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and we're doing a session in Room 2139 and this Susanna's session, so we'll leave this here to record us. Hopefully it captures everything that you guys have to say. So just to review the ground rules that we — they talked about. We're here to listen, so I don't work for the DOT. I've been brought in and I'm an independent facilitator, so I'm just here to capture what you have to say.

I don't live in this area, so I really don't have any vested interest in one way or the other, so I don't represent any of those. So I'm just here to listen to you and hopefully for you to listen to each other, so we can get some -- the best input that we can. I've got six broad topics that we'll go through tonight, in about the next hour and 20 minutes -- an hour and a half.

We're a small group, so we can get in some good conversation in that time. We just ask that you turn off any phones unless you're expecting an emergency. I always allow for that and please be considerate of the different opinions that you might hear. You might live in some different areas, have different reasons why you've come here to share. We'll give each person a

chance to share, with four people that shouldn't be too challenging and as best everyone should speak from your own household's experience. Not from what your neighbors want or what the doctor down the street or any of those things. And as specific as you can be with your examples, both be concise and — but specific and concrete. So that we understand and the recording will capture that information for the engineers to use for the designs that they come up with.

And we really want everyone to have a chance to participate. That's why they did this in a forum, in these small groups rather than in a large sessions that sometimes those town halls can be. You'll all get a chance to -- but like I said, I can't answer your questions. What we'll do is, we'll write them all down so that then they can be answered more broadly, because if you have a question, probably others do as well.

So the first thing we're going to go through and I've got my chart over here, is how do you share what -- one word, describes what is most important to you or your household or your business, that must be considered as this project moves forward. So just as an opening --

1	SPEAKER: Safety.
2	SPEAKER: Safety.
3	SPEAKER: For the kids on at the
4	schools.
5	SPEAKER: Safety you said, kids in
6	schools. Great. Someone else? One word, what's
7	most important?
8	SPEAKER: Preservation.
9	SPEAKER: Preservation? How can you
10	SPEAKER: Well, probably traffic, but
11	that's a part of safety.
12	SPEAKER: Traffic. Okay, that's good.
13	We can get them all.
14	SPEAKER: I hear one word.
15	SPEAKER: I it mine won't fit into
16	one word.
17	SPEAKER: Okay.
18	SPEAKER: Or maybe maybe economics
19	like as in property values.
20	SPEAKER: Okay. Let's just add that
21	detail there. Okay. Great. We got we got
22	question one done. There we go. All right. Well,
23	the next one is going to go straight to your point
24	about safety. And that question is, what do you
25	believe is needed to ensure the safety of your

1	family, the people who live in the area and the
2	people that travel through the area?
3	And I actually have all these questions
4	here for you, for you to look at. We've had them
5	printed off, so we're on question number two, here.
6	So what do you believe is needed to ensure the
7	safety of your family, the people who live in the
8	area and the people that travel through the area?
9	Will go ahead and focus on safety.
10	SPEAKER: I'd say no more traffic. You
11	you got and I recalculated this, 1800 and
12	some kids just at Highland, Lacy and Martin and the
13	Raleigh Moravian School. That's all within less
14	than a tenth of a mile. They're they're right
15	across the street from each other.
16	SPEAKER: Okay. That get it? We've got
17	it all.
18	SPEAKER: I it right. Yeah. I
19	think okay, you've got it all.
20	SPEAKER: One more topic, you've got
21	over 1800 kids at the schools. I didn't write down
22	every school that you mentioned.
23	SPEAKER: Right.
24	SPEAKER: In one tenth of a mile area.
25	SPEAKER: And it's it's probably not

1	even that much. It's closer than that. You just
2	walk across the street from Lacy to Highland.
3	SPEAKER: Okay.
4	SPEAKER: And that's that includes
5	preschools and after school care.
6	SPEAKER: Okay.
7	SPEAKER: That's a little further down
8	then, on on your map, but that will still be
9	impacted big time when it happens.
10	SPEAKER: Okay.
11	SPEAKER: Or if it happens.
12	SPEAKER: Okay. No more traffic. What
13	else is equal to you in terms of to ensure the
14	safety of your family? What do you believe is
15	needed to ensure the safety of the people in the
16	area? Your family, your household, what else
17	regarding safety?
18	SPEAKER: One thing, the sidewalks.
19	Maintaining the sidewalks, are a very important.
20	SPEAKER: Okay. What else? What else is
21	needed to ensure safety?
22	SPEAKER: I go back to again, no more
23	traffic. I don't know what else.
24	[Interposing]
25	SPEAKER: The traffic is going to cause

1	the problems and if any of you had all the schools
2	on one side, it would be different. But it's not.
3	They're on different locations and they're not with
4	either. They're close within each other and
5	they're at major intersections of Lake Boone and
6	Ridge Road right now.
7	SPEAKER: Okay. So what else is needed
8	to ensure the safety of the people who travel
9	through the area? What about the others? Do you
10	have any other?
11	SPEAKER: When you say safety of others,
12	so just people travelling through? Not
13	SPEAKER: Well, the question is the
14	safety of your family, the people who live in the
15	area and the people that travel through the area.
16	What is needed? It's a kind of broad question,
17	what is needed to ensure safety?
18	SPEAKER: I go back to no more traffic.
19	I mean I can't that's the only thing I can think
20	of. Do you want to really have preserve the
21	safety of the area?
22	SPEAKER: I guess if there's any
23	potential plans as far as access to 440, as far as
24	changing exits and access? You know, that those
25	have clear vision lines and adequate

Τ	SPEAKER: Okay. So entrance and exits
2	SPEAKER: To to Glenwood and 440.
3	Whatever that whatever ends up being the
4	intersection change there.
5	SPEAKER: And you said it would have to
6	have clear sight lines?
7	SPEAKER: Right. Clear sight lines and
8	enough time to merge in. Like for instance, now
9	we're trying to get on the Beltline from Ridge Road
10	can be
11	SPEAKER: Yes. Issues.
12	SPEAKER: And the issues with people
13	coming in. People come in.
14	SPEAKER: Okay. So clear sight lines,
15	time to merge in
16	SPEAKER: Right.
17	SPEAKER: Actually, right now, we could
18	use beside the safe for the safety of
19	making turns a left-hand turn signals.
20	SPEAKER: Oh. That's horrible. Yeah.
21	SPEAKER: At the at the major
22	intersections.
23	SPEAKER: Glen Eden.
24	SPEAKER: Yeah. Glen Eden and Lake
25	Boone.

1	SPEAKER: Yeah. Because if you're coming
2	this way and you're probably coming right down the
3	roadway.
4	SPEAKER: So left-hand turn signals at,
5	you said at the major intersections? And then you
6	had some specific streets? So what are those?
7	SPEAKER: Glen Eden and Lake Boone. And
8	I personally live here on this street and I have
9	because of the way it is configuered, it's a cut
10	off street actually, between Lake Boone and Ridge
11	Road, because it goes at a U and at early morning
12	and afternoon and early evening, you cannot get
13	out. I had to go down today, go up make a
14	right-hand turn, to make and go around the block
15	to make a left-hand turn, because I couldn't you
16	couldn't make a left-hand turn.
17	SPEAKER: Okay. So you want left-hand
18	turn signals, so I got Glen Eden
19	SPEAKER: Yeah. But that's that's
20	something different.
21	SPEAKER: Okay.
22	SPEAKER: I'm talking about the traffic
23	that's backed up, because of now, without anything
24	else at this point.
25	SPEAKER: So now, you've got traffic

1	backed up at
2	SPEAKER: Presently.
3	SPEAKER: Yep. So now, backed up and you
4	said early
5	SPEAKER: Early morning, mid-afternoon
6	and 5 o'clock.
7	SPEAKER: Well, in particular if there's
8	some kind of accident or some congestion on the
9	Beltline.
10	SPEAKER: Okay.
11	SPEAKER: Yeah. That's that's the
12	first place they go to, is to get off the
13	Beltline is to go up through Ridge on two-way. So
14	we're pretty familiar with traffic.
15	SPEAKER: Yeah.
16	SPEAKER: And that's why we don't want
17	it.
18	SPEAKER: You want no so let me
19	clarify that. No more traffic, you don't more
20	than what's already here.
21	SPEAKER: Exactly.
22	SPEAKER: Well, okay.
23	SPEAKER: Well, I mean
24	SPEAKER: In the neighborhood?
25	SPEAKER: She she named three distinct

7	SPEAKER: You're and by the way,
8	that's a major Glen Eden, Lake Boone and they're
9	off of both of them off of Ridge Road.
10	SPEAKER: Okay. Good. Anything else
11	that you believe is needed to ensure safety in the
12	area? People who live here, work here, travel
13	through here. I can get more paper out.
14	SPEAKER: Well, why would we be concerned
15	about the people traveling through here? I mean,
16	seriously.
17	SPEAKER: Okay.
18	SPEAKER: I mean, that's that's you
19	know, one one of your questions, but I I
20	think the people that live here, work here and
21	there aren't too many places to work on Ridge Road
22	area. I mean if you're maybe Crabtree or
23	whatever, but if you're talking to the just the
24	general area, then
25	SPEAKER: Okay. Well, we're talking

1	about the what we're talking about is the entire
2	construction area.
3	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
4	SPEAKER: So thinking about that and
5	obviously your your primary concern where you
6	live and we want to understand how it affects the
7	entire project and how that will
8	SPEAKER: And I'm not that concerned
9	about where I live. It's more concerning about, as
10	I said, the school kids.
11	SPEAKER: The school kids?
12	SPEAKER: Because I see that every day.
13	My kids went to both of Lacy and Martin and Anne
14	went to Highland. The preschool and afterschool
15	and it's it's pretty difficult to get get
16	across that street. And especially now that I
17	mean, I've been down that street for 42 years. So
18	on Horton. So I know quite a bit about what it
19	used to be, up to what it today. And I don't think
20	it can handle any more traffic.
21	SPEAKER: Okay. So can't handle any more
22	traffic.
23	SPEAKER: Well, they also said they
24	weren't going to widen it, but that doesn't mean
25	they can't put new lanes in it. Or what they do is

Τ	put new Strip down, rike they ard on
2	SPEAKER: Lake Forest?
3	SPEAKER: No. That well back in
4	November, the first one was, or a long time ago was
5	Lake Forest Road. You could barely with that
6	[inaudible].
7	SPEAKER: There you go, I did.
8	SPEAKER: Yes. You got to hold it in.
9	SPEAKER: And I remember whose idea that
10	was too, when when he was here.
11	SPEAKER: So not more lanes added, even
12	if not widened.
13	SPEAKER: It's hot in here.
14	SPEAKER: Okay. So thinking also about
15	the entire construction project area.
16	SPEAKER: Okay. What you think about
17	that?
18	SPEAKER: So when you think about that
19	and think about safety.
20	SPEAKER: You know, I'm not an
21	anti-development person, but really, limit
22	development. Because that's what's causing the
23	traffic.
24	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
25	SPEAKER: You know, so you know, as we

Τ	know developments go clazy unitess
2	SPEAKER: Okay. Perfect. Anything
3	else, thinking about that whole area?
4	SPEAKER: You know, when you mentioned
5	about limit development, unless they have a traffic
6	pattern that is going to work
7	SPEAKER: That can hold.
8	SPEAKER: Yeah. That can hold it.
9	Exactly. And I don't think that
10	SPEAKER: And that could be without
11	destroying the neighborhoods.
12	SPEAKER: And that has not been done. I
13	mean, we've let a lot of groups come in and build.
14	That say they will not cause any traffic, because
15	they're going live, work and play in that area, but
16	it doesn't really happen.
17	SPEAKER: Okay. So I got a have a
18	traffic pattern, unless can have a traffic pattern
19	that holds it.
20	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
21	SPEAKER: Okay. Anything else on safety?
22	SPEAKER: So they're going we're
23	thinking of like a bridge, right?
24	SPEAKER: It's like we're talking
25	SPEAKER: All right. You sort of hit it.

1	If this is where the problem is, then they need a
2	traffic pattern that that can handle the
3	traffic.
4	SPEAKER: Okay. So that's so that's a
5	key thing. Having a traffic pattern that can
6	handle it.
7	SPEAKER: And I think that the state
8	needs to look not just at what we've done in the
9	past, but look at some other cities that are
10	developing like we are and what how are they
11	handling the traffic. And I am going to ask if he
12	is that happening?
13	SPEAKER: Well, I don't know. I'm not
14	SPEAKER: Oh. I thought that you were
15	with the state.
16	SPEAKER: No.
17	SPEAKER: Oh. No. Okay.
18	SPEAKER: Name a growing city that
19	handles their traffic.
20	SPEAKER: But really. Because I mean you
21	know, you might learn something from them.
22	SPEAKER: Yeah. That that would be
23	SPEAKER: Okay. Other cities, how
24	they're handling it traffic. That is, it being
25	traffic. Okay. All right. Anything else on

1	safety? We can always come back and add things
2	later.
3	SPEAKER: Okay.
4	SPEAKER: It's just on paper. Let's move
5	on to the third question. Which is, is there a
6	specific valuable community asset, something
7	important to the community and/or neighborhood
8	located within this project zone? So thinking
9	about the entire project zone, that you are
10	concerned will be impacted? If so what is it and
11	how do you believe it will be impacted?
12	SPEAKER: Schools again.
13	SPEAKER: Schools. Anything else? What
14	else is in this project zone? What other community
15	assets? Schools got them.
16	SPEAKER: Well, walkability.
17	SPEAKER: Yes.
18	SPEAKER: That's got to do with
19	sidewalks, there's always people enjoying coming
20	to Ridge Road, even from outside the area.
21	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
22	SPEAKER: You know and walking, enjoying.
23	SPEAKER: Okay. Particularly on Ridge
24	Road?
25	SPEAKER: Yeah. I would just say the

1	beauty of the area.
2	SPEAKER: Okay.
3	SPEAKER: We have so many beautiful trees
4	and plantings and
5	SPEAKER: And you say specifically the
6	trees and what?
7	SPEAKER: Plantings.
8	SPEAKER: Plantings.
9	SPEAKER: And I think it's more of a
10	neighborhood atmosphere. Not at least, I have
11	found that.
12	SPEAKER: Absolutely.
13	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
14	SPEAKER: And walkability also can impact
15	the schools completely too.
16	SPEAKER: Yes. Uh-huh.
17	SPEAKER: Okay. So neighborhood
18	atmosphere and you're speaking specifically the
19	Ridge Road portion?
20	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
21	SPEAKER: Okay. Just making sure I'm
22	clear on the neighborhood.
23	SPEAKER: There's three churches in the
24	same area.
25	SPEAKER: That's right. Uh-huh.

1	SPEAKER: LOUS OF CHURCHES.
2	SPEAKER: Right there.
3	SPEAKER: Okay.
4	SPEAKER: And again, you can tell where
5	
6	SPEAKER: Well, we also have the Goddard
7	school too.
8	SPEAKER: That's right. I I didn't
9	I didn't put that down, because of Sofia and that
10	brings another 60 kids, so
11	SPEAKER: Yeah. But I but I mean,
12	that may or may not be. But it will still be
13	attractive this way, so
14	SPEAKER: Oh. It will still it will
15	still be attractive. Yeah. Because that's at the
16	corner of and you just get tied in it's tied
17	in
18	SPEAKER: Yeah. Yeah. Right. And that
19	brings here not to with all the other
20	schools, we're talking about 2,000 students.
21	SPEAKER: Okay.
22	SPEAKER: I would have to say another
23	asset is our ability to access the major highways.
24	You know, you don't want to we're able to get on
25	40 and

1	SPEAKER: Pretty much go anywhere.
2	SPEAKER: Anywhere you want to.
3	SPEAKER: In five minutes.
4	SPEAKER: And that's
5	SPEAKER: That's why they want to build
6	it.
7	SPEAKER: Yeah.
8	SPEAKER: Because it's such a good map.
9	SPEAKER: Yeah.
10	SPEAKER: Okay. Any other specific
11	community assets that you want to make sure are
12	preserved?
13	SPEAKER: I'd have to say our
14	neighborhood shopping centers.
15	SPEAKER: Shopping centers?
16	SPEAKER: They're they're strong.
17	SPEAKER: They're what?
18	SPEAKER: They're a nice asset.
19	SPEAKER: So you're thinking of
20	SPEAKER: Not the big ones. I'm talking
21	about our little, you know, up in the area?
22	SPEAKER: Like Blenheim?
23	SPEAKER: And White Atlas [phonetic]?
24	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
25	SPEAKER: Okay. So the little ones.

1	Let's make sure we capture what we want them to be
2	aware of. Lake Boone.
3	SPEAKER: And Ridge Ridgewood.
4	SPEAKER: Ridgewood?
5	SPEAKER: Is that Ridgewood or Ridgeway
6	Shopping Center?
7	SPEAKER: Ridgewood Shopping Center.
8	Whole Foods, everybody knows that place.
9	SPEAKER: That's right.
10	SPEAKER: I'm talking about the one
11	that's on Wade and
12	SPEAKER: Yes. That's Ridge Road
13	Shopping Center.
1.4	SPEAKER: Ridge Road well, I'll just
15	write Whole Foods.
16	SPEAKER: And [inaudible]shopping center,
17	there's a line of traffic.
18	SPEAKER: Ridge Road, Wade Avenue. Okay.
19	So the the smaller shopping centers? Obviously,
20	there's you know, bigger ones too, but Ridge
21	Road. Okay. Anything else? Community assets.
22	That the people developing the plan for this entire
23	project area should be considering.
24	SPEAKER: Maybe with walkability, just

slash, bikeability route.

Τ	SPEAKER: Okay. Let me just add, 1'11
2	I'll kind of link it here, but let's get that.
3	Bikeability. Good. Anything else community
4	assets? Okay. So we can okay.
5	SPEAKER: There a Thanksgiving what do
6	you call it?
7	SPEAKER: Run.
8	SPEAKER: The Turkey Trot.
9	SPEAKER: Turkey Trot.
10	SPEAKER: Which is fun.
11	SPEAKER: It is.
12	SPEAKER: That's a run? A walk? A
13	SPEAKER: It's a run.
14	SPEAKER: A run?
15	SPEAKER: A kind of a run/walk
16	SPEAKER: That's it.
17	SPEAKER: combination.

22	wanted to make sure. That's what I thought it was.
23	I didn't want to make any assumptions. Make sure I
24	was clear. The Turkey Trot run/walk event, so
25	having those kinds of things are important.

1	SPEAKER: Okay. Anything else? All
2	right. We can again, if we think of something
3	else, we can come back. So you mentioned this
4	earlier on in our one word as we started, but
5	question four. From your perspective what are
6	what are some of the most problematic traffic and
7	pedestrian problems that need to be addressed? And
8	they've asked that we be specific with
9	intersections, directions and/or time of day. So
10	we've gotten some of those, but let's make sure
11	that we get all of them here so that we get it
12	captured.
13	SPEAKER: You want the intersections
14	first or
15	SPEAKER: So let's yeah. Let's get
16	the most problematic traffic and pedestrian
17	problems that need to be addressed. So let's
18	let's get them.
19	SPEAKER: Traffic at oh. Hitting the
20	grade
21	SPEAKER: It could be an intersection or
22	maybe it's a road or whatever.
23	SPEAKER: Well, at the intersection of
24	Ridge Road and Lake Boone Trail, is a major
25	problem.

2	time of day that that	at's particularly problematic?
3	SPEAKER:	It's a lot more when I say
4	in the morning, after	ernoon and evening. I mean,
5	really it's it's	almost not quite all day, but
6		
7	SPEAKER:	Commuting times, like at
8	SPEAKER:	Right and
9	SPEAKER:	Afternoon.
10	SPEAKER:	But then, it's also the
11	schools. You have a	a lot of school buses too,
12	coming in and out, s	so
13	SPEAKER:	Then we have the schools.
14	SPEAKER:	Uh-huh.
15	SPEAKER:	Let's make sure we capture, we
16	kind of I did tha	at a little bit, but let's
17	capture where those	schools are that you're
18	particularly thinking	ng of, so that they make sure
19	that that's being in	ncorporated.
20	SPEAKER:	Okay. One of the schools is on
21	the corner of Ridge	and Lake Boone.
22	SPEAKER:	Okay. And what school is that?
23	SPEAKER:	Lacy Elementary.
24	SPEAKER:	Okay.
25	SDEVKER.	And then you've got Martin

1	Middle School on Horton Street and Ridge.
2	SPEAKER: Okay.
3	SPEAKER: And
4	SPEAKER: The preschool is in Ridgewood.
5	SPEAKER: And Highland Methodist.
6	SPEAKER: Highland Methodist.
7	SPEAKER: It's a preschool and after
8	school and that's on Lace [sic] on Ridge and
9	Lake Boone. So you've got two major schools here
10	that are
11	SPEAKER: Preschool and after school and
12	say again?
13	SPEAKER: That is on Ridge and Lake
14	Boone.
15	SPEAKER: Ridge and Lake Boone? Okay.
16	What else in this is there any other other
17	schools that we want to make sure of?
18	SPEAKER: There's Goddard School. It's
19	down at the end towards Wade Avenue, so I'm not
20	sure that it would but I think any it would
21	be impacted, just because it is on the line.
22	SPEAKER: And that one is where?
23	SPEAKER: It's on
24	SPEAKER: It's closer to Wade Avenue and
25	Ridge.

1	SPEAKER: Wade and Ridge? Okay.
2	SPEAKER: And there's also the Raleigh
3	Moravian has a preschool too.
4	SPEAKER: Uh-huh. Preschool.
5	SPEAKER: Raleigh Moravian?
6	SPEAKER: Right. And that's on Ridge and
7	what is that side street?
8	SPEAKER: Darien?
9	SPEAKER: Darien Drive.
10	SPEAKER: Ridge and Darien? I-E-N?
11	SPEAKER: D-A-R-I-A-N [sic], I think.
12	SPEAKER: That's right.
13	SPEAKER: I figure it out later. Okay.
14	Raleigh Moravian and that's a preschool.
15	SPEAKER: Like in the morning, Lake
16	Boone Trail now, between Ridge and going towards
17	Rex.
18	SPEAKER: Oh, yes.
19	SPEAKER: That is a that is a major
20	traffic. I mean coming both ways.
21	SPEAKER: Lake Boone from Ridge to Rex.
22	SPEAKER: But I really can't tell if that
23	would be considered in
24	SPEAKER: And you said that's in the
25	morning?

Ţ	SPEAKER: It is
2	SPEAKER: It's mainly Lake Boone Lake
3	Boone.
4	SPEAKER: Lake Boone Trail, yeah.
5	SPEAKER: Okay
6	SPEAKER: Not Ridge so much, but
7	SPEAKER: Not as much Ridge, but there
8	what we get is a lot of the traffic on Lake Boone
9	from the hospital. So when they change shifts,
10	like Erica [phonetic] said, I cannot get out of my
11	street.
12	SPEAKER: I mean, it's really gotten bad.
13	SPEAKER: Yeah.
14	SPEAKER: I avoid going that way now.
15	Because you get so dot duck [ph] in there?
16	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
17	SPEAKER: Okay. All right. Thinking
18	about the entire project area as well. Any
19	additional particular traffic areas, intersections,
20	that we wanted them to know about?
21	SPEAKER: Do you know anything about what
22	they're going to do? Are they going to do any
23	traffic studies or traffic counts?
24	SPEAKER: I will write that down. I I
25	don't know.

1	SPEAKER: I mean I don't really know, but
2	I would say that in the Crabtree Valley area, that
3	would be there's a lot to consider in there. I
4	mean a whole lot.
5	SPEAKER: So Crabtree Valley Area?
6	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
7	SPEAKER: And that's basically what this
8	is all about.
9	SPEAKER: Right. I mean there's so much
10	On a good day there's so much.
11	SPEAKER: And so can we let's be more
12	specific for that. So which roads or intersections
13	are we specifically thinking about there when you
14	say that?
15	SPEAKER: I'd say where where Blue
16	Ridge Road comes in there.
17	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
18	SPEAKER: Where it comes into
19	SPEAKER: It would be coming into 70.
20	SPEAKER: Okay.
21	SPEAKER: As well as the I-440 west exit
22	SPEAKER: Right. And then it's Lead Mine
23	across the street. And that's that's exit
24	areas.
25	SPEAKER: 440 west exit from Glenwood

1	going west onto
2	SPEAKER: Going from 40 from 440 west
3	going to Glenwood Avenue.
4	SPEAKER: Onto Glenwood.
5	SPEAKER: Now, the the other one gets
6	bad too, 440 west exist to Ridge Road, but that's
7	because of the over flow of the Beltline right
8	there.
9	SPEAKER: Okay.
10	SPEAKER: That's what so that's where
11	they funnel all the traffic trying to bypass that
12	one little strip.
13	SPEAKER: Okay. And this is because of
14	bypassing?
15	SPEAKER: Have you probably know
16	know that the I've been thinking that they
17	should, as I said, look at other cities and
18	possibly do an overpass.
19	SPEAKER: Okay. So I'll just capture
20	that. Should we do an overpass?
21	SPEAKER: At least think of study it.
22	SPEAKER: Overpass and where are you
23	thinking that might be?
24	SPEAKER: And they they might not be
25	as limited by your terrain.

1	SPEAKER:	Right.
2	SPEAKER:	Overpass from where to where?
3	SPEAKER:	I don't know. I mean, I don't
4	know where the road	for that.
5	SPEAKER:	General
6	SPEAKER:	But but I think that the
7	engineers certainly	should consider.
8	SPEAKER:	I mean, that's basically a a
9	two and a half, thr	ee-mile problem area.
10	SPEAKER:	Yeah.
11	SPEAKER:	Okay.
12	SPEAKER:	That somehow has to be
13	SPEAKER:	Two-and-a-half to three-mile
14	mile problem area.	
15	SPEAKER:	Be able to handle the traffic.
16	Not try to fifunnel	[sic] it here and fifunnel [sic]
17	it there, but bu	t keep it in a
18	SPEAKER:	The two to three-mile problem
19	area is on	
20	SPEAKER:	I would say from Glenwood to
21	the other side of W	ade Avenue.
22	SPEAKER:	On 440?
23	SPEAKER:	Yes, ma'am.
24	SPEAKER:	And then they're going to do
25	something to 440. t	o the Beltline, they're taking

Ι	this is what part I don't know if it's right
2	or wrong. They're taking land from Meredith and
3	the New York City Club.
4	SPEAKER: Yeah.
5	SPEAKER: So I'm not sure what I mean,
6	that's even going to impact things probably even
7	more than we can even imagine.
8	SPEAKER: You're right.
9	SPEAKER: That's that's going to be a
10	major impact, I think.
11	SPEAKER: So what impact will the 440
12	project, and that's by Meredith? Right. Great.
13	SPEAKER: Because that's to take it
14	the land from the left-hand side and the right, you
15	know, you're like again, where is that going in
16	there? And I
17	SPEAKER: And where will this traffic go,
18	is what I'm hearing.
19	SPEAKER: Yes.
20	SPEAKER: And there's also a concern
21	about
22	SPEAKER: So that's outside of this
23	this area, but there should be concern about the
24	overall systems.
25	SPEAKER: Right. Because there's going

Τ	to be an impact on this area.
2	SPEAKER: Sure. Absolutely.
3	SPEAKER: Yeah. Yeah.
4	SPEAKER: And there's also a concern of
5	perhaps
6	SPEAKER: Yeah. That's a different
7	project.
8	SPEAKER: mostly occurring
9	simultaneously.
10	SPEAKER: Yes.
11	SPEAKER: That's probably Wade Avenue.
12	SPEAKER: and just really, that's
13	going that will be getting real interesting.
14	SPEAKER: Okay.
15	SPEAKER: East side development is where
16	we get a lot of traffic. That's for sure and all
17	those back roads that we know.
18	SPEAKER: Yeah. Yeah.
19	SPEAKER: All right. Any other specific
20	traffic areas of particular concern?
21	SPEAKER: I think the bridge that goes
22	from the Beltline over to Ridge Road is a concern.
23	Whether they're going to preserve that or
24	SPEAKER: The bridge? Now, let me I
25	want to make sure I get that, before we go any

1	further. The bridge from where?
2	SPEAKER: From the Beltline to Ridge
3	Road. Is that going to be preserved or eliminated?
4	SPEAKER: I'd like to see it eliminated.
5	SPEAKER: And again, that's at Glenwood.
6	SPEAKER: That's that's what makes
7	SPEAKER: Right
8	SPEAKER: Okay. At Glenwood. Got it.
9	All right. I have more paper. Are we are we
10	getting everything that you're
11	SPEAKER: Oh, yeah. I think so.
12	SPEAKER: I think so.
13	SPEAKER: And this being important too,
14	so other other traffic traffic problems.
15	Traffic areas that we want to make sure are that
16	are being considered in this. Anything in
17	particular that we haven't caught yet?
18	SPEAKER: Maybe we will think about it
19	after.
20	SPEAKER: From what I could see, there
21	was also a concern of Ridge Road somehow connecting
22	to something else, going beyond behind the mall.
23	SPEAKER: So Ridge Road, connecting
24	behind the mall? To something behind the mall?
25	SPEAKER: Right. Making it sort of a

Т	throughway to bypass the mail.
2	SPEAKER: Uh-huh. We don't want that.
3	SPEAKER: No. That would really put
4	safety at risk on on Ridge Road.
5	SPEAKER: Okay. So Ridge Road
6	connecting, there's a question or concern, you
7	said?
8	SPEAKER: Yeah.
9	SPEAKER: Okay.
10	SPEAKER: And then again, it's hard to
11	know when you're not exactly sure what the project
12	is, exactly to know everything. But I mean, as you
13	can tell, we have traffic problems.
14	SPEAKER: Yeah.
15	SPEAKER: Already.
16	SPEAKER: Okay. And so any other
17	specific areas where these traffic problems at
18	as they consider that whole area there on the map,
19	were any other particular areas there
20	SPEAKER: Well, that's that's I
21	mean it will back up from Wade Avenue, all the way
22	down to you know, all the way down to Glen Eden.
23	I've seen it. I've and you know, you just keep
24	going and you hope that maybe somebody might let
25	you in or you could just go around the block and

1	come back the other way.
2	SPEAKER: And the backup is on Ridge? On
3	440? I'm not that familiar on every road?
4	SPEAKER: On Ridge.
5	SPEAKER: On Ridge? Okay.
6	SPEAKER: Then because also, what
7	you're saying is trying to get out on Lake Boone
8	Trail or trying to get out on Ridge Road, so you
9	really do have a gift.
10	SPEAKER: Uh-huh. You're stuck.
11	SPEAKER: Yeah. Yeah.
12	SPEAKER: So let me capture that. I I
13	can't write here. Ability to exit
14	SPEAKER: To exit Horton Street via
15	there's only two ways and it's either Ridge Lake
16	Boone Trail or it's Ridge Road. And I try to time
17	my things, but you know, you can't always.
18	SPEAKER: Right.
19	SPEAKER: And it's morning early
20	morning, afternoon and evening, forget it. It's
21	as I said today, it was
22	SPEAKER: So you said you took, is that
23	after I made a little bit there. I try to time
24	when I go. But you can't always.
25	SPEAKER: Yeah. This is a crazy

1	phenomenon, but it it used to be later in the
2	year, maybe starting in October. But now, if you
3	start looking at the traffic coming into this area
4	Starting in August now, it used to be
5	SPEAKER: Oh. I just you just
6	triggered something in my mind. The state fair.
7	SPEAKER: Yeah. That's right.
8	SPEAKER: Yes. Yes. It just makes it
9	impossible to travel.
10	SPEAKER: Yeah, that really impacts.
11	SPEAKER: So how can I capture that for
12	you?
13	SPEAKER: State fair a state fair
14	impacts the traffic problems in this area.
15	SPEAKER: And Christmas shopping at, I
16	mean, it's everything starting from August. I
17	mean, now it's bad year-round basically, but
18	SPEAKER: So Christmas and that's the
19	Crabtree?
20	SPEAKER: Oh, yeah.
21	SPEAKER: Oh, yeah. That gets real.
22	SPEAKER: Christmas shopping at Crabtree
23	
24	SPEAKER: Trying to get people in the
25	mall and out of the mall and back on the that

Τ	gets lear
2	SPEAKER: Okay. So in and out of the
3	mall.
4	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
5	SPEAKER: Okay. State fair impact on the
6	area. All right. Anything else we can think of?
7	Put my little header on here, so they know what we
8	were talking about. Page 3. Anything else? Okay.
9	So let's go on to I guess we're all the way on
10	question five. What additional one or two things
11	are important to your household or business that
12	you want considered as the project moves forward?
13	So input to the people developing the designs and
14	the plans. One or two important things.
15	SPEAKER: Okay. I mean you're you're
16	asking about our households.
17	SPEAKER: Yes, sir. Your household or
18	your business.
19	SPEAKER: So I will answer for our our
20	household.
21	SPEAKER: Perfect.
22	SPEAKER: And and that is that they
23	solve these problems, sort of, in the area that's
24	already designated handle traffic. Like she says,
25	maybe there's other ways, other structures to build

1	that keep the trailit, solve the problems, without
2	destroying neighborhoods.
3	SPEAKER: Neighborhoods. And creating
4	areas that are unsafe for school kids.
5	SPEAKER: So
6	SPEAKER: I mean you know, we've got to
7	live with the schools. They're here.
8	SPEAKER: They're here. They're not
9	going to go anyplace. The churches aren't going to
10	go anyplace.
11	SPEAKER: So without destroying the
12	neighborhoods without
13	SPEAKER: Wait? I'm sorry?
14	SPEAKER: So we're going to solve these
15	problems without destroying neighborhoods and say
16	more about the schools.
17	SPEAKER: And the keeping the safety
18	of the schools in mind.
19	SPEAKER: Right.
20	SPEAKER: When designing whatever
21	SPEAKER: Okay. Okay.
22	SPEAKER: Yeah. When designing traffic
23	flows.
24	SPEAKER: Right.
25	SPEAKER: Traffic flow. Okay.

1	SPEAKER: Not so much flow as count.
2	SPEAKER: Yeah. That's true.
3	SPEAKER: Okay. What else? What else is
4	important for them to keep in mind as they think
5	about this project?
6	SPEAKER: With my household, it's just to
7	be able to exit Ridge I mean Lake Boone
8	excuse me, Horton Street on either end.
9	SPEAKER: I don't know how you ever get
10	onto Horton
11	SPEAKER: We definitely need a stop
12	light.
13	SPEAKER: Well, I don't. I don't even go
14	down to the bottom. I come in to make the right
15	turn.
16	SPEAKER: Right. I will never I would
17	never try. You know, I can't tell you how many
18	tries. I mean, I've seen a lot of accidents.
19	SPEAKER: The apartments, when they were
20	starting to build and so were the the senior
21	center said they wanted to build there because a
22	left turn, they could go right to the hospital in
23	an accident, unless you get a light there and
24	that's not going to happen.
25	SPEAKER: So left turn. Is that

1	something we want to just note? That you're
2	sharing that the left turn from the apartments
3	towards the hospital and senior center?
4	SPEAKER: Well, that's true.
5	SPEAKER: Okay.
6	SPEAKER: There you cannot make a left
7	turn, because of the traffic. And that's on Horton
8	Street.
9	SPEAKER: Okay.
10	SPEAKER: Horton and Lake Boone.
11	SPEAKER: And I would say, that's most of
12	the time. There's really no good time to try to do
13	a left-hand turn there.
14	SPEAKER: That's true. I don't think
15	I've made a left-hand turn there and I would.
16	Maybe on the Saturdays, yeah.
17	SPEAKER: Can't make left turn. Got it.
18	How about for you?
19	SPEAKER: I'm just trying to think of
20	anything in particular where we are, for
21	SPEAKER: Well, for this you know, if
22	that would be impacted in this project area. What
23	do you want to have considered? And lots of good
24	ideas up here so far. What else do you want to
25	have them consider? What's important to you?

1	SPEAKER: I guess I don't know about
2	this I probably won't it will probably might
3	not happen, but but to take sufficient time to
4	make sure that the plans do not you know, don't
5	rush it. Takes enough time to get get it right.
6	SPEAKER: Okay.
7	SPEAKER: I think the other is, just
8	think outside of the box in solving this issue.
9	SPEAKER: Okay. What else? Other things
LO	that are important to your household or business
11	that you want to make sure that are considered as
L2	this project moves forward?
L3	SPEAKER: I guess my concern about if
L 4	they make a connection to I-440 is that there's
L5	going to be construction and possibly even other
L6	types of businesses on the street on Bridge
L7	Road. And you know, that's usually what happens
L8	when you take a look at some of the other streets
L 9	that they've done this to.
20	SPEAKER: Construction and businesses
21	added to Ridge Road?
22	SPEAKER: Yeah. It it right.
23	That's those that's a big concern. They'll
24	start rezoning. They always probably, but yeah.
25	SPEAKER: Okay.

1	SPEAKER: Yeah. That that area is
2	bad. That's the first one.
3	SPEAKER: Right.
4	SPEAKER: Okay. What else? Get more
5	paper.
6	SPEAKER: This I think what we're all
7	trying to say, is this area, because it's on the
8	ridge, it's flat, it's it's nice mixture of
9	eclectic homes and they're not you know, they're
10	not on most of them aren't on big, big lots and
11	everything. But I mean if this neighborhood's
12	it's a it's a jewel.
13	SPEAKER: It's unique. It's unique,
14	right. It's very unique.
15	SPEAKER: It's a it's a great
16	neighborhood and it needs to be protected. How
17	about that? And it's used by a lot of people
18	outside the neighborhood.
19	SPEAKER: Okay. Got that.
20	SPEAKER: It's one of the few, now.
21	SPEAKER: Right.
22	SPEAKER: And if it goes, I mean, the
23	it's I'm starting to boil.
24	SPEAKER: What?
25	SPEAKER: Nothing. Don't want that

1	recorded.
2	SPEAKER: What else? What else? What
3	else is important? Think about the whole area?
4	Anything else that we haven't captured yet? We
5	have plenty of time, so I want to make sure you
6	really get a chance to share anything that's
7	SPEAKER: Well, I think
8	SPEAKER: We've got these, you can see
9	those are captured. Is there something else?
10	SPEAKER: The important thing I think is
11	not to divert all the Crabtree to Ridge Road.
12	SPEAKER: Okay.
13	SPEAKER: Which is really what they want
14	to do. We have part of it now, when they come out
15	and get on, you know, cross over. That's that's
16	not going to change, unless they do away with the
17	overpass.
18	SPEAKER: Okay.
19	SPEAKER: Which that will be sad too,
20	because in I don't you know, I guess you
21	could go down Lake Boone to exit off Lake Boone,
22	but think about what's that going to do to that.
23	It's going to be it's going to be that's
24	going to be a tough problem to solve.
25	SPEAKER: Yeah.

1	SPEAKER: That's why I think that they
2	need to really think out of the box.
3	SPEAKER: To get to keep having access
4	for all of us to exit off I-40 to get to get
5	right down to Ridge Road, instead of having to go
6	down Glenwood or Lake Boone Trail and come in that
7	way. That's that's going to create that
8	would be impacting the you know, even the
9	much
LO	SPEAKER: Other people.
11	SPEAKER: Yeah.
12	SPEAKER: So
13	SPEAKER: Because there's a lot of us.
L 4	SPEAKER: So I'm not sure I have this. I
L5	wrote down those words, but I don't think I'm
L6	capturing the essence of what you were saying. So
L7	access of from I-440 to Ridge Road, so you
L8	SPEAKER: That's important to us.
L 9	SPEAKER: Okay. To still have that?
20	SPEAKER: Yes.
21	SPEAKER: Get my verbs in there, so
22	they'd know what we meant. So it's important still
23	to still have access off that's my other
24	problem, missing an F off I-444 to Ridge Road.
25	SPEAKER. And I can even do without that

1	II I have to. II It's less trailed on Ridge.
2	SPEAKER: Okay.
3	SPEAKER: But I still think anywhere they
4	dump us out, there's no good Glenwood would be a
5	nightmare. Lake Boone's already a nightmare.
6	SPEAKER: Okay.
7	SPEAKER: And I go the back way so I
8	don't even
9	SPEAKER: Then you'd have to go to Wade.
10	SPEAKER: No. No way. No. I go back
11	through. To go to Crabtree? The back way.
12	SPEAKER: Yeah.
13	SPEAKER: All the time, up to Blue Ridge.
14	Yeah.
15	SPEAKER: Is there anything you want me
16	to capture about
17	SPEAKER: No. That's
18	SPEAKER: Just your own driving patterns.
19	Okay. Anything else that's important, that we want
20	to capture?
21	SPEAKER: I think it's important that the
22	this area, the impact area should not have to
23	take the burden, because of mistakes that were made
24	in rezoning.
25	SPEAKER: Got it. Anything more specific

_	you want me to anything you know details on
2	that?
3	SPEAKER: I think they had meets
4	thoughts has to be in process before they rezone,
5	as to where the traffic is going to go. I I
6	mean I think we're instead we're we're
7	we're reacting, not acting. And I think that we
8	need to start acting instead of reacting.
9	SPEAKER: Be proactive.
10	SPEAKER: Proactive, yeah. That's it.
11	SPEAKER: Because it's hard to move
12	something once it gets there.
13	SPEAKER: Yes, you're right. Uh-huh.
14	SPEAKER: Great. Okay. What about the
15	others? Anything? That we haven't gotten yet on
16	this? Let me label this.
17	SPEAKER: Well, yeah. The one of the
18	other important things is we've got one, two,
19	three, four, five, six, seven. Six schools and
20	they're all in boys' choir on Ridge Road vicinity.
21	SPEAKER: Okay.
22	SPEAKER: I mean, most of it is on Ridge
23	Road.
24	SPEAKER: Okay. Let's make sure we do,
25	wanted to add it to where we had it. We've got six

1	schools and we want just to be very explicit to
2	them. What do we want to be thinking about with
3	that?
4	SPEAKER: That will be impacted.
5	SPEAKER: Okay.
6	SPEAKER: That shouldn't be excuse me,
7	shouldn't be impacted with more excessive traffic.
8	SPEAKER: And her point about you
9	know, the property values. It's it's a very
10	highly regarded you know, neighborhood. And we
11	don't want to see it I don't know, be fenced off
12	you know which means don't destroy the
13	neighborhood, which we've already gotten that, so
14	and it all comes back to the same thing.
15	SPEAKER: And you all are you all in
16	this neighborhood? This Ridge Road neighborhood?
17	SPEAKER: Just I'm right across the
18	street.
19	SPEAKER: Okay.
20	SPEAKER: Yes, ma'am.
21	SPEAKER: Where you at? Which
22	SPEAKER: On Boone and Wood.
23	SPEAKER: Oh. Okay.
24	SPEAKER: Just to make sure that they
25	understand what what the context of where of

Ţ	these comments are coming from. Since there is
2	this broader area too, folks off Lead Mine and
3	we've moved down to Glenwood.
4	SPEAKER: We've been there ever since
5	1985, '84.
6	SPEAKER: Got.
7	SPEAKER: And then we've been down here
8	
9	SPEAKER: Got it. Okay. Anything else?
10	On our important named chart?
11	SPEAKER: Of course we've made
12	renovations since 1972.
13	SPEAKER: And it's always been a
14	beautiful and a wonderful area.
15	SPEAKER: Anything else there? All
16	right. Let's go. We have one more question. What
17	can the NCDOT do to demonstrate being a partner
18	with the community of stakeholders, while tackling
19	the complex transportation challenges created by
20	rapid urban growth in Wake County? So let me just
21	move these guys down. So how can the DOT

9	SPEAKER: Information. Say more about

L5	SPEAKER: Okay. Any way in particular
L 6	that is most useful to you?
L 7	SPEAKER: Online is good.
L8	SPEAKER: Online. How else can they
L 9	demonstrate their partnership with the
20	stakeholders?
21	SPEAKER: Drawing up more than one plan.
22	Say approximately three plans to offer the
23	neighbors or the neighborhood, whatever.
24	SPEAKER: So maybe three plans?
>5	SPFAKER. Yeah I did something to my

1	face this week.
2	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
3	SPEAKER: I guess I scratched it.
4	SPEAKER: How else can the DOT
5	demonstrate their partnership to stakeholders?
6	SPEAKER: Well, I think their community
7	meetings. That they listen to public input, either
8	through community meetings or however they want to
9	get the information. I mean, I think everybody
LO	realizes the growth that we've got and that we're
11	not going to get everything that it's it's a
12	very challenging area. Crabtree has always been a
13	very challenging area.
L 4	SPEAKER: True.
L5	SPEAKER: Any other ideas how they can
L 6	demonstrate their partnership to community
L7	stakeholders?
18	SPEAKER: I think under that community
19	meetings, I I would put, really listen to, in
20	caps.
21	SPEAKER: I knew you were going to say
22	that.
23	SPEAKER: And underline?
24	SPEAKER: That's good. Thank you.
25	SPEAKER: Bold highlight. Anything else?

Т	what haven't we talked about yet?
2	SPEAKER: I mean I go to think out of the
3	box and I keep going to fix confine the problem
4	where the problem is. And that goes, you got to be
5	creative. Don't just spread the problem out.
6	Don't just expand it, because it will just grow to
7	suck it up.
8	SPEAKER: Don't expand it. That is is
9	that it?
10	SPEAKER: Yeah. But it's going to be
11	will have to be creative. There might be some
12	other forms of transportation.
13	SPEAKER: I mean the one thing we don't
14	want is another lane on each side of it. We don't
15	want to add any
16	SPEAKER: Yes. That's all they had to
17	do. Restripe it.
18	SPEAKER: Right.
19	SPEAKER: Don't add lanes or restripe?
20	SPEAKER: Or restripe, but
21	SPEAKER: Right.
22	SPEAKER: If they even did it, it would
23	just temporarily fix the problem at Crabtree. It
24	would be a temporary fix, but it would ruin the
25	neighborhood, that's what I mean by don't expand

1	the problem.
2	SPEAKER: Okay.
3	SPEAKER: The problems are Crabtree.
4	SPEAKER: Because there's nowhere to go.
5	SPEAKER: And it's on 440, you know.
6	Find ways to funnel more of it out, if that's where
7	they're trying to get to.
8	SPEAKER: Because at some point, all the
9	traffic's going to start backing down Wade Avenue
10	from I mean, I had to Chapel Hill this morning
11	and I turned right off of Ridge on Wade and it was
12	just already you know, so that that's I
13	don't know, I can't even imagine how that's going
14	to be fixed, but
15	SPEAKER: I have meetings downtown at 5
16	o'clock excuse me, 5:30 and to make a left at
17	Ridge and Wade, the traffic was backed up past my
18	street on Horton, from Wade Avenue.
19	SPEAKER: Wow. So
20	SPEAKER: So we've got we've got that
21	here, back on this travel problem. Is that does
22	that is that what we're talking about?
23	SPEAKER: Yes.
24	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
25	SPEAKER: Okay. So is there anything

Τ	more detailed you want to make sure I get there?
2	SPEAKER: No. Well, just because
3	we're just impacted from every angle.
4	SPEAKER: Yeah. That's very true. I
5	think that's a good thought. We are impacted from
6	just a lot of angles that are other streets which
7	were at the present time without even doing
8	anything else.
9	SPEAKER: Let me add that on your
10	important thing.
11	SPEAKER: Okay.
12	SPEAKER: Yeah? Okay. Will that will
13	that work there for you?
14	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
15	SPEAKER: So we are impacted
16	SPEAKER: Our neighborhood is impacted,
17	yeah.
18	SPEAKER: On from all who do you
19	say it's from?
20	SPEAKER: From all all yeah.
21	SPEAKER: All streets, all sides.
22	Really, I mean I-440, I-40, 70, they're all major
23	thoroughfares.
24	SPEAKER: I don't remember how to spell
25	thoroughfares, but they'll figure out what I meant.

1	SPEAKER: That's Okay.
2	SPEAKER: Plan to give it a spell check
3	marker. Okay?
4	SPEAKER: You need to invent that, that
5	would sell.
6	SPEAKER: How long ago?
7	SPEAKER: I would buy.
8	SPEAKER: I would too.
9	SPEAKER: Okay. What else haven't we
10	talked about here tonight? I've got as much time
11	as you all want to spend. We've got plenty of time
12	left in the allotted time, but we can if we've
13	got it all, we can be done. If you've got more,
14	I've got more paper.
15	SPEAKER: I mean I think we've got it
16	down.
17	SPEAKER: Covered it.
18	SPEAKER: Covered.
19	SPEAKER: Okay.
20	SPEAKER: Now, we can put a big tent over
21	our neighborhood and route it around.
22	SPEAKER: Route it around. I think I'm
23	going to write that too. Route it around.
24	SPEAKER: I guess one of the important
25	things we we've talked about the thinking

1	outside the box, but the state needs to request
2	from the designers to think outside the box.
3	Because it's not just our state employees. It is
4	the people they are hiring to come up with
5	SPEAKER: The designers and the people
6	they're hiring?
7	SPEAKER: Uh-huh. Well, I guess the
8	state hired. Right?
9	SPEAKER: Yeah.
LO	SPEAKER: Yeah. Okay.
L1	SPEAKER: What else? What else do you
12	want to make sure that they take into account?
L3	That they consider? What's important to you?
L 4	Safety, traffic, important things, partnership?
15	What's important to you to make sure that is being
L 6	from this input, into this entire project area?
L7	SPEAKER: You've got it. I think I
L8	SPEAKER: Creative funding.
19	SPEAKER: Creative funding?
20	SPEAKER: That's that's a
21	deep word it's going to make a lot of people
22	mad, but I mean
23	SPEAKER: Say more.
24	SPEAKER: Probably the more complex you
25	make it the more it's going to cost

1	SPEAKER: Well, that's true, but then
2	they have to be creative in funding. I mean,
3	basically, what I've been told is that they have
4	I've heard I I heard 91 million and today, I
5	heard more than that. They have \$91 million to do
6	this project. Let's get it done and let's get it
7	done ASAP and you know, it can cost more than 91 to
8	do that, to think outside the box.
9	SPEAKER: It will.
10	SPEAKER: And if if that's the case,
11	then
12	SPEAKER: And that's what I meant.
13	SPEAKER: Then, yeah. Exactly. Find
14	hold off on it until you get the money. I mean I
15	I just don't think that the area needs to
16	suffer, because they're trying to get something
17	done quickly. That's another thought. Yeah.
18	SPEAKER: Yeah. That that's what I'm
19	talking about. Is is maybe to for them to
20	listen to us. It's going to cost more to be
21	creative and there's more
22	SPEAKER: Yeah. I hear you.
23	SPEAKER: non-ratable creative
24	funding. Never mind, you don't need to put that.
25	SPFAKER. Okay What else? What else?

1	What else? Going back through any of these topics
2	from, safety to community assets, that you want to
3	make sure are considered. The problematic traffic
4	and pedestrian problems that need to be addressed.
5	Anything else important and then partnership with
6	the DOT. Get it all?
7	SPEAKER: We can make them include we can
8	
9	SPEAKER: I don't know if you're done. I
10	just could stop on those
11	SPEAKER: The other thing is look at this
12	long term, not just the problems that of today.
13	You know, and and try to think of it in a
14	long-term situation, because trying to solve it
15	today, they might want to do just put the
16	traffic down Ridge Road. They're going to have
17	another problem later on, so try to
18	SPEAKER: Long-term.
19	SPEAKER: to take a look at the
20	yeah. Long term. Right?
21	SPEAKER: Good. Okay. All right.
22	SPEAKER: Okay.
23	SPEAKER: If there's nothing else, I'm
24	just instructed to let you know what's confirmed
25	to you what's happening next. All of these

1	comments will be listened to and they will be
2	extracting the themes from the conversations that
3	have gone on in either 10 or 12? How many do we
4	have? 15 rooms.
5	SPEAKER: We've got 10 rooms.
6	SPEAKER: Ten or so rooms today, plus
7	sessions what is today? Since last Thursday and
8	then again on Saturday. The data from all the
9	sessions will be aggregated into a report that will
10	go to all of the engineering firms.
11	SPEAKER: So how can we get a copy of
12	that report?
13	SPEAKER: The the report will also be
14	available on DOT's website when it is completed.
15	And the engineering firms will generate ideas based
16	on many factors including the values expressed in
17	these listening sessions and then those will be
18	brought back to the community again. I believe I
19	heard that said in that introduction that there was
20	an additional chance for input to those ideas
21	those designs that they come back with. So
22	SPEAKER: What's the time frame for this?
23	Do you know?
24	SPEAKER: I do not know, other than
25	than what they said in the in the opening

Τ	session today, which was, I think the report was by
2	early November? Is that what you heard?
3	SPEAKER: Yeah.
4	SPEAKER: By early November? Is the
5	report the report from these sessions.
6	SPEAKER: Uh-huh.
7	SPEAKER: So I don't know when the how
8	long we will how long it takes to to do the
9	designs and come back, so I imagine they're
10	taking the time it takes to hopefully get it right.
11	SPEAKER: Okay. I hope so.
12	SPEAKER: Good. Okay.
13	SPEAKER: Thank you.
14	SPEAKER: Well, I did say that there are
15	other folks in the neighborhood who you would want
16	to speak with.
17	SPEAKER: I'm going to take this if you
18	don't mind, that map?
19	SPEAKER: As far as I
20	SPEAKER: Okay. I think you can get it,
21	because I asked you this last night at the CAC,
22	because I understand you all didn't have any maps
23	at all.
24	SPEAKER: I think that's why they made
25	what they have.

1	SPEAKER: Right. I asked you that last
2	night at our meeting.
3	SPEAKER: Was that, because and I've
4	got all of your cards? So we know who is in the
5	group, which is why how we know where you are ir
6	the neighborhood? Right. Well, thank you very
7	much. Thank you all very much.
8	SPEAKER: Thank you.
9	SPEAKER: We do appreciate it.
10	SPEAKER: Nice to meet you. I hope you
11	felt listened to.
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
