partner with the
12	community, the stakeholders while tackling the
13	complex transportation challenges created by rapid
14	urban growth in Wake County? So how do you
15	perceive the relationship with the DOT to the
16	community improving? What would what steps
17	would you suggest the DOT take, so there is a
18	greater partnership?
19	SPEAKER: Additional steps? I mean,
20	they're already taken quite a few this, you
21	know?
22	SPEAKER: Yep. What additional steps
23	like, you have suggestions?
24	SPEAKER: The shouldn't be compelled to
25	spend money just because they have money. It seems

1	like the DOTs gotten budget and they're actively
2	looking for ways to spend it before that money is
3	reallocated somewhere else.
4	SPEAKER: Okay.
5	SPEAKER: So it seems like they're
6	they're finding things to do as opposed to reacting
7	to to real problems.
8	SPEAKER: Okay.
9	SPEAKER: Kind of in that same thing, one
10	of my neighbors is in engineering and he does
11	highly designing stuff. I don't know if his firm
12	is one of three.
13	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
14	SPEAKER: That's kind of a separate
15	thing. But it would be nice to know who they
16	who the three are. He has said that they're
17	that DOT is required to address this. That the
18	interchange distance there, when you're getting
19	onto 440 from Glenwood and getting off 440 on Ridge
20	Road, there's a name for that little come together
21	piece. It's too short that it's something they're
22	being forced to address in a very narrow timeframe,
23	but that is something that I had from my neighbor.
24	Not something I've read on the DOT website
25	SPEAKER: Do you know why?

1	SPEAKER: Yeah. It'd be nice to have
2	some justification.
3	SPEAKER: Yeah. What's the what's the
4	forcing function? What the forcing function?
5	SPEAKER: Okay.
6	SPEAKER: And is that truth? Is that a
7	rumor? It sounds legit.
8	SPEAKER: You don't know though.
9	SPEAKER: Don't know. So I I just
10	think that there's a lot of information about the
11	need for this project that could be that could
12	be a little more transparent or more detailed
13	about. And I think the same is true of a lot of
14	this process.
15	SPEAKER: Okay.
16	SPEAKER: There's there's some folks
17	who have information and there's some other folks
18	who don't. So I think the maybe [inaudible] of
19	the information channels or trying different
20	formats or just doing a better job of reaching
21	everyone.
22	SPEAKER: Okay.
23	SPEAKER: Not relying on the CACs to do
24	that.
25	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.

1	SPEAKER: Because that is not working.
2	SPEAKER: Okay. What is a CAC?
3	SPEAKER: That's the Committee
4	SPEAKER: Committee Action
5	SPEAKER: Action.
6	SPEAKER: Action Committee, I think. I
7	think that's it.
8	SPEAKER: Oh, so that's
9	SPEAKER: Neighborhood
10	SPEAKER: that's an external
11	organization that is trying to inform the citizens,
12	but it doesn't have all the information?
13	SPEAKER: And mostly those are linked to
14	City Council, so that's through the city.
15	SPEAKER: Okay.
16	SPEAKER: So there's a layer there that,
17	in some for some issues, works pretty well and
18	then, in this instance, I don't think that it is
19	is working well.
20	SPEAKER: Is this particular form
21	helpful? What we're doing today?
22	SPEAKER: Yeah, it's [inaudible].
23	SPEAKER: Oh, absolutely. I'm sure
24	they're other other rooms with other and better
25	ideas, right? And you bring them all together

1	they'll have something to chew on for sure.
2	SPEAKER: Do you like this process?
3	SPEAKER: I wish we had more information.
4	SPEAKER: Okay. Before this process?
5	SPEAKER: It would be it would be
6	SPEAKER: Yeah.
7	SPEAKER: better to have seen a plan
8	or a set of plans that we could react to.
9	SPEAKER: Okay.
10	SPEAKER: As opposed, you know,
11	everybody's trying to get their issue in when in
12	fact over time it might not be an issue.
13	SPEAKER: Overwhelmed?
14	SPEAKER: Yeah.
15	SPEAKER: Okay.
16	SPEAKER: Yeah.
17	SPEAKER: So you
18	SPEAKER: So we need to have we need
19	to repeat this exercise once we have those up to
20	nine designs.
21	SPEAKER: Yes. Exactly. So everybody's
22	clear, that you will get to review the plans? And
23	all the plans are submitted by the engineers, you
24	will get access to and then we'll be getting your
25	feedback

T	SPEAKER: UN-NUN.
2	SPEAKER: I don't know if it's going to
3	exactly look like this, but there'll be another
4	opportunity to give feedback to those plans and the
5	unknowns always are the things that are challenging
6	for everybody because they are. Because they're
7	unknown.
8	SPEAKER: And I think some form of, you
9	know, like accountability for that this forum
10	actually did something, you know? It's one thing
11	to air grievances, or thoughts or anything, but,
12	you know, down the road
13	SPEAKER: Do they actually hear us?
14	SPEAKER: Yeah. You know, we talk about
15	this, but was anything done in response, you know?
16	Like pointing to say oh, a lot of people said this
17	and this that, so we changed as a result instead of
18	just like well we had a hearing
19	SPEAKER: To check the box?
20	SPEAKER: Yeah. And then like, you know,
21	no one knows what the hearing did to the project.
22	SPEAKER: So one of the things that we're
23	supposed
24	SPEAKER: {Inaudible].
25	SPEAKER: to assure you of, as

1	ractificators, is exactly this is all captured.
2	It's it's not being all captured and just sent
3	to the DOT. What's happening it's being captured,
4	and Partners for Impact are then doing a report
5	including all of these recordings, all of that, and
6	they're going to report on themes.
7	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
8	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
9	SPEAKER: All the themes that have been
LO	captured in every room and so that will all be done
11	in a report that's transparent that you can see
12	before the plans. I think they said November 1st?
13	SPEAKER: They'll have it live, yeah, the
L 4	first of November.
15	SPEAKER: The 1st of November.
16	SPEAKER: The report will be posted on
L7	the website that where
L8	SPEAKER: Yes.
L9	SPEAKER: Okay.
20	SPEAKER: Yeah.
21	SPEAKER: November 1st and so you'll
22	get to see and hear to the depth you're interested
23	in what this actually captured. Not only this
24	session, all the sessions that have taken place and
25	will take place. So the last one is Saturday.

Ţ	boes that kind of help with what you were just
2	saying?
3	SPEAKER: Yeah. I mean, I just wanted to
4	make sure that going that we could look at
5	something ourselves like the report like you
6	mentioned.
7	SPEAKER: Yeah.
8	SPEAKER: And the recordings if you
9	wanted to.
10	SPEAKER: That would be a tedious
11	process.
12	SPEAKER: Want other general comments, at
13	this point?
14	SPEAKER: Sure.
15	SPEAKER: Okay. So if we we all know
16	that we're going to go through two or three years
17	of hell here, as they do this project at the
18	Ridge Road will just be chock-full, you know, we'll
19	somehow survive that, I guess. I'm not sure
20	everybody will, but I'd liked to know from a
21	long-term perspective, is what are the goals of DOT
22	and the city to decrease the traffic on Ridge Road
23	by by this freeing the bottleneck?
24	SPEAKER: Okay.
25	SPEAKER: I feel like that's a hard one.

1	I feel like traffic is just in general is going to
2	increase in Raleigh. I
3	SPEAKER: [Inaudible].
4	SPEAKER: I mean I seen and you're
5	you're probably right, but but one of the,
6	you know, is that one of the goals, you know?
7	SPEAKER: What are the goals?
8	SPEAKER: I mean, if you're going to
9	if you're going to enlarge 440 from four lanes to
LO	six or eight lanes, you would think gee that would
11	be a good thing. And traffic on these other roads
L2	would decrease. My other comment is, you know, as
L3	as a community here our one nuclear option might
L 4	be, which you alluded to a while ago, is to go
L5	through the safety what what you do call it?
L 6	What what was it
L7	SPEAKER: At the assessment?
L8	SPEAKER: the schools to the cities
L 9	and put speed humps and a lower speed limit on
20	Ridge Road and is the is that something that the
21	DOT is going to consider if we squeeze off the flow
22	of traffic on Ridge Road for that for that means
23	is that that will sure do it.
24	SPEAKER: Yeah.

SPEAKER: Can you drive six -- 45 miles

Τ	an nour over a speed numps to
2	SPEAKER: Yeah. My my now, that
3	I'm thinking about this whole process, these
4	questions don't seem specific enough to provide the
5	DOT with guidance on what to do and what not to do,
6	right? So it doesn't seem as if I can say my
7	recommendation is XY and Z. Or I don't want this
8	road connected to that road.
9	SPEAKER: Okay.
LO	SPEAKER: It's not specific enough and
L1	there some things that that I think should be
12	done and should not be done to help with with
13	traffic on Ridge Road.
L 4	SPEAKER: If you know those things you
L5	can either write them on this or you can write them
L 6	on a piece of paper and we can submit that.
L7	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
L8	SPEAKER: So that is an option for you.
L 9	So I don't know if you came prepared to do that.
20	SPEAKER: Well, yeah. There's just I
21	it's just a couple of very quick things.
22	SPEAKER: So I think if if you would
23	like to write those things down, we're going to
24	give you the we have time. So
25	SPEAKER: Okay.

1	SPEAKER: we'll let you do that.
2	SPEAKER: And I don't know if anybody
3	wants to hear what what I think?
4	SPEAKER: Yeah, absolutely.
5	SPEAKER: Go ahead.
6	SPEAKER: I mean I I kind of like
7	part of question three unless I feel like
8	SPEAKER: Yeah, it's part of it, but it
9	doesn't say, you know, what what would like to
10	see, what would you not like to see when it comes
11	to roads, right? It seems to me that that
12	that the project on widening I-440, right? If you
13	want to decrease traffic on Ridge Road, is you take
14	the flyover, over Ridge Road away during that
15	project. You can't get off the Beltline to get
16	onto Ridge Road while that project is underway.
17	That's one of them.
18	SPEAKER: That's an exit.
19	SPEAKER: But that would, like you said,
20	increase some emergency response times. There's
21	pros and cons, right?
22	SPEAKER: Uh-huh. Maybe emergency
23	vehicles could use the access if it's closed?
24	SPEAKER: Could use it or [inaudible].
25	SPEAKER: But

1	SPEAKER: where are the lire stations up
2	for Ridge? It's I'm trying to think.
3	SPEAKER: There's one on Lake Boone up,
4	almost to Blueberry, by Rex Hospital.
5	SPEAKER: Yeah, that's right. Uh-huh.
6	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
7	SPEAKER: Yeah.
8	SPEAKER: That's one one thing. The
9	second thing is that throughout all this design
10	they should connect Ridge Road and Crabtree Valley
11	SPEAKER: They should or should not?
12	SPEAKER: Should not connect Ridge Road
13	and Crabtree Valley Roads. Like, that would just
14	that would make Ridge Road a highway into the
15	mall.
16	SPEAKER: Uh-huh. Uh-huh.
17	SPEAKER: Which we certainly don't want.
18	That's another traffic increase. And the third
19	point is if there's problems on Glenwood Avenue
20	this whole thing is that there's traffic on
21	Glenwood, and we need to fix traffic on Glenwood.
22	Fix it on Glenwood. Don't fix it in at the
23	expense of the surrounding neighborhoods. There's
24	some things that can be done like, making express
25	lanes on Glenwood Avenue, so that people who want

1	to go through the intersections quickly can go				
2	through. Then you have access lanes on on				
3	Glenwood Avenue. They'll alleviate some of the				
4	some of the traffic, some of the so these				
5	questions don't get you to those points				
6	SPEAKER: Okay.				
7	SPEAKER: where you can tell DOT that				
8	this is what we want, what we don't want. It, you				
9	know, it gives them a general idea.				
10	SPEAKER: So hopes				
11	SPEAKER: But it gives them it gives				
12	them an out to say well, you know, it wasn't raised				
13	wasn't raised in the in the sessions, you				
14	know, we did this. Yeah, we understand safety, but				
15					
16	SPEAKER: So I'm glad you said what you				
17	said because now it's recorded.				
18	SPEAKER: Right. That's all I want. I				
19	just wanted recorded.				
20	SPEAKER: That's good.				
21	SPEAKER: I don't need to write I				
22	don't need to write it down.				
23	SPEAKER: That's excellent. Yeah.				
24	SPEAKER: So I have another comment about				
25	DOT being a good partner with the community. So I				

1	heard it mentioned that DOT is really only
2	concerned with Glenwood Avenue as it is, Route 70
3	and 440 because those are the only two state roads
4	in this equation.
5	So impacts to Ridge Road or Glen Eden or
6	Lake Boone are just not their concern because
7	they're not state roads. So what they could do to
8	kind of help us understand this situation better is
9	really, maybe being more share more, be more
10	forthcoming about relationships with the city
11	through this project. Just assure us that those
12	connections are being made.
13	I've also heard in the neighborhood
14	meetings that part of another DOT project is
15	widening Glenwood from Ridge Road all the way down
16	to Oberlin Road, going to six lanes there.
17	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
18	SPEAKER: That I've I have only heard
19	that connected to this in these neighborhood
20	meetings. Never anything official through the
21	CACs, through the city or through DOT.
22	SPEAKER: So you don't know if that's
23	true or not?
24	SPEAKER: So is that true? And how does
25	that change the other options for the the

1	project designs? How does is that a technical				
2	constraint or limitation that Beth mentioned				
3	earlier? It would just mean a little bit more				
4	information about that.				
5	SPEAKER: Okay. That's good.				
6	SPEAKER: One the vision for the valley				
7	plans that she alluded to which was looking at				
8	Crabtree Valley in the future and that was done in				
9	the, I think, in 2010 and 11, shows Ridge Road				
10	coming around instead of connecting to the Beltline				
11	connecting to Glenwood Avenue where it is six				
12	lanes. So that that would that would really				
13	change more, I think, of the neighborhood than what				
14	some folks have talked about Ridge Road, you know,				
15	that the exit changing and connecting to Crabtree				
16	Valley Avenue so				
17	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.				
18	SPEAKER: It kind of sounds just like				
19	from some of the things that you've shared that you				
20	don't you're not certain that the information				
21	you have is accurate?				
22	SPEAKER: Yeah.				
23	SPEAKER: Yeah.				
24	SPEAKER: So there's an uncertainty about				
25	the information in general?				

1	SPEAKER: Well, I think that's one of the
2	reasons again, we don't have any sort of plans or
3	any sort of concrete anything to react to.
4	SPEAKER: Okay.
5	SPEAKER: It's all more emotional and
6	and
7	SPEAKER: Vague.
8	SPEAKER: you know, you'd always look
9	at the worst possible scenario when you don't have
10	the information, right? You always assume that
11	it's going to be the worst.
12	SPEAKER: Yes.
13	SPEAKER: So I think what would be
14	infinitely more valuable is this session once plans
15	are in place.
16	SPEAKER: Okay.
17	SPEAKER: So that people can react to
18	something concrete rather than the great unknown.
19	SPEAKER: Yeah. Good.
20	SPEAKER: Do you guys have anything you
21	want to share that's unrelated to the questions
22	that's just was on your mind, or you wanted to make
23	sure was addressed?
24	SPEAKER: I guess just information and
25	again, it relates stuff you don't know. 'Cause you

1	mentioned earlier like they're forced to do it				
2	because, like the lane the section of the				
3	interchange is too short, why is too short, you				
4	know? Like, how this did get through? Was it				
5	was it up to criteria when they built it, for				
6	instance, and then too much traffic has changed				
7	everything? Or did it did someone pass the buck				
8	alone and it never got caught and so it was just				
9	like not even good from the beginning and now				
10	they're rectifying their mistake? And just like,				
11	you know, who built it and if it was too short, how				
12	do we know this one will have the exact same issue				
13	going forward in a couple of years too, for				
14	instance? I don't know.				
15	SPEAKER: And even is that the issue?				
16	SPEAKER: Yeah, that's true.				
17	SPEAKER: How how long how long do				
18	you lived here?				
19	SPEAKER: Oh, I'm a recent transplant.				
20	That's yeah.				
21	SPEAKER: This whole thing about that				
22	intersection has been going on what? 20, 30 years				
23	now.				
24	SPEAKER: Oh, okay.				
25	SPEAKER: Like, different proposals,				

_	riyovers here and there, and you know, this just		
2	this is just the finest version of this whole		
3	thing.		
4	SPEAKER: I look forward to them in the		
5	future.		
6	SPEAKER: Someday you'll be able to say,		
7	this has been going on for 30 years.		
8	SPEAKER: Yeah. This has been going on		
9	for 20 years.		
10	SPEAKER: All right. Just as points of		
11	follow up, they are going to be submitting all of		
12	this information. We've already reiterated that		
13	they're going to be collecting the data. They will		
14	be recording it and they will let you know when the		
15	information is available. We told you that would		
16	be early in November. Unless you all have		
17	something else, you want us to record on the sheets		
18	or just voice something on the recorder where		
19	our session is done. It's complete.		
20	SPEAKER: Have have they taken into		
21	consideration that Crabtree Valley Mall very well		
22	might become another ghost mall? A lot of that		
23	traffic they're talking about diverting and, you		
2 4	know, like Sears is gone. Macy's is in trouble. I		
25	I guess Best Buy is doing good for now. but		

1	malls are doomed.
2	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
3	SPEAKER: Maybe we won't need a lot of
4	this.
5	SPEAKER: Good point.
6	SPEAKER: Yeah.
7	SPEAKER: Is that complete the session?
8	SPEAKER: I think so.
9	SPEAKER: I'm good.
10	SPEAKER: I'm good.
11	SPEAKER: All right. Thank you so much
12	for taking the time first to show up 'cause we
13	wouldn't have these thoughts if you didn't show up,
14	so we're very grateful to that. And the DOT and
15	some of the engineers, I don't know the engineering
16	companies, but some of them are actually here, so
17	if you want to talk to them specifically your
18	welcome to do so. I think Beth did let you know
19	that none of that will be recorded. So just know
20	if you have the conversation it is just a private
21	conversation. Okay?
22	SPEAKER: Okay.
23	SPEAKER: Thank you so much.
24	SPEAKER: Thank you ladies. Thank you
25	for being prepared.
