Modifications to the proposed improvements may change the area of potential impacts.

Project Description


The N.C. Department of Transportation, in partnership with the City of Asheville, proposes to widen Sweeten Creek Road (U.S. 25A) to a four-lane, median divided road with a 10-foot multi-use path on one side and a 5-foot sidewalk on the other, from Hendersonville Road (U.S. 25) to Rock Hill Road (S.R. 3081). The majority of the project is located in Asheville, with portions of the project located in unincorporated areas of Buncombe County.

The purpose of the project is to alleviate congestion and improve traffic flow within the project limits.

Widening Alternatives

The project team, in coordination with the City of Asheville, has developed a proposed roadway / multi-use corridor to accommodate both motorized vehicles as well as bicycles and pedestrians.

A combination of east side and west side widening alternatives are being considered to minimize impacts to residential communities, churches, businesses, historic properties, as well as wetlands and streams including Sweeten Creek. The maps on display show an area of potential impact for east side widening and west side widening.

What Happens Next?

The Project Team will evaluate public comments received following the public meeting, along with input from agencies and other stakeholders. This information will be used to refine the project designs where appropriate and feasible. After the designs have been refined, NCDOT will complete the environmental document and will hold a second public meeting to present the recommended alignment alternative to the public. After which, NCDOT right-of-way agents will begin to contact property owners impacted by the proposed designs.

The process to begin purchasing the additional right-of-way needed for this project is scheduled to begin in Fall 2020. Construction is scheduled to begin in Fall 2022.

Late Summer 2019— 2nd Public Meeting for Recommended Alignment Alternative

Fall 2020- Right-of-way acquisition begins

Fall 2022- Construction begins




Sweeten Creek Road (North of Mills Gap)





Sweeten Creek Road (South of Mills Gap)





Sweeten Creek Road (Under Parkway Bridge)
